Control Of Evergreen Pests Planned

(Continued From Page One) ready paying a tax for the upkeep of the city, is under ordinary circumstances obliged to meet competition from other places, who are able to operate tax-free. Thus the local firm, at ready paying a tax for the upkeep of the city, is under ordinary circumstances obliged to meet competition from other places, who are able to operate tax free. Thus the local firm is actually discriminated against when no occupational tax is as-

suming. For example the Midland Lumber Company, the Model Laundry and a number of other firms, are taxed locally for the maintenance of the city government. Bread and bakery trucks from Ashland, Lexington and other cities operate in Morehead and pay no taxes of any sort for the upkeep of the city, and yet, enter into competition with firms that do, wear out the streets and sidewalks paid for by these local firms, and at the same time take business away from the local merchants.

In the past, various kinds of occupation tax have been levied, but due to weaknesses in the ordinances have been declared unconstitutional. Most of them failed to place any tax on the local business.

In the case of the present ordinance, which was adopted at the meeting Tuesday night, the opinion of the Attorney General to whom the proposed ordinance was submitted before hand, was obtained and the opinion approved the ordinance. The ordinance was modeled after, from ordinances already adopted in a number of neighboring cities, particularly the Falmouth and Richmond ordinances covering the same grounds. These ordinances have already stood the test of time and action by the Court of Appeals and the Morehead Council felt that they were only profiting by experience in

adopting a plan already worked out. The council remained in session until nearly midnight, discussing and digesting the new ordinance.
