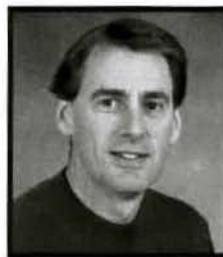

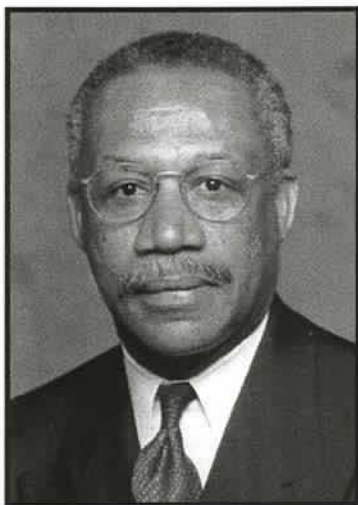

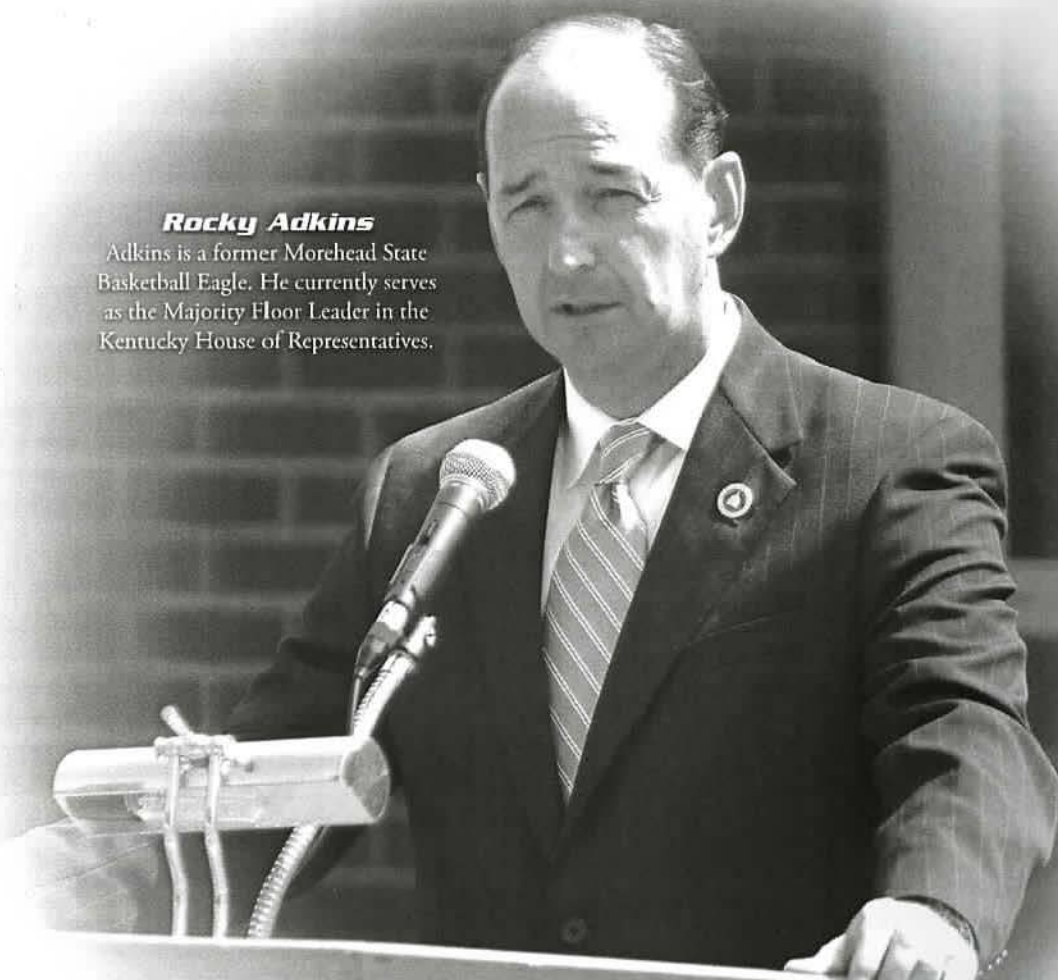
Dr. Marshall Banks

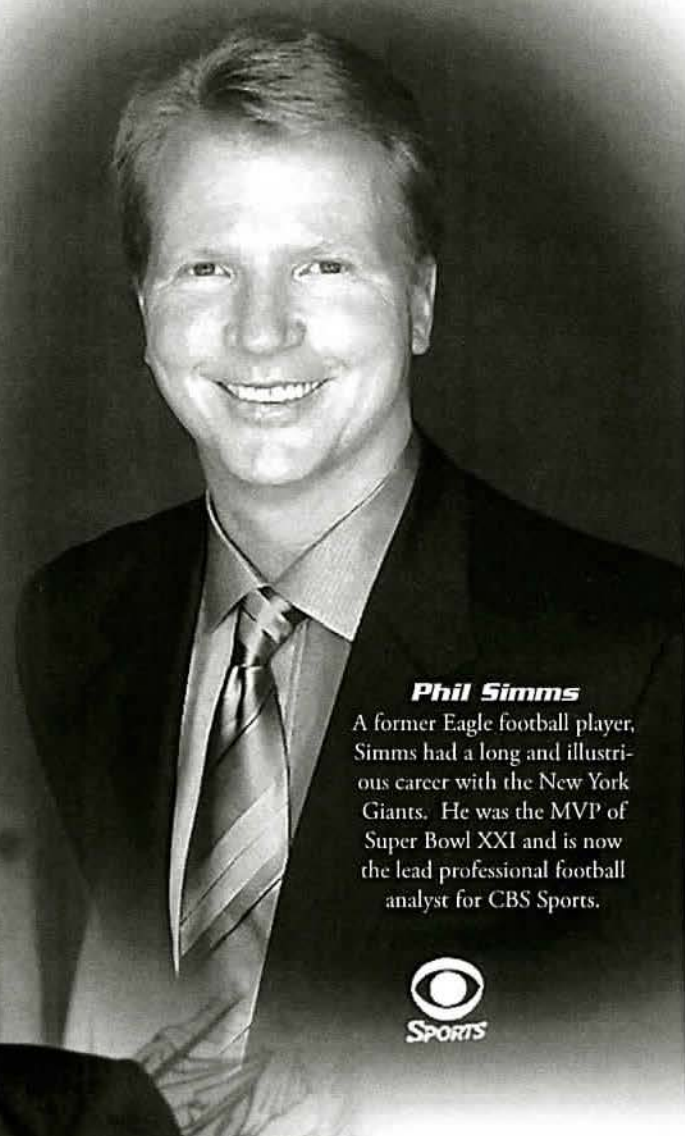
Mike Gottfried

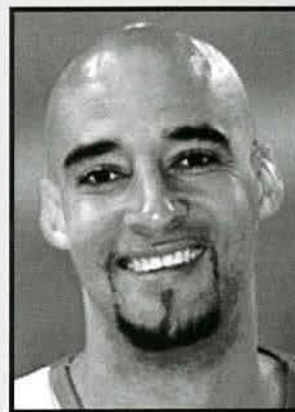

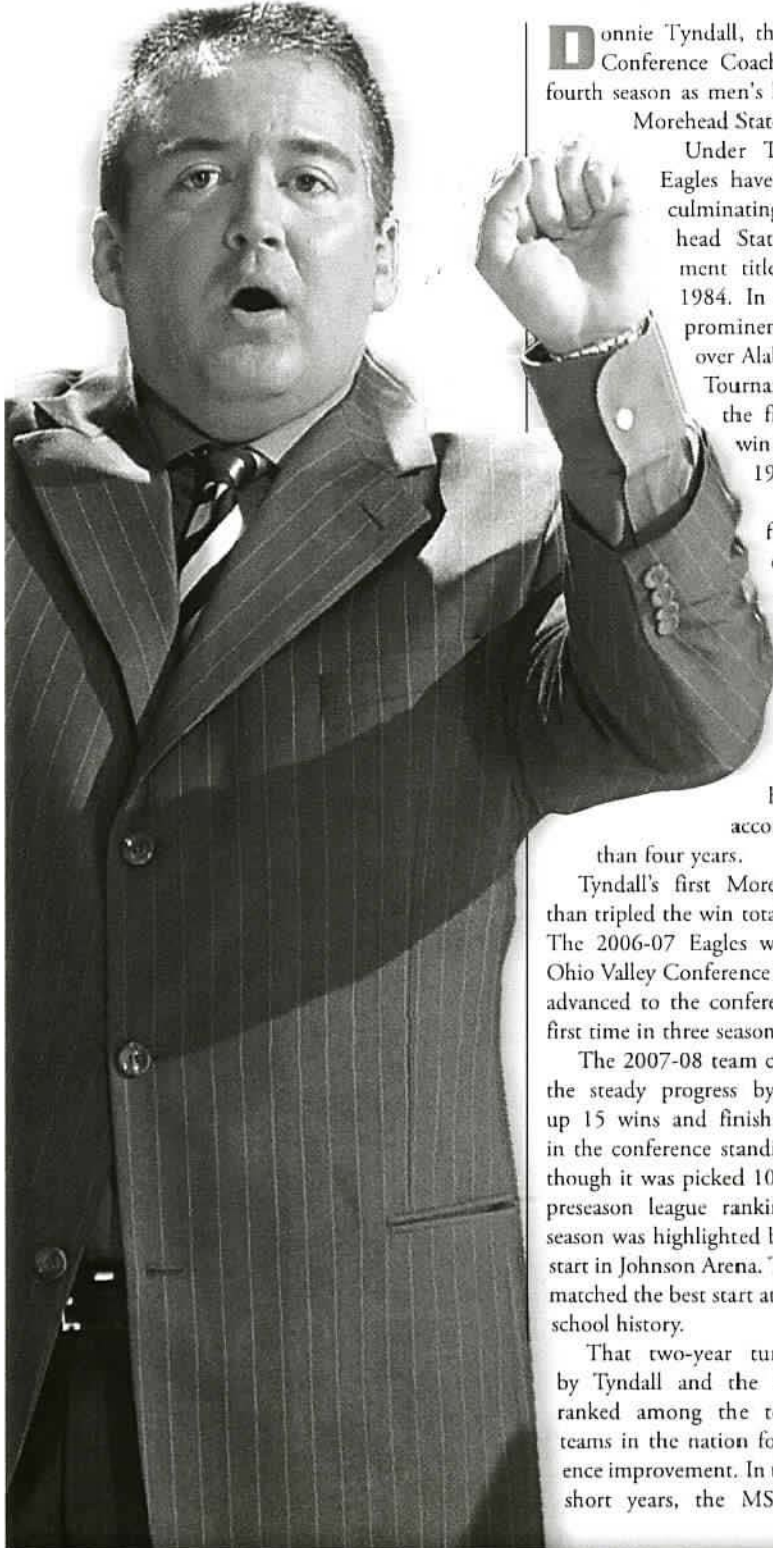

Head Coach Donnie Tyndall



Donnie Tyndall, the 2007-08 Ohio Valley Conference Coach of the Year, is in his fourth season as men's head basketball coach at Morehead State University.

Under Tyndall's guidance, the Eagles have improved each season, culminating last year with Morehead State's first OVC Tournament title and NCAA bid since 1984. In returning the Eagles to prominence, Tyndall led MSU over Alabama State in the NCAA Tournament Opening Round, the first NCAA Tournament win for an OVC team since 1989.

The 2008-09 Eagles finished with a 20-16 overall record, the first time since 2002-03 that a Morehead State team has reached 20 wins. Tyndall is only the third coach in school history to have a 20-win season and he is the only coach to accomplish the feat in fewer

than four years.

Tyndall's first Morehead State team more than tripled the win total from the previous year. The 2006-07 Eagles were picked 11th in the Ohio Valley Conference but finished seventh and advanced to the conference tournament for the first time in three seasons.

The 2007-08 team continued the steady progress by picking up 15 wins and finishing third in the conference standings even though it was picked 10th in the preseason league rankings. The season was highlighted by a 10-0 start in Johnson Arena. That start matched the best start at home in school history.

That two-year turnaround by Tyndall and the Eagles is ranked among the top eight teams in the nation for conference improvement. In those two short years, the MSU men's

basketball program became a contender for the OVC crown and one year later achieved that goal.

Well respected both in the Morehead community and within the college coaching ranks, Tyndall was named as one of the Top 10 "Under the Radar" coaches by Athalon Sports this year. He also served as the co-chair for the MSU Capital Campaign in 2009.

An MSU alumnus who was a basketball letterwinner, he is the 12th head coach in the history of the Eagle program. He returned to his alma mater from the position of associate head coach at Middle Tennessee State University where he had served for four years.





Taylor, Donnie and Gracie

A NCAA Division I assistant coach for nearly 10 years, the 39-year old Tyndall spent one season as associate head coach at the University of Idaho. Prior to that, he was an assistant coach for four seasons at Louisiana State University. In 1996-97, Tyndall served as head coach at St. Catharine College in Springfield, Ky., for a season. After graduation from MSU, he spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Iowa Central Community College in Fort Dodge, Iowa.

"In conducting a national search and speaking with literally hundreds of people, it became apparent that someone with a commitment to recruiting high level student-athletes, a passion for the game and certainly a fondness for Morehead State would emerge as our new head men's basketball coach," said MSU Athletic Director Brian Hutchinson. "Donnie Tyndall has all the requisite experience, having been a Division I assistant for nearly 10 years. He is proving himself to be absolutely the right person to lead this program into prominence regionally and nationally."

At MTSU, Tyndall teamed with Head Coach Kermit Davis to lead the Blue Raiders to four consecutive winning seasons, averaging 17 wins a campaign. As recruiting coordinator, he directed MTSU recruiting efforts that have resulted in two classes being ranked in the Top 25 nation-

ally. "Hoop Scoop" ranked the 2003 class 23rd, and the 2004 class was ranked 11th nationally. Each class was selected as the number one class in the Sun Belt Conference by that basketball publication.

While many of his responsibilities centered around recruiting, Tyndall also played instrumental roles in practice and game preparation, coordinating scouting reports and practice organization and in academic monitoring.

While he was at Idaho, the Vandals 2002 recruiting class was ranked as high as 15th nationally. Tyndall also served as scouting coordinator. As the individual in charge of academic progress, he helped the team earn a cumulative grade point average of 2.6 (on a 4.0 scale), the best at the school in more than a decade.

During his tenure on John Brady's staff at LSU, Tyndall helped recruit three classes that were ranked among the Top 25 nationally. In 2000, LSU won the SEC and advanced to the Sweet 16. Three of the recruited student-athletes went on to play in the NBA, five earned All-Southeast Conference honors and five were named Academic All-SEC. As the Tigers' academic coordinator, he helped improve the basketball team's grade point average from 1.7 in 1996 to 2.65 in 2001.

During his one season as head coach at St. Catharine, he led the team to a school record 30-5 mark and to the National Junior College Athletic Association National Tournament for the first time in school history. Tyndall was named the Kentucky-Tennessee Junior College Coach of the Year and was also named the top coach in Region VII. Illustrating his emphasis on academic achievement, the team's grade point average improved from 1.81 to 2.64, and all six of the sophomores on the squad earned associate degrees.

As an assistant coach at Iowa Central, he had on-floor coaching and recruiting duties and organized and supervised the team's strength and conditioning program.

A native of Grand Rapids, Mich., Tyndall played at Northview High School, then one season at Iowa Central (1989-90). He was a member of Eagle teams for three seasons (1990-93). Tyndall played with Athletes in Action after completing his career at MSU.

He earned a bachelor's degree from MSU (1993) and a master's degree from LSU.

Tyndall has two daughters, Taylor Elise and Grace Elizabeth.

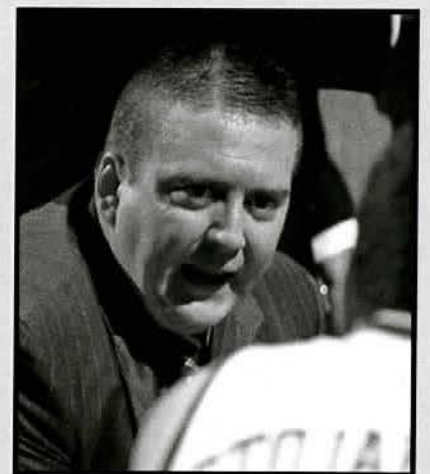

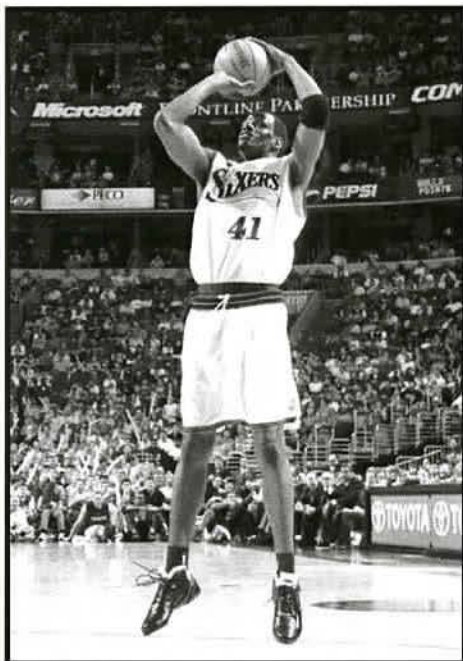
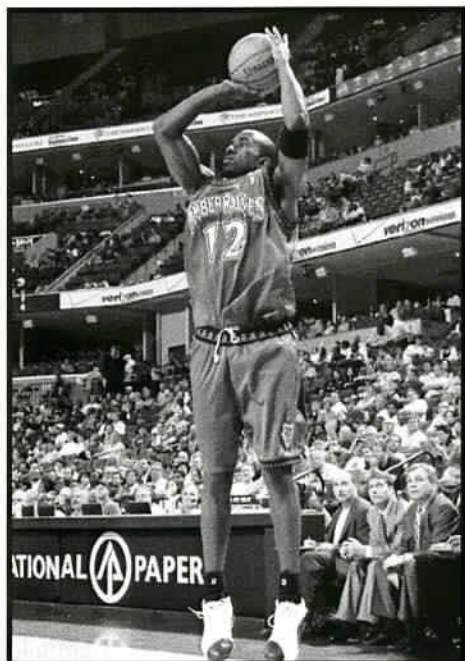

Matt Grady was named Assistant Men's Basketball Coach at Morehead State in July of 2009. He assists with all aspects of the program, including recruiting, scouting and game planning.

Grady joined Morehead State with experience at the University of Louisville, the University of Cincinnati, New Mexico State, Murray State, and St. Joseph's.

He was most recently an administrative assistant on Rick Pitino's staff at Louisville. He also worked with Pitino at UofL as a program assistant in Pitino's first two years at the school in 2001-03. The Cardinals won 44 games during that span.

Prior to his role in Louisville, Grady was an assistant coach at New Mexico State. He helped guide the Aggies to a 21-14 record in 2007-08.

Grady was the director of basketball operations at Cincinnati with Mick Cronin in 2006-07 and also served under Cronin for three seasons prior to that at Murray State. At Murray State, Grady served as the team academic liaison and played a key role in all aspects of on-the-floor coaching for a Racer program that produced a three-year record of 69-23.

He began his coaching career with Phil Martelli at St. Joseph's University as a student assis-

tant. He also played on the junior varsity squad at St. Joe's and earned his bachelor's degree in finance in 2001.

Grady is a native of Springfield, N.J., where he played alongside former Duke All-American

and Chicago Bulls' star Jay Williams at St. Joseph's High School. Along with Williams, he also teamed with Golden State Warriors' standout Al Harrington when the two played for the New Jersey Roadrunners AAU club.





Chris Moore

4th Season

Chris Moore, a veteran of the college and high school coaching ranks, is in his fourth season as an assistant basketball coach at Morehead State University.

Moore serves as both recruiting and academic coordinator for the Eagles. In his first three years at MSU, he has helped the Eagles sign two top-40 recruiting classes, win the school's first Ohio Valley Conference championship and make its first NCAA tournament appearance in 25 years.

Moore came to MSU from the staff of Jeffersonville (Ind.) High School. Jeffersonville finished the 2005-06 season with a 23-2 record, won the district championship, reached the regional finals and was ranked fourth in the state.

Prior to 2005-06, he spent two seasons as an assistant coach at Bellarmine University in Louisville. There, he assisted with all facets of the program, including serving as head coach for the junior varsity squad.

Before Bellarmine, he served one season on Walt Corbean's staff at Indiana University Southeast where once again, he assisted in all areas. He helped guide IUS to a 21-13 record.

In 2000-01 and 2001-02, he was an assistant

coach with the University of Cincinnati's women's basketball program. Cincinnati was 49-15 in those two seasons and advanced to postseason play on both occasions. During his final year at UC, the Bearcats finished 27-5 and won the Conference USA title. They finished the season ranked in the Top 25, a first for that program.

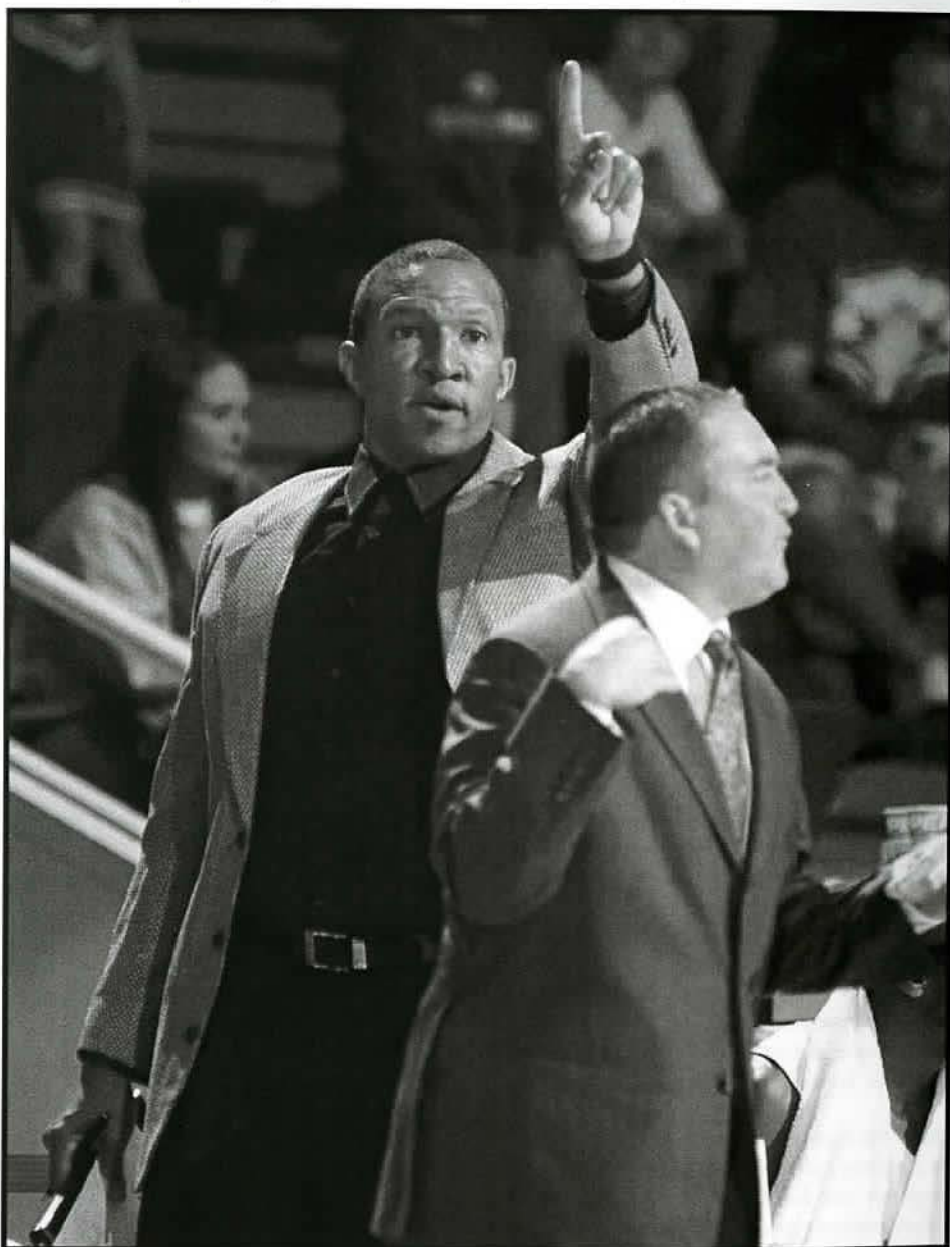
A Louisville native, Moore began his coaching career at Fern Creek and DuPont Manual high schools in the city. During six seasons in the

Louisville high school ranks, he helped lead teams to two district championships and two regional championship game appearances.

Moore was a four-year letterman at Kentucky State University. He earned Academic All-America honors in 1990-91 and served as team captain as a senior.

He holds a bachelor's degree in criminal justice from KSU (1991) and a master's degree in sports administration from Louisville (2000).

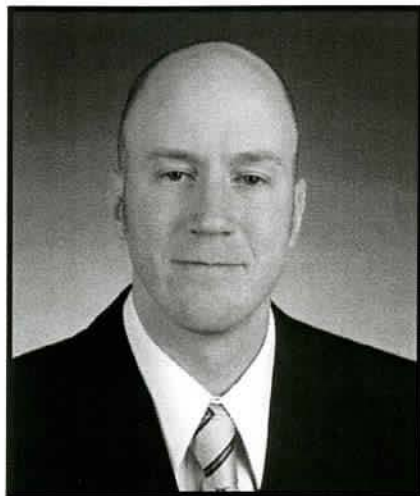

He assists in all aspect of the program, from recruiting to game preparation and coaching.

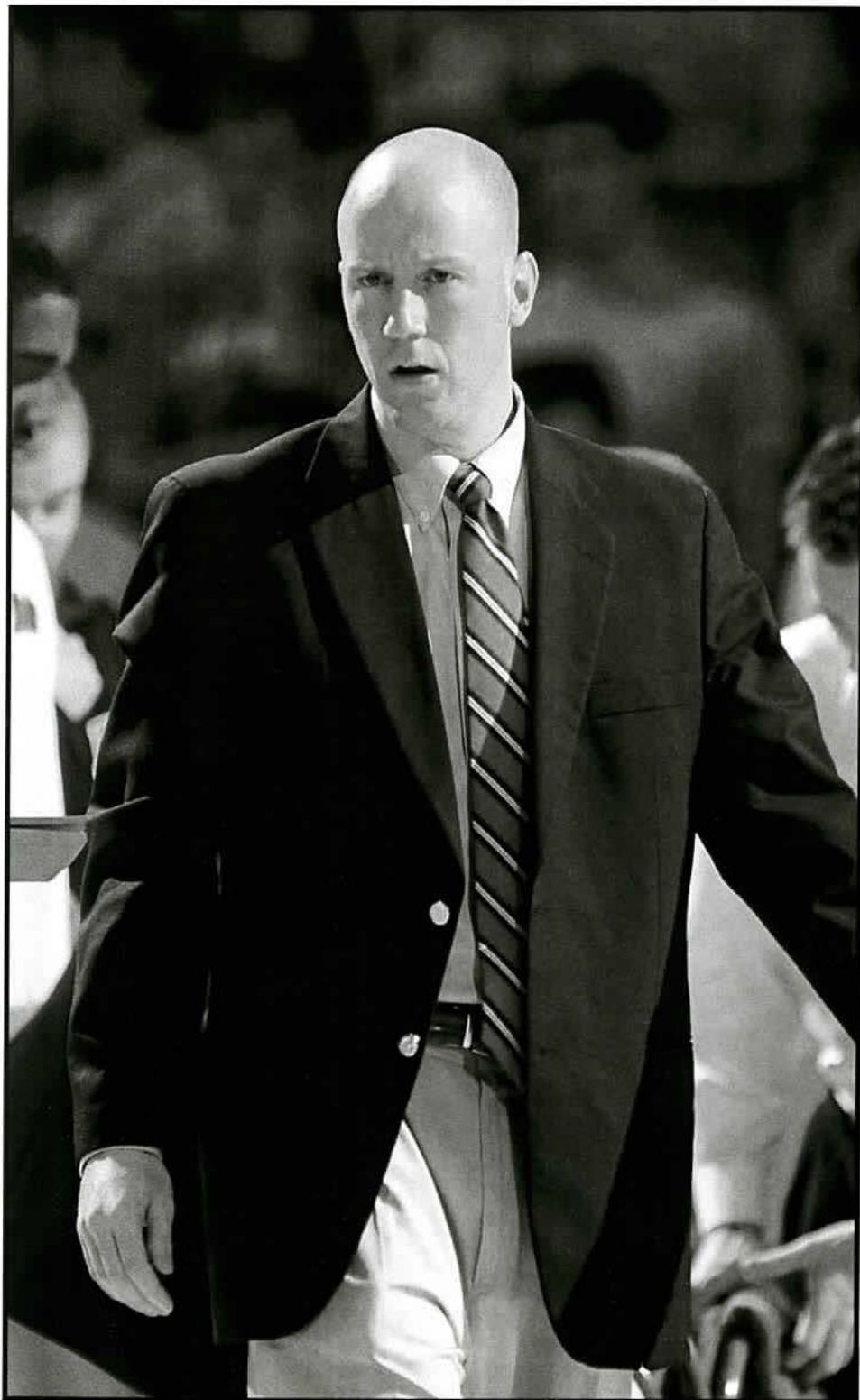

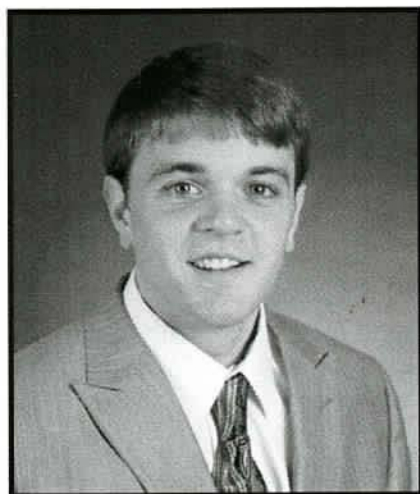

director of basketball operations. Howard's duties include travel and video oversight and practice preparation and game day operations.

Howard was a four-year letterman at Western Kentucky for current South Carolina head coach Darrin Horn. While at WKU, Howard was part of three post-season appearances: the 2004-05 NIT Second Round (24-9), the 2005-06 NIT First Round, where the Hilltoppers lost to eventual champions South Carolina (23-8), and the 2007-08 NCAA Tournament (12 seed) Sweet 16. That Sweet 16 team beat Drake in the first round and San Diego in the second round before falling to Final Four participant UCLA in the Sweet 16.

He was a part of 96 wins in four seasons and was awarded the Danny Rumph Most Outstanding Teammate Award for three seasons (2005-06, 2006-07, 2007-08) after the passing of his teammate and friend Danny Rumph (who passed away from Cardiomyopathy, which caused heart failure during a pick up game in his hometown of Philly) at the conclu-

sion of Howard's freshman season.

Following college, Howard worked as a host to the University of New Mexico in the Cancun Challenge 2008-09, where he first met coach Tyndall. In the summer of 2009, prior to joining the MSU staff, he worked as a counsler at the Freshman All-American Camp for the top 150 freshmen in the country. Howard also assisted on the Derek Smith All-Stars 16U AAU team in the summer of 2009.

A graduate of Paul G. Blazer High School in nearby Ashland, Ky., Howard earned a bachelor's degree in mass communication from Western Kentucky.

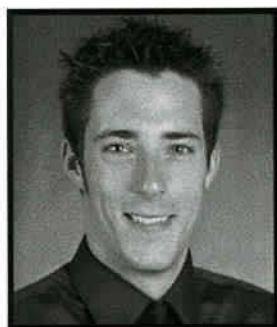

Johnson Arena

Ellis T. Johnson Arena in the Academic-Athletic Center has served as the homecourt for Morehead State men's basketball since 1981. The AAC is one of the best facilities in the nation for men's basketball, and Johnson Arena is named for former Morehead State athletic director and coach Ellis T. Johnson. Johnson was also a highly successful football coach at both University of Kentucky and Marshall University. The Eagles enjoy a tremendous home court advantage in Johnson Arena.

During the summer of 2006, the arena floor was completely resurfaced with Morehead State's new primary logo and word marks. The Eagles' locker room, located just steps from the court, was also completely refurbished with new walls, lockers and furniture. The locker facility is also conveniently connected to the AAC training room.



The building is a multi-purpose facility and also houses offices for a majority of the athletic department staff, including a second-floor office suite for men's basketball. The facility also houses a cheerleading room, the Len Miller VIP Room, a full-service weight room, a satellite training room,

sauna and steam rooms, and ample concession and storage areas. The AAC also incorporates the Russell McClure Pool, which served as home to the MSU swim team until 1995.

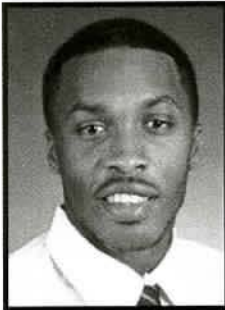
The University broke ground on the AAC in 1978 and completed the project in 1981. The Eagles won their inaugural game in the building on December 3, 1981 over the University of Charleston.

Johnson Arena itself has a seating capacity of 6,500 for basketball and can be easily transformed into an auditorium for concerts and commencements. At the East end of the playing floor, a hydraulic stage can be raised for events. Since opening, the arena has hosted such national acts as Alabama, David Letterman, M.C. Hammer, the Goo Goo Dolls, Alan Jackson, Dashboard Confessional, Jeff Foxworthy, Tim McGraw, Travis Tritt and Sawyer Brown.

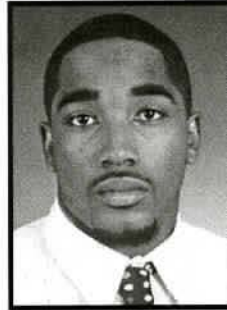

2009-10 Basketball Outlook

When you exceed even your own expectations, what do you do for an encore?

For Morehead State men's basketball coach Donnie Tyndall, you shoot for a repeat, and maybe more. Tyndall's five-year plan to resurrect MSU basketball culminated in 2009 with an Ohio Valley Conference Tournament title and an NCAA Valley trip in just year three. Now revised plans include a return trip to the NCAA Tournament as a higher seed with the potential to advance beyond the first round.

But to get to that point, the Eagles must again win the OVC Tournament and this time, MSU won't be the surprise Cinderella team this season. Morehead State was chosen as the preseason favorite, along with Murray State, to win the OVC this season. The Eagles two biggest weapons were also honored by the Ohio Valley Conference, with junior center Kenneth Faried earning the Preseason Player of the Year and senior Maze Stallworth joining Faried on the Preseason All-Conference team.

"We are honored to be picked to finish first alongside Murray State, but it also means we won't sneak up on anyone this year," Tyndall said. "The reality is that regardless of where we are picked, we have to work hard and win basketball games to make these predictions come true."

Tyndall will rely heavily on his experienced players to help prove the preseason predictions, and experience is something this Eagle team has in abundance, especially where it can be most critical. Morehead State's starting floor general will be fifth-year senior Brandon Shingles. Shingles, a 6-3 Albany, Ga., native, averaged just under four assists per game to lead MSU and 5.0 points per game last season.

"Brandon has great leadership ability and he's talented," Tyndall said. "I expect him to be one of the best if not the best point guard in the league."

Behind Shingles will be two newcomers with tremendous potential in transfer Ty Proffitt and freshman Corey Clemens. Proffitt is a 6-4 local product from London, Ky., who spent a year at Notre Dame before transferring to MSU.

"Ty adds a dimension to our team. He has great basketball and court awareness and can play the point or be a two-guard," Tyndall said.

Clemens, the freshman from New Castle, Ind., is also a combo guard who impressed Tyndall in fall workouts with the range of his shot and his toughness. The 6-2 Clemens averaged 19.2 points and 3.1 assists as a senior at New Castle Chrysler High.

Nashville, Tenn., native Demonte Harper is

penciled in as the starter at the shooting guard slot, but Harper is unselfish with the basketball and can play the role of set-up man or playmaker. The 6-4 junior was second in assists last season behind Shingles and was one of four Eagles to average double-digit scoring with 10.6 points per game.

"Demonte is coming off a great sophomore season and he worked hard and built his body up during the summer. I believe he is a legitimate All-OVC candidate," Tyndall said.

Terrance Hill, a 6-1 Columbus, Ga., native made an impression on Tyndall during the off-season with his work ethic and has carved out playing time behind Harper.

"Terrance may have made the biggest jump and is one of our most improved players, Tyndall said. "He's more mature and will earn minutes in our rotation."

Newcomers Aaron Williams and Rashad Hosea both add depth in the guard position. Williams, a 5-10 redshirt freshman played at duPont Manual High School in Louisville, Ky. Hosea is a redshirt sophomore from Detroit, Mich., where he played at Cody High School.

Also earning playing time at two-guard will be

junior John Lamb. A 6-1 Indianola, Iowa, native, Lamb can be a sharpshooter when needed.

"John is a great shooter and experienced player who gives us quality depth. He can be very effective for us against zone defenses," Tyndall said.

Top-notch shooters are key to Tyndall's offensive plan and one of MSU's best shooters will start at small forward. OVC Preseason All-Conference selection Maze Stallworth, an Elizabethtown, Ky., native, led the Eagles in perimeter shooting with 38 percent accuracy last year. The 6-4 senior set team 3-point records, draining 87 shots from long range to averaged 12.1 points per game.

"Maze is a three-year starter and will be a 1,000-point scorer at Morehead State. In my opinion he is the best shooter in the OVC," Tyndall said.

Lawrenceville, Ga., native Sam Goodman is the Eagles most impressive newcomer because of his work ethic and receptiveness to coaching, according to Tyndall. Listed as a guard because of his 6-2 size, Goodman's athletic ability will allow him to play small forward behind Stallworth.

Sophomore forward Steve Peterson hit one of the biggest shots in MSU history when his jumper from the wing with 1.6 seconds left in double overtime lifted the Eagles into the NCAA Tournament. A 6-5 native of Columbus, Ga., Tyndall has Peterson playing both forward positions and compares his offseason to that of his high school teammate Hill.

"Like Hill, Steve has made a tremendous jump. He's gotten a lot stronger and is a very versatile player," Tyndall said.

Senior forward Les Simmons returns to the team after sitting out the 2008-09 season. A 6-7 talented forward from Mountainville, N.Y., Simmons has the potential to have a strong senior campaign.

"We hope Les can continue to show maturity and growth. If he does, he can be a solid player for us," Tyndall said.

David Terrell, a 6-5 transfer from Midland Community College is arguably Morehead State's most talented newcomer. Tyndall notes that the forward from Houston, Texas, may have the opportunity to impact the team once his conditioning improves.

Another newcomer who may impact the team once he gets into shape is freshman Jamel Marshall. A native of Orlando, Fla., Marshall originally signed with Florida International before a change in coaching resulted in an opportunity for Marshall to join Tyndall's team at Morehead. A 6-5 forward/center, Marshall gives MSU added



strength and depth along the front line.

Speaking of front line impact players, perhaps no player's impact was felt more last season than Faried. The Preseason OVC Player of the Year is the nation's returning leading rebounder. He averaged 13.9 points and 13.0 rebounds per game. Faried has garnered national attention as a center, including earning the distinction as a potential NBA Prospect.

"Kenneth is one of the Top 20 centers in college basketball and the leading returning rebounder. With his improved strength and weight he is a viable OVC Player of the Year candidate," Tyndall said.

International newcomer Jason Beharie, a 6-9 freshman from London, England, will also contribute at the five slot. Tyndall calls him a skilled center who will be a nice OVC player as his strength and conditioning improves. He also noted that Beharie has transitioned well to the more physical American game.

Morehead State will face a tough test to open the season when they head just one hour west to face Kentucky in Rupp Arena in what will be John Calapari's first regular season game as coach of the Wildcats. That game will be broadcast on ESPNU.

"Playing at UK is huge for us for in-state recruiting. We get the chance to play in legendary Rupp Arena and face a Top Five team on national television," Tyndall said.

Other non-conference games include facing Utah State, Cal State-Fullerton, and Weber State at the Utah State Tournament and a home schedule that includes Kent State, ETSU and Louisiana-Monroe.

"The rest of our non-conference slate features some great mid-major programs," Tyndall said. "This is the best home schedule since I've been coach here."

Once OVC play starts on Dec. 3, the Eagles don't waste much time before playing at the other preseason #1, Murray State on Dec. 5.

"Murray will be one of the teams to beat with what they return and the success they've had," Tyndall said. "Austin Peay could win it again and I believe Eastern Illinois will be the surprise team this year."

Tyndall believes there are four or five teams with a legitimate chance to win the league title, including Morehead State.

"This is the deepest and most balanced the league has been since I've been here," Tyndall said.

A deep league will make defending the OVC title difficult, but with one championship ring, Tyndall's expectations and goals for his team are high and include a return trip in year four.

 February 19-20, 2010

The eighth annual BracketBusters event, a two-day men's college basketball extravaganza pitting potential NCAA Tournament hopefuls against each other Feb. 19-20, will feature 11 nationally televised games - on either ESPN2 or ESPNU - selected from a pool of 98 teams.

For the fifth straight year, ESPNU, the 24-hour college sports network, will televise five BracketBusters games while ESPN2 will televise six contests. The 11 BracketBusters matchups will be announced Feb. 1, while game time and network assignments will be announced Feb. 8.

BracketBusters, named because of the success of the teams in NCAA Tournament play, will provide the 22 televised teams an opportunity to play other top non-conference opponents three weeks before Selection Sunday. The 76 teams not selected for BracketBusters will compete against each other through the same two days.

The 98-team field will feature 12 teams from the Mid-American and Colonial Athletic; 11 from the Ohio Valley, 10 from the Missouri Valley, Horizon League and Metro Atlantic Athletic; nine from the Western Athletic and Big West; four from the Big South and Southern; three from the America East; two from the MEAC; and one from the Big Sky and Summit League.

As part of the agreement, all 11 of the BracketBusters home teams, as well as the remaining 38 home squads, will play a "return" game at the home facility of their opponent in November or December of the 2011-12 season.

The Ohio Valley Conference

Entering its 62nd year, the Ohio Valley Conference continues to build on the success that has made it the nation's eighth-oldest NCAA Division I conference. For only the second time in a decade, the Conference expanded by adding Southern Illinois University Edwardsville as the league's 11th member in 2008. The move expanded the OVC's geographical footprint to the St. Louis market and marked the first change in membership since expanding to the state of Alabama (Jacksonville State, Samford) in 2003.

The 2009-10 school year saw a change in leadership as Beth DeBauche was named the seventh full-time Commissioner in league history on July 28. She is currently one of just five females to be the head of a Division I conference, and one of just eight to lead a Division I conference all-time. The last three commissioners of the OVC have moved onto jobs as the commissioner of the Big Ten, Big 12 and the Mid-American Conferences.

The OVC's proud past dates back to 1948, but seeds for the new league were actually planted in 1941. It was then that Roy Stewart, the athletics director at Murray State, Charles (Turkey) Hughes, the athletics director at Eastern Kentucky, and Kelly Thompson, the public relations director at Western Kentucky, first broached the idea of forming a new conference. Discussions were put on hold by World War II, but reemerged Feb. 27-28, 1948 at the Kentucky Hotel in Louisville as the three original institutions combined with Morehead State, Louisville and Evansville to form the OVC.

In the 1950s, the OVC became a pioneer on a much more significant scale socially. During times of racial segregation, league member Morehead State became one of the first non-traditionally black mid-southern institutions to accept a black student. In 1958, Marshall Banks earned athletically-related aid at Morehead, which signed a second black athlete, Howard Murphy, a year later. In 1961, Murphy earned all-conference recognition as a halfback in football. With racial barriers broken, the rest of the institutions in the league began to provide educational and athletic opportunities to African-Americans.

In 1955, the OVC became only the second six-member league nationally to earn an automatic bid to the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Tournament, which, at that time, was limited to only 24 participants. The Conference quickly proved worthy of that bid, as Morehead State defeated Marshall (107-92) and Wayne State (95-84) in the 1956 tournament.

Fifteen years later, former OVC member Western Kentucky became the first and only Conference team to reach the Final Four. The Hilltoppers defeated Jacksonville, Kentucky and Ohio State before losing to Villanova in double overtime. WKU went on to finish in third place after beating Kansas 77-75 in the consolation game.

Since that time, the OVC has recorded some of the biggest upsets in the history of the NCAA Tournament. Perhaps the most famous moment came in 1987, when Austin Peay came from fourth place in the regular season to win the OVC Tournament and earn the league's automatic bid. The Governors drew powerful Illinois, and were such big underdogs, that ESPN broadcaster Dick Vitale promised to stand on his head if APSU won the game. After a 68-67 victory over the Illini, and a narrow 90-87 overtime loss to eventual Final Four participant Providence in the second round, Vitale made good on his promise in a visit to Clarksville two months later.

Murray State added to the OVC's string of upsets in 1988 when it knocked off 14th-ranked North Carolina State, 78-75. The Racers' M&M Boys - Jeff Martin and Don Mann - combined for 39 points in the win.

After former member Middle Tennessee State won a first round game in 1989, the league had a drought as no other OVC team won a NCAA Tournament game for the next 19 years. But Morehead State, coming off a thrilling double overtime OVC Tournament victory over Austin Peay, topped Alabama State 58-43 in the Opening Round game at Flyer Arena in Dayton, Ohio. The game was played in front of an Opening Round record crowd of 11,346; that crowd included many MSU fans who made the three hour drive from Morehead for the game. The Eagles season would come to three days later when they lost to No. 1 overall seed Louisville, despite playing the Cardinals close for a majority of the game.

Through its 61 years, 12 teams have won or shared the league's regular season men's basketball title. Murray State heads the list with a Conference-record 20 outright or shared basketball crowns. Other past champions include former member Western Kentucky (19), Morehead State (9), Austin Peay (8), Eastern Kentucky (6), Tennessee Tech (5), former member Middle Tennessee (5), Tennessee State (2), former member East Tennessee State (2), Southeast Missouri State (1), UT Martin (who won its first in 2008-09) and former member Akron (1).

The OVC also has the honor of being the only conference to boast the nation's leaders in scoring, rebounding and assists all in one season. That feat was accomplished in 1991-92 by Morehead State's Brett Roberts (28.1 ppg), Murray State's Popeye Jones (14.4 rpg) and Tennessee Tech's Van Usher (8.8 apg).

The playing field is not the only place where OVC athletes are working hard. The league also recognizes excellence in the classroom. Six Scholar-Athlete Awards are presented yearly to male and female athletes, while others are commended for their academic success by being Medal of Honor recipients or earning a spot on the Commissioner's Honor Roll. Additionally, the league annually presents one institutional Academic Achievement Award, as well as separate team awards in each Conference-sponsored sport. Since the College Sports Information Directors of American (CoSIDA) Academic All-America program began, the Ohio Valley Conference has had 179 student-athletes honored with the award, including 25 over the last three years (2006-07 to the present).

The OVC annually presents the Steve Hamilton Sportsmanship Award, in honor of the former Morehead State student-athlete, coach and athletics director, to a junior or senior student-athlete with significant athletic contributions who best exemplifies the characteristics of sportsmanship and citizenship. Most recently, the Conference has also implemented the OVC Institutional and Team Sportsmanship Awards, which are presented to one institution and 18 sport-specific teams voted by their peers to have best exhibited the standards of sportsmanship and ethical conduct as outlined by the OVC and NCAA.

The Ohio Valley Conference sponsors the following sports: baseball, basketball, cross country, football, golf, tennis and track for men, and basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, tennis, track and volleyball for women. In addition, the OVC also sponsors the combined men's and women's sport of rifle.

Now in its seventh decade of competition, the

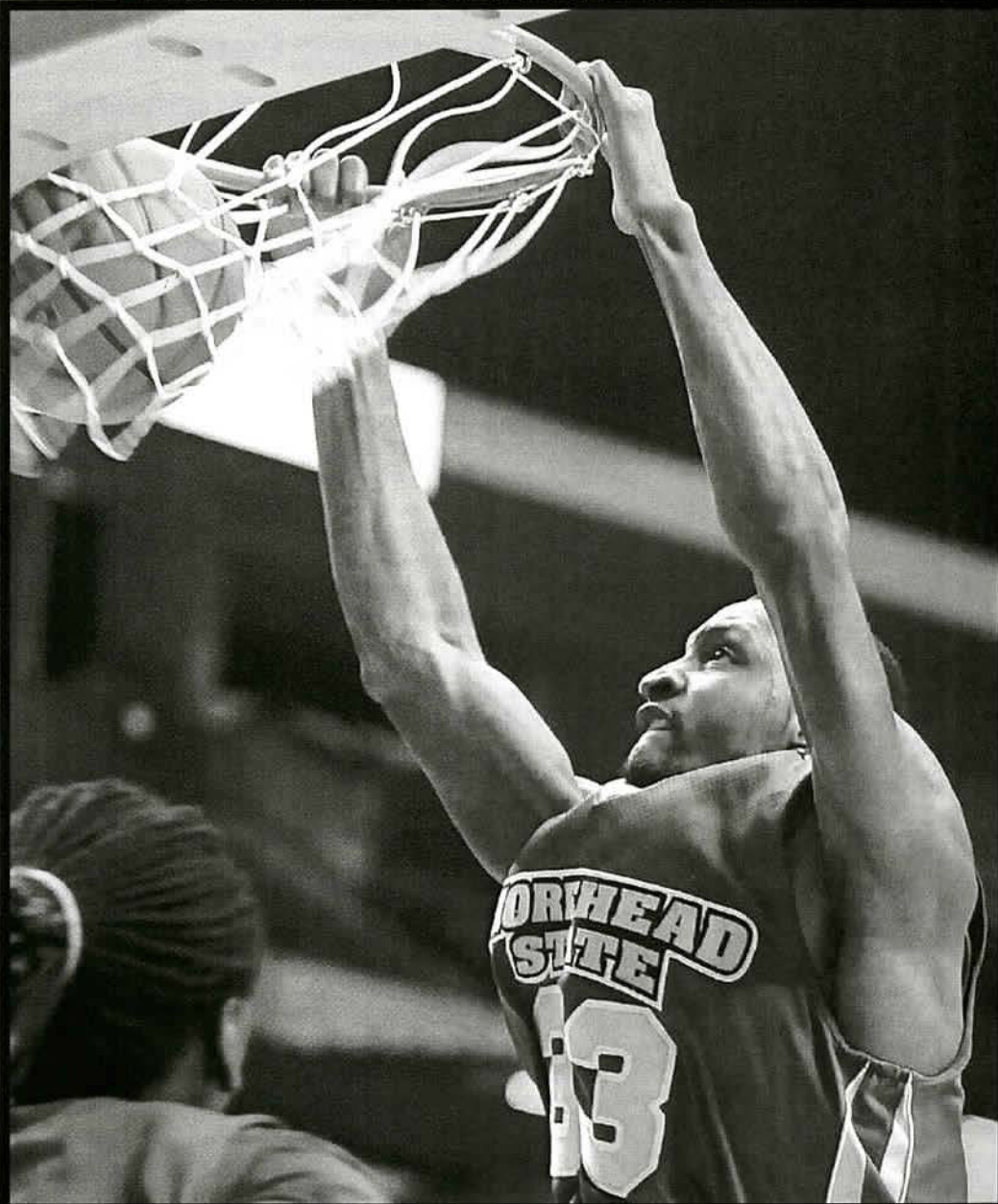
