Midori to present concert, May 5

Internationally acclaimed violinist Midori will present a concert Saturday, May 5, at 7 p.m. at Morehead State University's Button Auditorium.

Proceeds from this concert will support the Virginia Harpham Scholarship for String Players at MSU and the Rowan County School System's Lucille Caudill Little Strings Program.

Midori is recognized not only for the evolution and scope of her 29-year career as one of the most dazzlingly gifted performers before the public, but increasingly for the prescient and innovative community engagement initiatives to which she devotes a substantial amount of her energies and resources worldwide on an ongoing basis. Named a Messenger of Peace by U.N. Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon in 2007, she has created a new model for young artists who seek to balance the joys and demands of a performing career at the highest level with a hands-on investment in the power of music to change lives.

With the belief that chamber music in small communities deserves support, Midori took the money she won as part of the Avery Fisher Prize in 2001 and established a nonprofit foundation called "Partners in Performance," that awards free concerts to organizations to use as a fundraiser to support the development and sustainability of orchestral string education programs.

She has encouraged other established artists to participate in Partners in Performance programs, and in the 2009-10 season pianist Jonathan Biss joined the team. This season, Partners in Performance is sponsoring concerts at MSU and in Melbourne, Fla.

Midori was born in Osaka, Japan, in 1971 and began studying the violin with her mother, Setsu Goto, at a very early age. In 1982, when Zubin Mehta first heard her play, he was so impressed that he invited her to be a surprise guest soloist for the New York Philharmonic's traditional New Year's Eve concert, on which occasion she received a standing ovation and the impetus to begin a major career.

In 2000, she received her bachelor's degree in psychology and gender studies at the Gallatin School of New York University, graduating magna cum laude, and in 2005 received her master's degree in psychology.

Midori's appearance is made possible in part by Partners in Performance, a nonprofit organization she founded with the aim of keeping chamber music alive and accessible by supporting dedicated classical presenters in communities across America.



Kentucky artists are invited to participate in the Bluegrass Biennial 2012, a juried exhibition of contemporary artworks of Kentuckians, which will be displayed in the main gallery of Morehead State University's Claypool-Young Art Building. The opening and award reception will be held on Saturday, June 2, from 3 - 5 p.m. The exhibition will run through July 31.

The Bluegrass Biennial exhibition is open to all artists 18 years who are residing in Kentucky. Awards will be presented for Best in Show (\$300) and Merit (\$100 each).

Becky Alley, exhibitions and programs director at the Lexington Art League, will be the 2012 exhibition juror. Alley earned a B.F.A. degree in studio art from Washington University, and an M.F.A. degree in studio art from the University of Kansas.

VITA offers free tax assistance

During this filing season, Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) will be available at no charge to Morehead State University students and eligible employees.

Through the University's Department of Accounting, Economics and Finance, in conjunction with the Internal Revenue Service, tax return assistance will be offered on Tuesdays from 3-6 p.m. in 311 Combs Building on campus. The office will not be open March 20. It is free to students, and also to employees and members of the Morehead community with an annual household income of \$45,000 or less.

No appointment is necessary. Taxpayers will be assisted on a first come, first served basis, and no returns will be accepted for preparation after 5:30 p.m.

It will be necessary for taxpayers to bring with them documentation for any and all that apply:

- W-2(s);
- 1099(s);
- A copy of last year's return;
- Statements of other income;
- Information for deductions and credits;
- Social Security cards for each individual who will be listed on the return
- Proof of identification (photo ID) for yourself and/or spouse;
- Proof of account for direct deposit of refund (voided check);
- Proof of tuition paid (regardless of source of funds used) during 2011 for yourself, spouse, and/or dependents;
- Cost of books for 2011;
- Amount of scholarships and/or grants awarded in 2011.

For proof of tuition and scholarships/grants, you should bring a copy of your account for the calendar year of 2011. This can be printed from MSU account Web page.

National author and higher education trainer Dr. Jenny Bloom will present "Appreciative Advising: Student Retention and Success" Friday, Feb. 24, in 301 of Morehead State University's Adorn Doran University Center. The workshop will be held from 9 a.m. until noon with a light lunch provided.

Dr. Bloom is a clinical professor and director of the master's degree program in the Higher Education and Student Affairs Program housed in the Department of Educational Leadership and Policies at the University of South Carolina.

Prior to her appointment at USC, she served as the associate dean for student affairs and the Medical Scholars Program at the University of Illinois College of Medicine at Urbana-Champaign. She earned her doctoral degree in higher education administration from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 1995.

Dr. Bloom served as the 2007-08 president of the National Academic Advising Association (NACADA). She received the NACADA Outstanding Advising Administrator Award in 2005 and University of Illinois' Campus Academic Professional Excellence Award in 2007. She received the University of South Carolina's Black Graduate Student Association's Faculty Mentor Award in 2008, as well as the University of Illinois' College of Medicine at Urbana-Champaign's Senior Class Special Tribute Award.

She has co-authored two books, three book chapters and 11 articles. The first book was titled "Career Aspirations & Expeditions: Advancing Your Career in Higher Education."

Dr. Bloom has delivered 10 national webinars and more than 160 presentations on her work at institutions and conferences across the country. Her research interests include appreciative advising, academic advising, positive psychology, career paths in higher education administration, leadership and change management.
