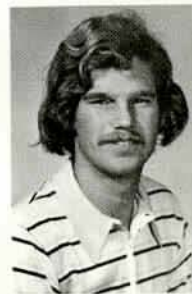


MAX ADANI
5-8, 158, Sr., Fraser, Michigan

Max Adani enters his senior season as one of the best golfers in MSU's history. He captured the individual title in the MSU Invitational and finished ninth in the Ohio Valley Conference tourney last spring.

A three-year letterman, Adani is equally tough off the tee and on the green.

A graduate of Fraser High School, he is a business and economics major.



CHARLES DORAN
6-0, 165, Sr., Central Square, N. Y.

Another youngster who started college without a scholarship, Doran earned his way by playing outstanding golf. A determined competitor who never gives up, he finished third in OVC competition last season.

The Kentucky Intercollegiate champ in 1972, Doran won the Eagle MVP award the same year. One of three all-conference golfers on the MSU team, he is a three-year letterman and is majoring in health, recreation and physical education.

JOHN BAAS
6-0, 165, Fr., Louisville, Ky.

One of the three freshmen on the squad, Baas is expected to play regularly for the Eagles in the future. A graduate of Flaget High School, he was the high school regional champ last year.

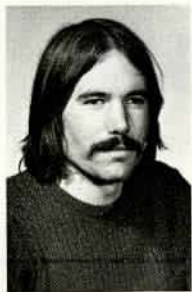
A business administration major, Baas is a determined young man with definite potential.

5-9, 163, So., Louisville, Ky.

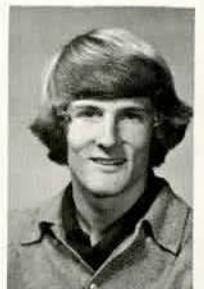
Mudd, the only freshman in the history of the Ohio Valley Conference to claim the individual tourney title, has three years still to play at MSU.

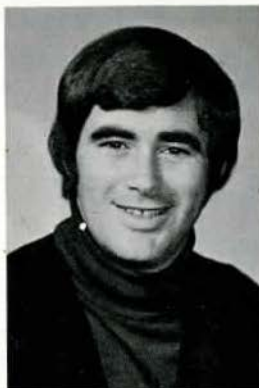
A graduate of Butler High School, he won a spot on the All-OVC team last year and is expected to challenge for the OVC crown again this year.
