

MANAGER BILL IS REPORTED OUT BY HOUSE COMMITTEE

Likelihood Seen That Proposal Will Be Considered Monday Or Tuesday.

BUDGET HELPS U. KY.

Representatives Vote \$469,241 to University, Experiment Station, Etc.

FRANKFORT, Ky., March 10.—The city manager enabling bill, passed by the Senate, Friday was reported out of the rules committee of the House.

The action of the rules committee in deciding to report the bill came Friday morning, but the measure was not posted until that night.

The bill is third among the Senate bills brought out by the rules committee. Counting House bill and Senate bills this measure is 28th in the list. However, beginning Monday the various measures need not be called up in their order of sequence and there is more than a possibility that the city manager proposal will be considered Monday or Tuesday.

J. Porter Land, member of the rules committee, who has been fathering the bill since his demand for an amendment, predicts that it will be acted upon early.

No opposition to the bill, it is reported, developed in rules committee. Chief danger to the bill now, it is thought, lies in probable attempts to attach amendments other than those agreed upon here more than a week ago.

University Gets Big Sum

At the House meeting Friday night the University's recommended appropriation in the budget bill was approved without debate. It allots to the institution the sum of \$300,000 for building purposes during the next two years. The money will be spent for a dairy building and a training school building.

The total sum appropriated to the University, together with the Experiment Station and its substations is \$469,241.30.

Save for an extra \$3,000 granted the Princeton substation for stock barn and silo in 1929-30, the sums have been duplicated in the appropriation for the second year.

Following is the list of appropriations for 1928-29:

For the purpose of paying for the cost of maintenance and operation of the Experiment Station of the University of Kentucky for said fiscal year, as now authorized by law, or as may hereafter be authorized by law, the sum of \$50,000.

For the purpose of paying all the cost of the maintenance and operation of the Extension Division of the University of Kentucky for said fiscal year in the manner now authorized by law, or as may hereafter be authorized by law, the sum of \$142,241.30.

For agricultural instruction \$30,000.

For the purpose of paying the Experiment Station of the University of Kentucky for making all analyses for the State Board of Health under the provisions of Chapter 65 of the Acts of 1918, and for making all analyses requested by any other department of the State government, to be paid in equal monthly installments, the sum of \$22,000.

For the purpose of paying for one-half of the cost of the construction of a Training School Building, to match a similar sum of the General Education Board of New York City, the sum of \$75,000.

For salaries, expenses, and cost incident to the maintenance of a summer school \$10,000.

For the Princeton Experiment Station, annual appropriation as provided in the Act of 1924 the sum of \$20,000.

For the Quicksand Experiment Station, annual appropriation as provided in the Act of 1924, the sum of \$25,000.

For the payment on the purchase of 103 acres of land as addition to the Experiment Station, the sum of \$20,000.

For the construction and equipment of a dairy building at the Experiment Station for laboratories and factory in dairy instruction, the sum of \$75,000.

Morehead State Normal was granted an appropriation by the House of \$125,000 for building and equipment of a training school or library building.

A similar sum was approved for the Murray Institution for building and equipment of a boys' dormitory or a library building.

Western Kentucky Normal, if the Senate approves the House's recommendation, will receive \$125,000 for a girls' dormitory or manual arts building and Eastern Normal will get the same sum for an auditorium or boys' dormitory.

Had Asked \$825,000

While the University of Kentucky requested \$825,000 for building purposes during the next two years, in place of the \$300,000 approved by the House, the sum specified in the Budget bill is more than the institution has received in a long time, and officials, it
