MOREHEAD STATE COLLEGE

Morehead was established in 1923 as a state supported, teacher training institution. Since its establishment, the college has made remarkable growth, both in facilities and offerings. In addition to its original function, that of teacher training, the college is now serving as a general regional college.

The campus of Morehead comprises an area of 350 acres, and it is often referred to as one of the most beautiful campuses in Kentucky. On the campus is a 26 acre lake which serves as a reservoir for the college and town and provides facilities for camping, picnicing and fishing. The natural beauty, healthful climate, and cool summer nights are additional attractions to the campus.

Morehead has an enrollment of approximately 800 students and offers curricular devoted to the training of teachers, administrators, and a program of nursing education. The Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, and Master of Arts in Education Degrees are awarded by the college. Preliminary training for professional study in medicine, dentistry, law, pharmacy, and engineering are also offered by the college.

The athletic program of Morehead embraces football, basketball, baseball, cross-country, and track. The college is a member of the Ohio Valley Conference and the National Collegiate Athletic Association. All athletic events are played in strict compliance with the rules and regulations of these associations.

INDIVIDUAL SKETCHES

ADAMS, LAWRENCE - Adams is a 5-9, 195 pound sophomore center from Louisa, Ky. He lettered as a freshman and will give a much needed depth at the center position.

ADKINS, BILLY - Alternated with McKenzie last year at quarterback. He will hold down the same post this year. A fast, aggressive boy, Adkins makes a rugged linebacker on defense. He stands 5-11 and weighs 180, a product of Corbin, Kentucky.

BARKER, HAROLD - Co-Captain of the Eagles along with Jenkins. The most versatile player on the team. He would turn in a dependable job at any position, but will be used at tackle and end. A fine punter, Barker, last year, ranked 10th in the nation among small colleges with a 38.5 yard average.

BROWN, GEORGE - Brown is 6 foot, 210 pound freshman from Milton, W. Va. He looked good in pre-season practices and is expected to see a lot of action this fall.

CANTRELL, CHARLES - A product of Catlettsburg, Ky., Cantrell stands 5-8 and weighs 180 pounds. He is a freshman.

CLAYTON, TOM - Clayton is a freshman halfback from Henderson, Kentucky. He is 5-11 and weighs 150 pounds.

COPP, DON - Copp is the biggest man on the squad at 6-4, 230 pounds. This 18 year old giant freshman comes from Trotwood, Ohio. He probably will do the kicking-off.

COZAD, WAYNE - A fullback in high school, Cozad will be used as a quarterback by the Eagles. He is a 5-11, 170 pound freshman from Huntington, Ind.

FEIS, BROWN - Regular center last year, he was switched to tackle this year due to the lack of experienced tackles. The 5-9, 210 pound veteran is a senior this year.

HART, RONDAL - Regular fullback last year, he will be the workhorse of the backfield. The hardest runner on the squad, he stands 5-10 and weighs 180, from Corbin, Kentucky.

HICKS, JIMMIE - Hicks was on the squad last year but did not letter. He will be looked upon for reserve strength at both halfback slots. 5-11, 180, he comes from Barbourville, Kentucky.

HUM, DON - Don is expected to see a lot of action this year at end. He is 6-1 and weighs 195 from Huntington, Ind. One of the better freshmen on the squad.

IVASKA, JOHN - One of the two Pennsylvania boys on the squad, Ivaska is a freshman guard, 5-9, 190 pounds from Duquesne, Pa.

JENKINS, ERSKINE - Co-Captain of the Eagles, Jenkins was switched from guard to center this year. He is an outstanding defensive linebacker. A 5-11, 170 pound senior from Milton, W. Va.

LANE, RUSTY - One of the freshmen ends on the squad, Lane comes from Barboursville, W. Va.

LEWIS, DON - Lewis is a freshman guard from Milton, W. Va.

MANSER, JIM - A 6-3, 185 pound freshman end from New Baltimore, Mich.

McKENZIE, DON - The most improved ball player on the squad and one of the most aggressive. 5-9 and weighs 170, he will hold down the quarterback position. A junior from West Liberty, Kentucky.

MOTLEY, EUGENE - A 5-10, 190 pound sophomore from Harrodsburg, he will see his first year of starting service this fall as a guard.

O'HARA, TOM - O'Hara is a 5-11, 160 pound freshman halfback from East Detroit, Mich. He is a fine passer and is expected to help the Eagles in that department this year.

OUSLEY, PAUL - A freshman end from Prestonsburg, Ky., he might possibly see starting service. He stands 6-1 and weighs 170.

PAPPAS, CONSTANTINE - "Connie" is 5-9, 180 pounds, from Mt. Clemens, Mich. This freshman will see plenty of action this year at right half.

PERFICH, NICK - A freshman fullback from Elbert, W. Va. He stands 5-10 and weighs 175.

RISHER, BILL - One of the four freshmen from Michigan on the squad. This 5-9, 195 pound guard is looked on by the coaching staff as one of the finest prospects they've ever seen.

ROSE, HAROLD - A sophomore guard of the watch charm type. He is 5-7, 170 pounds from West Liberty, Kentucky. Started last year as a freshman.

SPENCER, DICK - This 6 foot, 145 pound freshman quarterbacked his high school team to the W. Va. state championship last year. He will play tailback for the Eagles in order to put to use his excellent passing abilities.

SPRADLIN, TOM - A 6 foot, 200 pound freshman tackle from Prestonsburg, Kentucky. He could possibly be a starter this year.

WALTON, ROY - One of the six seniors on the team, he is the only experienced tackle from last year's team. He stands 6-1, and weighs 205 from Lexington, Ky.

WARFIELD, J. C. - Warfield is a freshman tackle from Barboursville, Ky.

WASHKO, JOHN - Washko is a freshman center from Duquesne, Pa.

WELLS, ED - Leading ground gainer last year. A 5-7, 155 pound senior from Millersburg, Ky., he runs the hundred in 10 seconds flat.

WRIGHT, MORRIS - Wright will be at one end for the Eagles this fall. A 6-1, 190 pounder from Harrodsburg, Ky., he lettered as a freshman last year.
