





A Frank And Open Statement The Republican Voters of Rowan Co

TO MY FRIENDS WHO ARE INTEREST-ED IN THE WELFARE OF ROWAN

During the past few weeks, I had intended to see you and to talk over with you the coming election, in the interest of my candidacy for re-nomination and re-election to the office of COUNTY JUDGE. However, due to the number of roads and bridges that have been washed out, I decided that it was more important to the welfare of the County that I make whatever effort I could to see that the repair of these roads and bridges be done as quickly as possible to make them passable, even at the sacrifice of my personal interests and my campaign. TAXES HAVE BEEN HELD DOWN

To begin with, ever since I assumed the duties of County Judge, I have made a yearly trip to Frankfort to appear before the State Tax Commission to prevent their raising the taxes of Rowan county property. Each year I have, taken a number of the leading citizens of the county, and succeeded, except for one year of that time, in preventing this blanket raise, that would have worked a hardship on every property owner in the county. Thus, I feel that I am entitled to claim credit for saving the tax payers thousands of dollars in State Taxes which they would otherwise have been required to pay.

OLD DEBTS HAVE BEEN PAID OFF

Since I became Judge of Rowan County, we have paid off in indebtedness over \$18,000.00, bills that had been made by previous administrations and which fell to my administration to pay. We have

paid these bills, and have kept the county expenses paid up, so that NOW I am able to tell you that, as of January 1, 1940 this county was PAID UP on its current bills with no outstanding hills contracted by my Administration. Through my efforts and those of the civic minded citizens, we prevented the lectrance of a huge Refunding Bond, which would have cost the citizens of the county thousands of dollars which we are now in a position to save.

The new Jail which is a credit to any county was completed during my administration. Most of it was paid for by us.

ROADS AND BRIDGES

We have put the Rowan County house in order, we have made Rowan County Vouchers worth their face value we have paid bills, and in the next four years we will be in a position to do the road work that is needed in all secions of the county.

I ask that the voters of Rowan County to consider these things. I ask them to look over the record books and study the work that has been done and the money that has been paid out and saved through my efforts.
