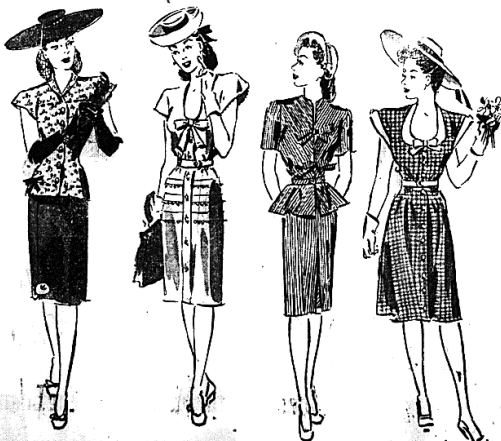

worked in conjunction with different community schools of the state. Morehead State Teachers College has assisted in the work of the Community School Project of the Carter County School system.

The purpose of the Community School Workshop is to give teachers the needed viewpoint and experience in order that they make their schools more continuous with the agencies. The workshop carries four quarter hours of credit and is scheduled so that students are able to take one additional four-hour course. The workshop activities are conducted from 10 to 12 each morning, and they consist of discussion, lectures and practical illustration.

This workshop, which closes at the end of the first summer term on July 13, is under the direction of Dr. R. D. Judd, head of the Teachers' department of education.

Others being present from Lewis Morgan, Henry, Mason, Rowland, Mercer, Lawrence, Fleming, Wolf and Knott. Thirty of the students enrolled have never had any teaching experience and few of this thirty have had any college work, most of them being recent school graduates. Of the remaining eight teachers only two have had more than one year's experience.

The workshop is under the direction of Mr. Charles VanAntwerp, Director of the Training School, and the demonstration lessons and the conference are being handled by Miss Edna Ford, Second Grade Civic Teacher and Miss Thelma Evans, Fifth Grade Civic Teacher.

A special collection of pamphlet material has been made available for the teachers, as well as an almost complete list of textbooks to use in the state, including the recently adopted texts. A professional library has been provided for reference work, and the students are encouraged to contribute as many materials as possible during the course which can be of use in their teaching this coming year.

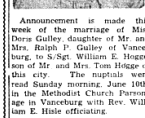
