have to be made between the Communists and the Chumking government.

The Chinese Communists, he said, are not so concerned with ordinary sense of the word, but are more concerned with the revolutionary program that is essentially democratic and modern.

Mr. Stewart said that the most prosperous and best-fed in China, those who are the most interested in the revolution, are the ones who are the most active in the revolutionary fight within the Kuomintang.

Mr. Stewart said, "It is a question that can only be answered by the developments in the way."

"But as a leading democratic of the two factions and a very powerful power, those that are working toward democracy in China. If we are consistent in this policy, China may yet emerge as a bulwark for peace and security in Asia."
