

## Men's Golf Coach



Dr. Rex Chaney

Dr. Rex Chaney enters his seventh year as Morehead State University's golf coach. His first MSU squad captured the 1977 Ohio Valley Conference crown and he was named Coach of the Year. Both feats were repeated in 1981

Chaney has also served as head baseball coach and an assistant basketball coach.

He was coach of the baseball Eagles from 1961 to 1965, and in 1967. His team won the OVC championship and he won the Coach of the Year honors in 1963. He was an assistant basketball coach under Bob Laughlin.

Chaney holds bachelor's and master's degrees from MSU, and a doctorate from Indiana University. He has served on MSU's health, physical education, and recreation faculty since 1961, and has written several articles on baseball, recreation, and leisure activities.

A native of Hazard, Chaney has a daughter, Jennifer, who is 19.

# Outlook

Despite losing seven players from last year's team, Morehead State University golf coach Dr. Rex Chaney is counting on a good season, thanks to two talented returnees and a fine crop of newcomers.

"We lost six seniors, and one player didn't return," Chaney said. "We will be counting on two returning players very heavily."

The two are senior Kevin Auton and junior Mike Shafer, who are expected to carry a great deal of the Eagles' success on their shoulders. Auton, from Pikeville, Ky., will be the captain of the team this year, the first time the Eagles have ever had a team captain. Shafer has "All-America potential," according to Chaney.

Others who will be expected to contribute quickly are David Clark and Mike Damron. Clark, a freshman from Madisonville, Ky., "has been a bright spot for us," said Chaney, while Damron, a native of Harold, Ky., is a sophomore transfer from a Florida community college. "He has looked very good," Chaney said of Damron.

Others who have impressed the Eagle coach are Scott Miller, a freshman from Hazard, Ky., and B.T. Scott, a freshman from Ashland, Ky.

Even with inexperience, good spring practices have left Chaney optimistic about his coming season. "Practice has looked super," he said. "The freshmen are intelligent and are strong players. Plus, we've had excellent weather for practice. We should be a good golf team."

Chaney expects competition from Ohio Valley Conference foe Eastern Kentucky, who "has everyone back from the team that won the OVC last year," he said. "Murray State and Middle Tennessee will also be tough."

The schedule includes eight tournaments, including MSU's Eagle Classic, to be held at Lexington, plus the OVC Championship, which will take place April 25-26 at Springfield, Ky.
