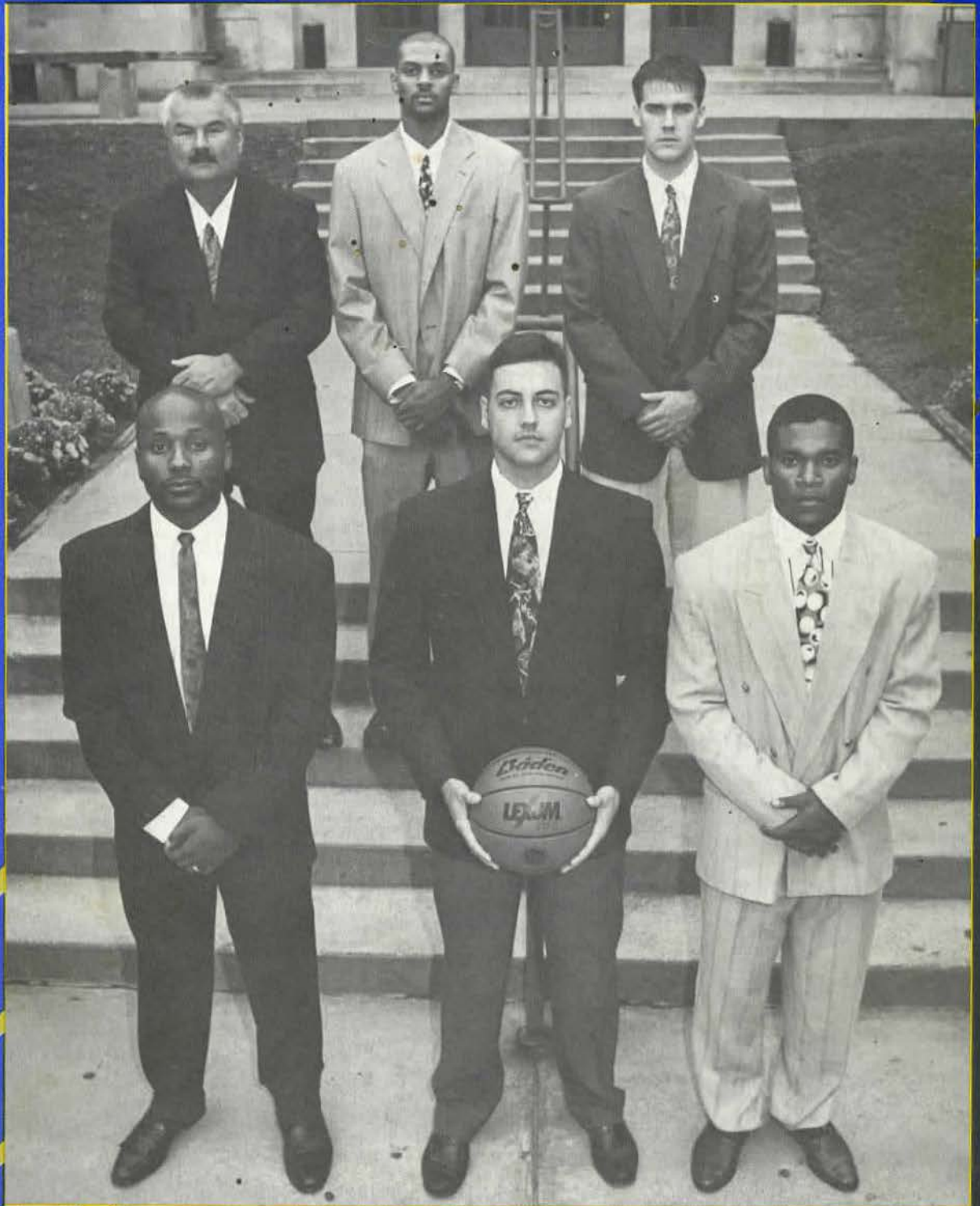

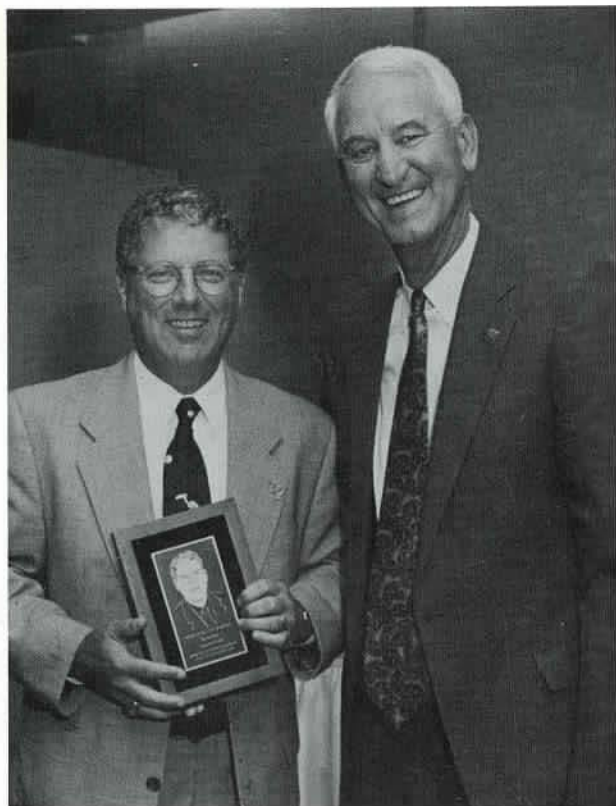

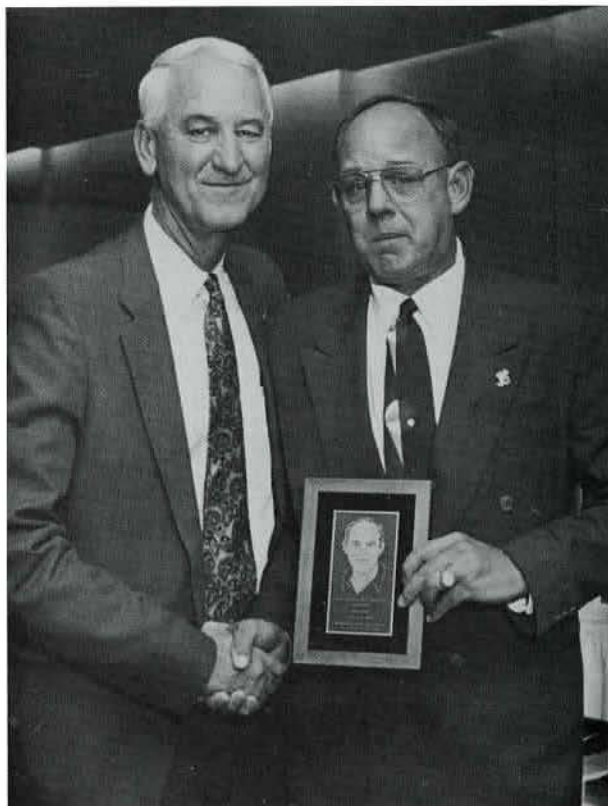
Eagle Greats of the Past...

Wayne Martin and *Mickey Wells* were both members of the Eagle basketball team during their days as students at MSU. And, even though you probably won't find either of their names in the records section of this media guide for their playing accomplishments, both used their association with Eagle basketball and the University as a springboard for outstanding coaching careers. Both were inducted into the Morehead State University Athletic Hall of Fame in October.



Wayne Martin

Martin had a highly successful nine-year career (1978-87) as coach of the Eagle basketball team. His squads posted a 130-120 record, won two OVC Tournament championships and one league regular season championship and participated in two NCAA Tournaments (1982-83 and 1983-84). He was twice named OVC Coach of the Year, and in 1984, was named Kodak District IV Coach of the Year.



Mickey Wells

Wells was the highly successful coach of the Lady Eagles for nine seasons, posting a 156-91 career record. His teams won two Kentucky state titles, one OVC Tournament championship and participated in two AIAW regional tournaments. He was named state coach of the year in 1978-79, a national Kellogg's Coach of the Year in 1976-77 and was a two-time OVC Coach of the Year.

Players focus of MSU show

ASHLAND — For the past three seasons, Dick Fick has been the show at Morehead State University.

But Fick, one of the most colorful coaches in college basketball, says the show will be on the floor this season as the Eagles return everybody from a 14-14 team.

"I think we'll contend for the (Ohio Valley Conference) title if we win on the road," he said Wednesday night on Dick Fick Day at Damon's Clubhouse. "We should be better all-around but this year we're actually going to try to guard people."

Fick came to MSU three years ago and pumped enthusiasm into a program that was gasping for life. He did it mostly with an energetic style of coaching that fans loved.

Fick talks to the fans in the stands, makes faces at referees and doesn't even have a chair on the bench because he never sits down.

Attendance at Morehead State games increased 54 percent his first season, when Brett Roberts led the nation in scoring and the Eagles reached the OVC tournament semifinals.

His team slumped to 6-21 the following season and MSU climbed back to .500 last year, again making it to the OVC semifinals.

Now in his fourth season, this should easily be Fick's most-talented team. He shouldn't have to turn cartwheels on the sidelines to put fans in the stands.

Good Times For Dick Fick

Dick Fick's secretary calls back. Yes, she says, Coach Fick would love to talk. In fact, here's his home number. Call anytime.

You have only heard about the demonstrative Fick; how listening to the former Creighton assistant is like being in an amusement park, full of fun and wild rides. But you wonder about his mood this week as Fick — whose Morehead State team plays Nebraska tonight — makes his first return to Nebraska since he didn't get the Creighton basketball job in 1991.

This is apparently one mood that never swings.

"Things are great," Fick says. "Kentucky is playing tonight and the whole state is fired up. We're playing well. And we got a little country music going. It couldn't be better."

You heard Dick Fick was a character. You heard right.

Friendly Folks

"I love Kentucky," says the animated, bearish man from Chicago. "I have a lot of George Jones tapes now. People are very friendly, though the driving is a little different. People here actually stop and talk to each other while they're driving."

"The economy here is different, too. You can get a pop for 35 cents. That's legit. The school has about 9,000 students in a wonderful town. Morehead is just east of Louisville — exactly one hour and 50 minutes from Churchill Downs. Believe me."

You wonder how this combination of Jim Valvano and Dick Vitale could have failed as Creighton head coach. Fick rattled off a long list of friends he planned to see Thursday night in Omaha. His wife, April, arrived here earlier in the week to see friends. So much to do, so little time.

"I used to love this place in downtown Millard called 'Cottner's,'" Fick said. "They have the greatest cheeseburgers of all time. I'll be going to Cottner's. And Runza. Double cheeseburgers at Runza. Ohhhhh."

With this personality and this appetite, you wonder how Fick did not get the job when Tony Barone left for Texas A&M after the 1990-91 season. Fick wondered, too. But not for long.

Eagles escape Murray 80-74 behind 3-pointers, free throws

MOREHEAD — First, it was the back-to-back three-point field goals by Mark Kinnaird and Johnnie Williams midway through the second half that snapped the final tie.

Next, it was five consecutive points by unlikely scorer Marlon Witherspoon, the reserve center.

Finally, it was nine of 10 free throws in the last two minutes.

At the buzzer last night, it was Morehead State 80, Murray State 74.

And Saturday night in Nash-

ville, Morehead will play Tennessee State for first place in the Ohio Valley Conference.

"That's exciting," Morehead Coach Dick Fick said. "I don't know when we've had a chance to do that."

The Eagles are 8-3 in the OVC, as is Tennessee State, which lost at Austin Peay last night. State plays at Tennessee-Martin Wednesday.

For now, Fick was reveling in last night's victory.

"To beat Murray, you have to be awfully tough," Fick said. "We handled every run they made at us."

Morehead used the twin three-pointers to go ahead 57-51. Witherspoon's points helped boost the Eagle lead to seven in the final five minutes.

Murray then used a 6-0 run to get within 69-68 at with 2:47 left. Morehead then scored its last field goal when Williams was credited with a basket at 2:28 after Stacey Barry was charged with goaltending.

Free throws made the difference after that. This wasn't surprising because Morehead shot 92.9 percent for the game, making 26 of

Majick's magic moves Morehead by Martin

MOREHEAD — It was a good thing for Morehead State that the three-pointers were falling in the first half, especially Mark Majick's seven of eight shots from long range.

Thanks to Majick's accurate bombing, Morehead led 45-29 at halftime and won 78-70 over visiting Tennessee-Martin in college basketball action last night.

The Eagles didn't have the, uh, eagle eye in the second half, making only one of 15 shots from beyond the arc.

And the Pacers refused to give up even though they fell behind 58-36 five minutes into the second half. They got within nine points inside the eight-minute mark and trailed by six with 3:19 to play.

That forced Morehead to win the game at the free-throw line. Eagle point guard Mark Kinnaird took care of that by making two

free throws each with 1:27 and :11 on the clock.

"We won and didn't play particularly well," Morehead Coach Dick Fick said. "Martin had a lot to do with that because they never folded. They kept it close and made us win it at the line."

"That's been our pattern lately," said Martin Coach Cal Luther about the Pacers' tendency to fall behind, fight back but come up short.

As a result, Morehead moved to 11-6 and 6-2 in the Ohio Valley Conference, 1½ games behind league-leading Tennessee State. UT-Martin is 3-13 and 1-5.

The game looked anything but close in the first half.

Johnnie Williams started the Eagles to victory by scoring the first seven points of the game.

It took him more than four minutes to do that because both teams started slowly. Morehead

Walk-on son, 'team-mom' wife try to keep Morehead basketball coach in line

MOREHEAD — Jeff Fick keeps a straight face when he sees his basketball coach crumpling to the floor, giving an exasperated expression or wildly waving his arms during games.

His coach is Morehead State's Dick Fick, the person the late Jim Valvano made famous several years ago on ESPN with the "Dick Fick Award" for animated behavior during games.

He also is Jeff's father.

"I usually don't see him do things except in news clips on TV about the games," said Jeff, a walk-on freshman guard for the Eagles. "I'm usually into the game too much to notice what he's doing.

"I try not to laugh, but I think they're funny."

Even his mother, April, enjoys seeing Dad go through the sideline antics.

"We'll joke with each other about the different things," Jeff said. "The whole family will talk

about it. My dad usually doesn't see it, but me and Mom will watch it on TV and laugh about it."

April can be seen at practices wearing a blue-and-gold Morehead warm-up suit or checking up on the players at study hall.

"I'm like the team mom," she said.

The basketball arena is the Ficks' home away from home.

"Basketball has really been a family thing," April said. "Dick and I were married young so we've grown together with this whole thing. Even the first head coaching job, I feel like it's my job."

When she missed a practice in pre-season, Fick asked her why she wasn't there.

"I told him I didn't know it was my job to come to practice," she said. "But I enjoy it. I get to know the players and I understand more of what Dick goes through during the day. It makes it easier when he comes home at night and wants to talk about it."

They also have a daughter, Kylie, who lives in Columbus, Ohio. She attends as many practices, scrimmages and games as she can to be with the family.

Jeff has been his father's road companion since he was in the sixth grade.

"Very rarely in this business do you get a chance to be with your kid like that," said Dick Fick, 42, who is in his fourth season at Morehead State. "That's really something that's been special. He's the best friend I have other than my wife."

Allen, Fick share OVC's coaching honor

Tennessee State coach Frankie Allen is learning to share.

His Tigers shared the Ohio Valley Conference's regular-season basketball championship with Murray State and Wednesday night he learned that he and Morehead State's Dick Fick are the OVC men's co-coaches of the year.

"It's an honor that you feel good about, because it's voted on by your peers," said Allen, who also won the honor in 1993.

Fick, whose Eagles finished with a surprising 15-11 mark, said the award is actually a tribute to his whole team.

"It's the best team award there is," he said, "because they never give it to someone whose team didn't win some games."

■ Murray State's Marcus Brown downplayed his selection as the league's player of the year, just as he did his selection as the top player in the preseason.

"It's a great honor," said the junior guard, "but I'm here to take care of business. I want to get to the NCAA Tournament, and I won't be happy unless we do."

'A huge, huge night' for Dick Fick

Dick Fick is the name. Sounds like a put-on right from the start, and the man who owns it has been known to have his own loose style of fun along the basketball sidelines.

But there is no put-on to what he plans tonight when he sends his Morehead State team against Indiana in the opening game of the 21st Indiana Classic (7:05, Ch. 4). Fick is measuring Indiana: a great prize if beaten and bagged, at the very least a team and a coach and a program that can be used to get his team better prepared for a run at the Ohio Valley Conference championship. That's at the harvest-end of a growing program Fick started two years ago — one year lean and green, the second growing.

Head Basketball Coach



Dick Fick returns for his fifth season as Head Basketball Coach at Morehead State University with optimism and satisfaction that his Eagle basketball program has a solid foundation.

Not only has Fick led his ballclub to success on the basketball floor, he has also led the Eagles to successes off the floor. His teams continue to be involved in many community projects, and in the classroom, they have earned the distinction of having the highest graduation rate among Division I schools in Kentucky according to the Lexington Herald-Leader.

As 1994-95 Ohio Valley Conference Co-Coach of the Year, Fick brought excitement and enthusiasm back to Morehead State University basketball with his run-and-gun, shoot-the-three-pointer offense, pressure defense and recruitment of many athletes from Kentucky and surrounding states.

Charismatic, intense and first-class are words used to describe the 43-year old native of Joliet, Ill., who became the head basketball coach at MSU on May 23, 1991, after serving six years as an assistant coach at Creighton University. He led the 1991-92 Eagles to a 14-15 record. In 1992-93, the youthful Eagles got off to a slow start but rebounded strong in the second half of the season to post a 6-21 mark. Last season's team also finished the season strong, advancing to the semifinals of the OVC Tournament. His up-tempo style enabled Eagle senior forward Brett Roberts to lead the nation in scoring in 1991-92 and the 1993-94 Eagles to rank among the nation's leaders in free throw percentage and three-point field goals made per game.

During his tenure on the staff of Coach Tony Barone at Creighton (1985-91), the Bluejays' record included three straight 20-win seasons (24-8 in 1990-91, 22-10 in 1989-90 and 20-11 in 1988-89), two trips to the NCAA Tournament and a trip to the NIT.

Fick was in charge of Creighton's recruiting, scheduling, travel and scouting, as well as on-floor game preparation.

Prior to joining the Creighton program, he spent six seasons at Valparaiso (1978-85), one season as a graduate assistant and five seasons as an assistant basketball coach. There, he handled recruiting, scouting and various coaching and administrative duties as Valparaiso entered NCAA Division I.

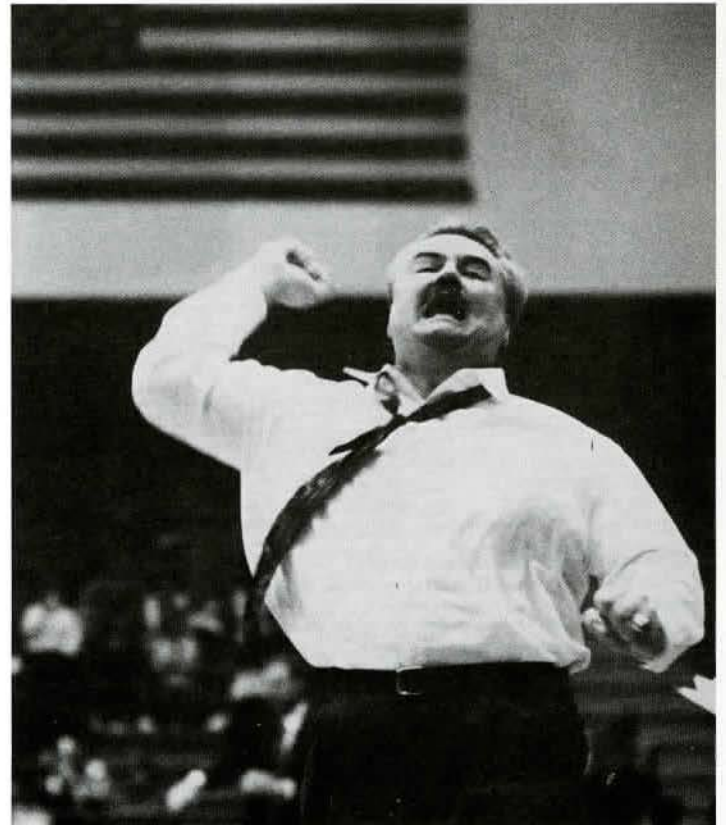
For one season (1977-78), he was the head basketball coach at Joliet West High School. At Aurora Central Catholic High School (1976-77), he spent one season and led his team to the Illinois state championship finals and the school's first-ever sectional and supersectional championships. He also was Aurora Central's assistant coach in 1975-76.

Fick spent one season (1973-74) as a volunteer assistant coach at the College of St. Francis in Joliet.

He has directed several basketball camps and is a published author of basketball-related articles.

Fick graduated from Joliet West High School in 1970. He earned a bachelor's degree from Lewis University in 1975 where he was an outstanding pitcher on Lewis' two NAIA national championship baseball teams. He earned a master's degree from Valparaiso in 1982.

He and his wife, April, have a daughter, Kylie, and a son, Jeff.

Assistant Basketball Coach



Bob Donewald begins his second season as an assistant basketball coach at Morehead State.

Donewald came to MSU after serving a season as assistant to the executive vice-president and scout for the New Jersey Nets. With the Nets, he assisted Willis Reed in the day to day operations, including organization of scouts in preparation for the NBA draft and in scouting NBA opponents for Coach Chuck Daly and his staff.

Prior to joining the Nets' staff, he served as a student assistant coach at Western Michigan and as a counselor, instructor and director with several basketball camps, including his own.

He is the son of Bob Donewald, Sr., current head coach at Western Michigan and former head coach at Illinois State and assistant at Indiana.

"Bob has an outstanding coaching background for such a young coach," said Eagle Head Coach Dick Fick. "His work ethic is outstanding.

"His work with his father, a well-respected coach who was a part of an Indiana national championship team and who has taken his teams to the NCAA tournament, and with the Nets has prepared him well as a coach. I believe he will be a tremendous coach for many years."

Donewald earned a bachelor's degree from Western Michigan in 1993. He is 25 years old and single.

Brian Zapach

Assistant Basketball Coach



Brian Zapach, a four-year member of Indiana's basketball support staff, is in his first season as an assistant basketball coach at Morehead State.

During the past four seasons at Indiana, Zapach worked as a student manager, a supervisor of student managers, coordina-

tor of video exchange and in many other administrative and practice-related areas for the highly successful Hoosier basketball program.

The 22-year old native of Medford, Mass., attended Malden Catholic High School. He earned a bachelor's degree in sports marketing and management from Indiana last spring.

Marty Cline

Student Assistant Basketball Coach



Marty Cline, a standout guard on recent Eagle basketball teams, will serve as a student assistant coach this season.

Chronic knee and back problems will prevent him from participating in a playing capacity this season.

Despite injury problems last season, he

played in 81 career games, making 50 starts. He scored 719 career points and handed out 237 career assists. He ranks sixth on MSU's all-time assist list.

Cline was a member of the Ohio Valley Conference's All-Newcomer Team in 1992-93 and a member of the CoSIDA GTE District IV Academic All-America squad in 1993-94.

Outlook

Dick Fick's 1995-96 Morehead State University Eagle basketball team can best be described as a "good mix."

There is a good balance of experienced returnees and talented newcomers. There is consistency among the classes with five seniors, four juniors, two sophomores and four freshmen on the preseason roster. And, there is a quality mix of outside shooters and inside post players.

Last season's talented senior class featured starters Tyrone Boardley (16.3 ppg., 9.2 rpg.), Johnnie Williams (13.7 ppg., 4.1 rpg.) and Kelly Wells, who provided great leadership despite missing many games with a knee injury over the course of his career.

Senior-to-be Marty Cline has joined the coaching staff after chronic knee and back problems ended his playing career.

Six lettermen, including three starters, return. The returning starters are Mark Kinnaird (G, 5-11, Sr.), who averaged 15 points and 3.9 assists in 1994-95, Mark Majick (G, 6-4, Sr.), who averaged 8.4 points and 3.2 rebounds, and Mike Scrogam (C-F, 6-7, Jr.), who averaged 7.9 points and 4.6 rebounds.

Other returning letterwinners are Ivan Colbert (G, 5-11,

Sr.), Cole Indestad (C, 6-8, Jr.) and Marlon Witherspoon (C-F, 6-8, Sr.).

Colbert averaged 1.9 points and was a defensive spark-plug. Indestad averaged 0.7 points and 1.6 rebounds as a backup post player. Witherspoon came on strong late in the season and finished with averages of 4.6 points, 5.0 rebounds and 2.3 blocked shots.

Also returning is squad member Chris Stone (F, 6-7, So.)

Five signees include two junior college transfers and three freshmen. The junior college transfers are Northwest (Wyo.) College teammates John Humphrey (F, 6-7, Jr.) and Doug Wyciskalla (G, 6-2, Jr.). Freshmen signees are Ted Docks (G, 5-8, Canton, Mich.), Luke Lloyd (C-F, 6-9, Flint, Mich.) and Kyle Sherman (G, 6-3, Maysville, Ky.).

There are three walk-on candidates: Heston Beverly (G, 6-1, So.), Al Dixon (F, 6-4, Sr.) and Mark Spurlock (G, 5-10, Fr.).

In addition to the always vigorous Ohio Valley Conference wars, MSU's strong nonconference schedule will include trips to Kentucky, Louisville, Iowa and Kent, and home games against Marshall and George Mason.

Historically Morehead State University traces its lineage to the Morehead Normal School, which opened its doors in 1887. The private school closed in the spring of 1922 when the Kentucky General Assembly established Morehead State Normal School. Since then, the University has grown from a teachers college to a regional university that serves Kentucky and Appalachia. Until university status was granted in 1966, the institution's primary mission was the training of teachers. However, the curriculum now embraces nearly 130 academic programs on the associate, baccalaureate, and graduate levels. Physically, the University consists of more than fifty major structures valued at more than \$110 million. There are more than 38,000 MSU alumni. Administratively, the University operates under an 11-member Board of Regents that consists of eight citizens appointed by the governor of Kentucky, with three other seats held by elected faculty, staff and student representatives. The administrative structure covers primarily four areas: academic affairs, administration and fiscal services, university advancement and student life. Each of these units is headed by a vice president.

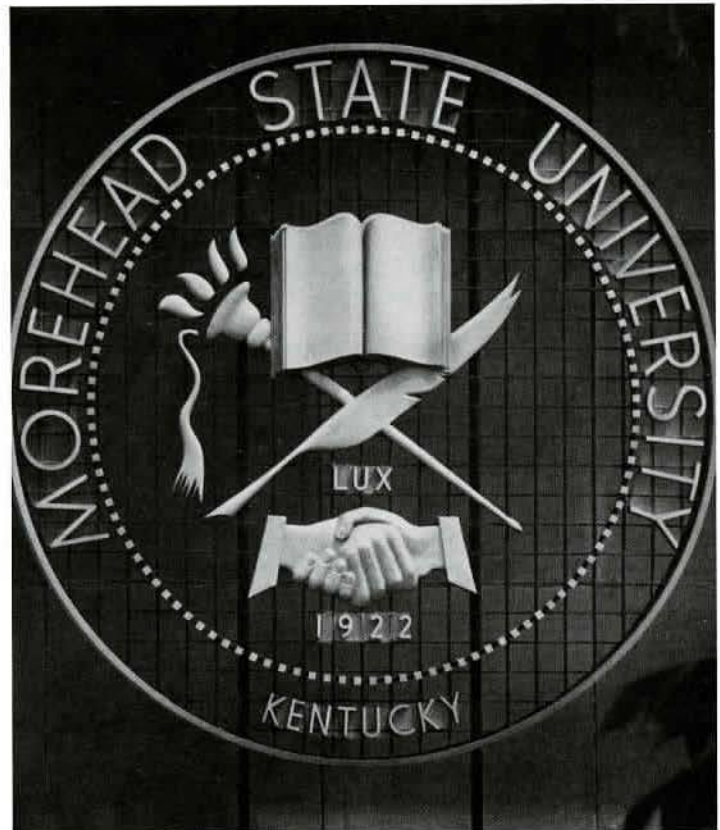
There are approximately 8,400 men and women enrolled at Morehead State University, of whom about 6,800 are undergraduates. The University recognizes more than 100 student organizations, including 23 nationally chartered fraternities and sororities, and sponsors a full program of intercollegiate and intramural athletics for men and women. MSU is basically a residential campus and has fourteen residence halls. About 89 percent of its students are Kentuckians. Graced by a large lake, the campus sits in the foothills of the Daniel Boone National Forest. Among the University's facilities are an experimental farm and a nine-hole golf course.

Location

The University is located near the main shopping area of Morehead, a city of about 12,000 people that lies midway between Ashland, Kentucky, and Lexington, Kentucky, on Interstate 64. Commercial airline service is available in Lexington and Huntington, West Virginia, which is also on the I-64 corridor. Nearby recreational areas are Cave Run Lake and Rodburn Park, which are owned by the U.S. Forest Service. Three Kentucky state parks--Natural Bridge, Carter Caves, and Greenbo--are within an hour's drive. The city of Morehead is served by a 150-bed hospital and functions as the medical, educational, cultural, and commercial center of northeastern Kentucky.

Majors and Degrees

Morehead State University awards the following undergraduate degrees: A.A., A.B., A.A.B., A.D.N., A.A.S., B.B.A., B.M., B.M.E., B.S., B.S.N., B.U.S., and B.S.W. The College of Science and Technology offers the Bachelor of Science (BS) degree in agricultural education, agricultural science (with an option in agribusiness, agricultural economics, agronomy, animal science, general agriculture, golf course management and horticulture), biology, environmental science (with options in ecology, geology, chemistry and physics, and social science and economics), interdisciplinary early childhood development, human sciences (with options in dietetics, hotel/restaurant and institutional management, interior design, retail merchandising and design), vocational home economics, industrial technology (with an option in construction/mining technology, electricity/electronics technology and, graphic communication technology), industrial education (with options in industrial education/orientation exploration and industrial education



preparation), medical technology, mathematics, mathematics and computer programming, chemistry, geology, physics, and secondary science teaching (with options in biology, chemistry, earth science, and physics) and mathematics/physical science teaching (with options in chemistry, mathematics and physics--noncalculus or calculus based). The college also offers a Bachelors of Science in Nursing (BSN). Bachelor of Arts (AB) degree is available in geology.

Two year programs include the Associate of a Applied Science (AAS) degree in agricultural technology (with options in agribusiness, agricultural production, equine technology and ornamental horticultural), human sciences (options in fashion merchandising, food service management and interior design), industrial technology (with options in construction/mining technology, electricity/electronics technology, graphic communication technology and manufacturing/robotics technology), radiologic technology, and veterinary technology. An associate degree in nursing (ADN) is also available. Pre-professional programs are available to prepare students for careers in chiropractic medicine, dentistry, engineering, forestry, law, medicine, optometry, pharmacy, and physical therapy and veterinary medicine.

The College of Business offers the Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) degree with concentrations in accounting, comprehensive business, computer information systems, economics, finance, management, marketing, real estate, and office systems. The Associate of Applied Business (AAB) degree includes options in accounting, computer information, information systems, economics, finance, marketing, marketing real estate, and small business management. The AAB degree in office systems offers options in administrative management, legal secretarial and medical secretarial.

The College of Education and Behavioral Sciences offers the Bachelor of Arts (AB) degree in elementary education (with K-4 or 5-8), health, military science, physical education, psychology, recreation, sociology (with an emphasis in criminology), and special education (options in learning and behavior disorders (K-4 or 5-8) and moderate and severe disabilities (K-4 or 5-8)). The Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) degree is also available. Secondary teacher certification can be obtained through programs in many subject matter disciplines.

The Caudill College of Humanities offers the Bachelor of Arts (AB) degree in art, communications (emphases in electronic media production and management, electronic media news, journalism, and advertising-public relations), speech, speech/ theatre, theatre, English, French, Spanish, philosophy, geography, government, history, paralegal studies, and social science teaching. Three degrees are available in music: The Bachelor of Music (BM) in music performance, the Bachelor of Music Education (BME) in teaching and Bachelor of Arts for the study of music within the liberal arts curriculum.

Additionally, MSU has 24 master's degree programs, plus two graduate level non-degree programs designed especially for professional educators. A post-master's level degree, education specialist, along with a joint doctoral degree with the University of Kentucky, are offered on the campus.

Academic Facilities

Morehead State University's academic facilities include Camden-Carroll Library, which has nearly 415,000 volumes, 1,936 serial subscriptions, 294,000 microform titles, 18, 902 recordings, 83,500 films, filmstrips, slides, transparencies, and forty-five computer terminals.

The Lappin, Cassity, Reed, Ginger, Baird, Claypool-Young, and Combs buildings provide modern classroom and laboratory facilities. In addition, the University has extensive agricultural facilities at the Derrickson Agricultural Complex north of Morehead. Theatres include Kibbey (100 seats) and Button Auditorium (1,300 seats). Media facilities include two television production studios, a 50,000-



watt public radio station, and complete darkroom and composition laboratories for the student newspaper and yearbook. Computer facilities are available to students. Other specialized laboratories are used by students in food service, music, art, recreation, energy studies, Appalachian studies, graphic arts, health sciences, teacher education, and water testing.

Financial Aid

Morehead State University offers qualified applicants a wide variety of financial assistance, including loans, grants, scholarships, and work opportunities. In addition, students are encouraged to investigate the possibility of getting aid through veterans' benefits, rehabilitation grants, and other private and public sources. Seventy percent of the students at MSU receive financial assistance. Aid renewal is general based on various eligibility factors, including grades and financial need. April 1 is the priority filing deadline for the Financial Aid Application.

Faculty

The University has 343 full-time faculty members and nearly 90 part-time (lecturers) faculty members. Faculty members are encouraged to concentrate on teaching duties while still devoting appropriate energies to research and public service. Graduate students are rarely used as instructors. Academic advisement is provided by full-time faculty members. Earned doctoral degrees are held by 64 percent of the faculty members and the student-faculty ratio is about 18:1.

Student Government

The Student Government Association, of which all full-time students become members, elects its executive branch and the Student Congress, and the judicial branch is appointed by elected student leaders. A student serves as a voting member of the MSU Board of Regents.

Dr. Ronald G. Eaglin

President



Dr. Ronald G. Eaglin became the 12th president of Morehead State University on July 1, 1992. Bringing nearly 30 years of experience in higher education administration to the MSU post, he previously was chancellor of South Carolina's Coastal Carolina College at Conway.

A former vice chancellor for academic affairs at USC's Spartanburg campus, Dr. Eaglin began his career in higher education administration in the area of student life/housing and

has taught both in public school and university settings. In the early 1970s, he served as a regional director, Southeast Office of the American College Testing Program (ACT).

He holds a bachelor's degree in biology and mathematics from Southeast Missouri State University, a master's degree in student personnel administration from Southern Illinois University and a doctoral degree in educational psychology from the University of Utah.

A graduate of Leadership South Carolina, he has been active in the NCAA President's Commission and is a former vice chairman of the Big South Athletic Conference (Division I). Active in the American Association of State Colleges and Universities, President Eaglin has served on numerous

AASCU committees, including chair of the Committee on Academic National Student Retention project being undertaken by AASCU and funded by the Student Loan Marketing Association.

He frequently serves as a consultant throughout the Southeast and often presents workshops for colleges on student retention, leadership and academic advisement. He has worked with numerous statewide projects in the Southeast, including ones for the South Carolina Department of Higher Education, Georgia Board of Regents and South Carolina Board for Technical and Comprehensive Education.

In summer 1992, he chaired a Fullbright High Commission delegation which went to Cyprus to present a four-day seminar on accreditation and self-study for higher education representatives of Turkish and Greek Cypriot communities.

A member of several honorary societies such as Psi Chi and Phi Delta Kappa, Dr. Eaglin also is active in his community. As president of MSU, Dr. Eaglin serves as a member of the Board of Directors of the Morehead-Rowan Chamber of Commerce and the Jesse Stuart Foundation. A member of the Kentucky Council on Higher Education's Conference of Presidents, he was appointed by Gov. Brereton C. Jones to the East Kentucky Development Roundtable, an advisory working group to the East Kentucky Office of the Cabinet for Economic Development.

He and his wife, Bonnie, have four adult children.

Mike Mincey

Vice President for Student Life



Mike Mincey, Morehead State's Vice President for Student Life and a former Eagle athlete, assumed responsibility for supervision of the University's athletics program in June, 1993.

An MSU administrative staff member since 1975, Mincey was appointed interim vice president in 1986 and assumed the title of vice president and Dean of Students in 1990 following a national search. Since joining the staff, Mincey has held a variety of

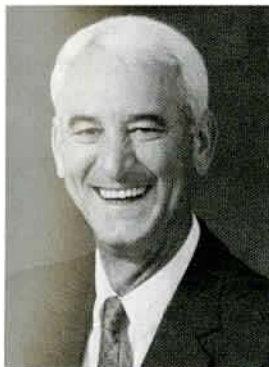
Prior to joining the MSU staff, he taught and coached in public schools in Flemingsburg, Ky., and Tifton, Ga.

Steve Hamilton

Director of Athletics



One of Morehead State's most successful athletics alumni, Steve Hamilton enters his ninth year as athletic director at his alma mater.

Hamilton, a standout athlete in baseball, basketball and track during his playing days at MSU, has been the University's athletic director since 1987. He spent 14 seasons as the Eagle baseball coach and is MSU's all-time winningest coach with 305 career victories. His teams won five

divisional championships and two OVC championships. His 1977 and 1983 teams participated in the NCAA baseball tournament.

As director, Hamilton has seen the MSU athletic program make dynamic progress, both on the field, in facilities and most importantly, in the classroom. During his tenure, he has seen a state-of-the-art weight facility built and other improvements made to facilities. He has seen the graduation rate of Eagle athletes improve and MSU win the Ohio Valley Conference's Academic Achievement Banner on four occasions. He has added an academic counselor for athletes and begun a compliance program.

During his college career, Hamilton played on champion-

ship teams in basketball, baseball and track. He established five MSU records in rebounding and is the Eagles' all-time leading rebounder and fourth leading scorer. He earned basketball All-America honors in 1957.

Hamilton may best be known for his 11 years of major league baseball experience. He pitched for the Cleveland Indians, Washington Senators, New York Yankees, Chicago White Sox, San Francisco Giants and the Chicago Cubs. The originator of the "Folly Floater," he pitched in two World Series with the Yankees.

He also played two seasons with the NBA's Minneapolis Lakers, becoming one of only two professional athletes to play in both a World Series and an NBA Championship Series.

His professional coaching career included a stint as manager of the 1973 Johnson City Yankees of the Appalachian League. He also served as pitching coach for the Detroit Tigers in 1975.

Hamilton, a graduate of Charlestown (Ind.) High School, earned a bachelor's degree from MSU in 1958 and a master's degree from MSU in 1963. He is married to the former Shirley Potter of Raceland, Ky. They have four children, Stephanie (Fightmaster), Elizabeth (Monnett), Robert and Daniel.

In addition to the MSU Athletic Hall of Fame, he has also been inducted into the Ohio Valley Conference Hall of Fame and the Kentucky Athletic Hall of Fame.

Kathleen R. Worthington was named Assistant Director of Athletics at Morehead State University in July, 1995.

Caudill, a former Morehead businessman, earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from MSU

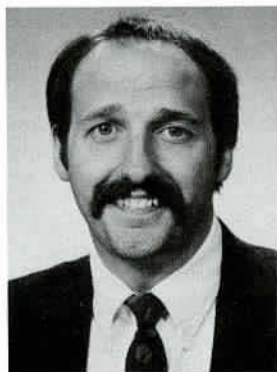
in 1972. While a student at MSU, Caudill was a member of the Eagle golf team, and he remains a top amateur golfer.

Ohio Valley Conference History

When the presidents of six mid-southern universities gathered 47 years ago at a hotel in Kentucky, they united with a goal of providing leadership and vision, both in education and athletics, for the future.

That vision has grown and fostered since the initial meeting in 1948, when the Ohio Valley conference was formed.

It didn't take long before the OVC was making a mark nationally in athletics, but the league also became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial integration, OVC member Morehead State University became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958, Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to blacks.

On the athletic field, the OVC was quickly gaining respect. In 1955, the OVC became only the second six-member league nationally to earn an automatic bid to the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, which, at that time, was limited to only 24 participants.

Through the years, OVC teams have won national championships and bowl games in football, along with national team and individual titles in the sports of rifle, cross country, track and golf.

The OVC has also produced several Olympic athletes, while some of the greatest players in professional sports were educated at OVC institutions. The list includes former greats such as basketball's Clem Haskins (Western Kentucky) and two-sport star Steve Hamilton (Morehead State) to present day standouts like football players Richard Dent (Tennessee State) and Phil Simms (Morehead State), baseball stars Atlee Hammaker (East Tennessee State) and Walt Terrell (Morehead State), basketball's Popeye Jones (Murray State) and professional golfer Jeff Sluman (Tennessee Tech).

Recognizing the need to provide increased opportunities for female athletes, the OVC established women's championships in the sports of basketball, tennis and track in 1977, with volleyball added four years later. Those sports were initially governed by the Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women, but the overall strength of women's programs in the league was demonstrated by the automatic bids the OVC instantly received when the NCAA became the governing body in 1982.

The playing field isn't the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. The prestigious OVC Academic Achievement Banner is awarded annually to the league school whose athletes produce the highest grade point average when compared to the general student body. In addition, a dozen Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or named to the Commissioner's Honor Roll.

The vision of leadership demonstrated by the Founding Fathers in 1948 remains alive today as the Ohio Valley Conference prepares for the future. One example is in regard to the current trend in collegiate athletics administration for increased involvement of university presidents in setting policies and making rules. The presidents of OVC institutions, however, have always governed the Conference, long before presidential governance became a national theme.

The OVC sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, track and tennis for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. The OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Over the last few years, the league has grown, not only in the number of athletics opportunities it is providing for students, but in terms of the number of institutions in the league. Recently, the league added Eastern Illinois effective in 1996-97. The addition brings to 10 the number of institutions in the league. Other representatives include charter members Eastern Kentucky University, Morehead State University and Murray State University, along with Austin Peay State University, Middle Tennessee State University, Southeast Missouri State University, Tennessee State University, Tennessee Technological University and the University of Tennessee at Martin.



OVC Sportsmanship Statement

General. The Ohio Valley Conference is committed to establishing sportsmanship and developing healthy environments for competition. This conference wants to lead the way in abolishing the notion that it is desirable to create a "hostile" environment for intercollegiate athletic contests. Instead, we will strive to create "hospitable" environments. We believe that part of the role of education through sports is to teach our youth and our communities to conduct themselves with sportsmanship and respect for opponents.

In an effort to achieve this goal, the Conference has developed this statement which outlines the expectations of the various groups and individuals associated with our intercollegiate athletics program.

Administration. It is incumbent upon institutional administrators to create an environment of hospitality for visiting teams, particularly for those individuals at Conference institutions. OVC administrators must develop the attitude that the treatment of a visiting team and its fans will be in the same manner that they would want their teams to be treated.

The athletics director at the host institution must ensure that he or she, or someone else designated as game manager, approaches the coach of the opposing team at a spectator event in order to welcome that coach to the institution, provided an opportunity for the coach to address and concerns, indicate the location of the game manager in the arena or stadium and identify security personnel to ensure that the visiting team is protected from abuse from the home crowd and that security is in very close proximity to the visiting team's bench. Each institution must arrange its seating at spectator events so as to emphasize sportsmanship and minimize the harassment of the visiting team and its fans.

The athletics director must ensure that those who are employed by the university treat the opponents with fairness and respect. For example, public address announcers must be required to announce the contest in an evenhanded manner with equal excitement for both team. The institution's chief executive officer and athletics director should review periodically with other athletics department staff members, coaches, student-athletes and spirit groups (cheerleaders and bands) precisely what is acceptable conduct, as set forth in this document.

Coaches. Coaches have the greatest amount of influence over whether the young people in their programs are taught and follow the high principles of sportsmanship. The OVC has been benefited by coaches who have risked losing a contest by removing student-athletes who have demonstrated disrespect for the opponents. This discipline measure educates that individual and his or her teammates about the importance of sportsmanship over participation and winning. This type of attitude and courage must be adopted by all OVC coaches. Administrators and coaches must pay special attention to their student-athletes' behavior and continually emphasize the need for sportsmanship and respect. Such education is needed to counteract the constant messages received by our young people from many professional athletes and others who demonstrate a lack of respect for opponents. This Conference and its coaches are committed to teach messages that are appropriate about sportsmanship.

Coaches also have the ability to influence the behavior of their fans. OVC coaches must take every opportunity when addressing the media, booster groups or other public forums to express the desire for fans to support their team at home contests, but not to abuse the visiting team. Coaches and administrators should stress that the participants in our athletics contests are young people who do not deserve to be mistreated by a hostile crowd.

Student-Athletes. Respect for the game in which the student-athlete participates also demands respect for the opponent. Student athletes at OVC institutions are expected to treat opponents with

sportsmanship. There can be no tolerance for taunting and baiting of opponents.

OVC student-athletes must understand that they are perhaps the most visible representatives of their institutions. Also, their behavior is observed and emulated by many who are younger. OVC student-athletes must honor the responsibilities that accompany the privilege of representing our schools by behaving with dignity and class on and off the field.

Spirit Groups. Like our student-athletes, these groups are visible representatives of our universities. As such, we place high expectations on them for decent behavior. Cheerleaders, bands and other spirit groups are admitted to contests at the pleasure of our institutions to support their teams and assist in creating a fun atmosphere. They are not admitted in order to disrupt or confront the opponent and such behavior will not be tolerated. Their focus must be toward encouragement of their team and respect for the opposing team.

Officials. Officials who are assigned Conference contests must enforce the rules regarding sportsmanship, without tolerance for abuse. The only warning to participants and coaches regarding sportsmanship should come at the beginning of the contest. Once the contest begins, penalties (consequences), not warning, must be assessed for violations of unsportsmanlike conduct. Similar to the baseball policy of ejecting coaches for arguing balls and strikes, the Conference will require that officials eject any coach who protests unsportsmanlike conduct calls, provided such ejection is permissible the rules of that sport.

Each official assigned by the OVC will be provided a card with the following statement which must be read to the captains and coaches of every contest prior to the beginning of the game: "The OVC requires officials to enforce all rules regarding unsportsmanlike conduct by coaches and players. There will not be any tolerance for negative statements or actions between opposing players, especially taunting and baiting. If such comments are heard, a penalty will be assessed immediately. If any coach protests an unsportsmanlike penalty, he or she will be ejected for the contest. We have been instructed not to issue warnings during the contests. It is strongly suggested that you remind your participants of this policy." Officials who do not follow this policy will be subject to suspension.

Commissioner. The commissioner is expected to enforce the unsportsmanlike conduct rules of the game and the Conference. He or she is authorized to assess penalties for improper behavior that is not detected or properly addressed during the contest. Institutions and their personnel are expected to fully cooperate with his or her effort to investigate possible improper behavior.

In the unfortunate event that an altercation occurs during a contest, all individuals who are on the bench are expected to remain there. It is incumbent upon the head coach to ensure that this occurs. The commissioner is directed to suspend automatically the head coach of a team whose bench personnel enter the field or court of play during an altercation, regardless of whether those individuals become involved in the altercation.

Fans. The Conference hopes and believes that the establishment of the principles outlined in this document will create a wholesome atmosphere that will attract more fans to our events. The fans attending our games must be reminded by the public address announcer of the expectations of sportsmanship and respect for both opponents.

We expect that all fans will act in an appropriate manner, and respect the opposition and the officials. We understand that occasionally there are individuals who attend games and abuse the opposition and officials. Those individuals may be dismissed from athletic events.

Concluding Statement. The Conference believes that the effort to meet the expectations outlined in this document will increase the attractiveness at our athletic events by creating a healthy environment for our competition.
