## PRESS INFORMATION

**PRESS PASSES** — Passes for the working press should be requested at least two weeks in advance from the Sports Information Director. Press personnel attending as guests are entitled to general admission seats outside the press row area.

**BROADCAST** — Permission for broadcast rights must be secured from the Sports Information Director. Line installations are ordered by individual stations through their local telephone companies. Each station is assigned two (2) seats.

**PRESS ROW SEATING** — Wetherby Gymnasium press row is restricted to accredited writers, radio-television broadcasters, scouts and other designated officials. Only cameramen and photographers are permitted on the sidelines and their activities must not interfere with play. Seating is assigned by the Sports Information Director. MSU supplies a play-by-play account at the end of each half. First half and final statistics also are provided. Telephones and refreshments are available. In addition, a Xerox Telecopier is on duty at each game.

**SCOUTING PASSES** — Passes for scouts should be requested at least a week in advance from the Sports Information Director. One seat is allocated to each organization requesting credentials. Additional seating will be granted if available. Passes must be claimed in person at the main ticket windows.

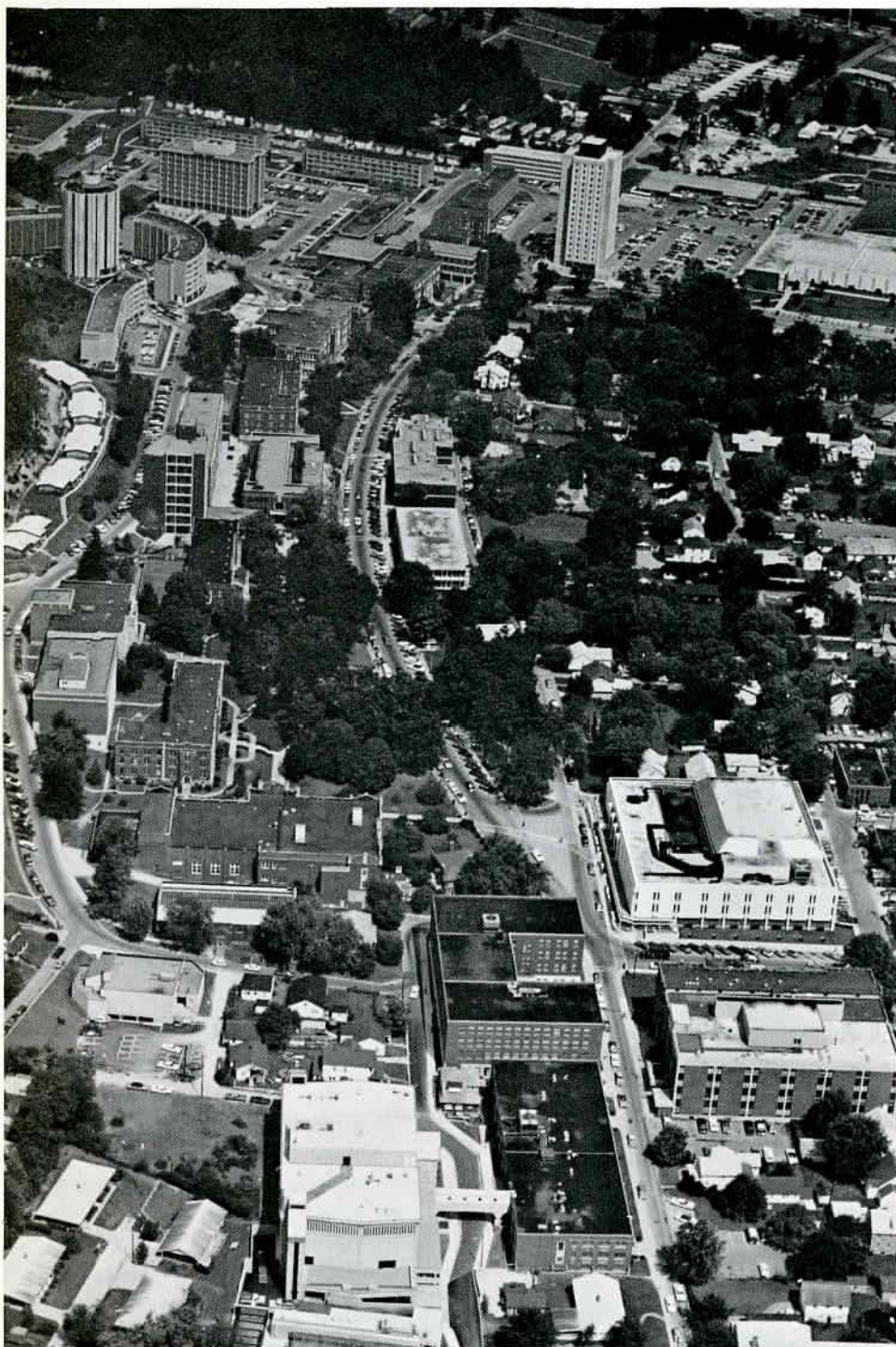

# THE UNIVERSITY



Since its founding in 1922 as a state-assisted institution, Morehead State University has developed through the years to stand as a dynamic, multi-purpose university situated on a beautiful 500-acre campus where the Bluegrass meets Appalachia in the foothills of the Daniel Boone National Forest.

Under the farsighted and energetic leadership of Dr. Adron Doran, the school's seventh chief executive, Morehead State University has grown from a tiny state college to an expanding regional university reaching out to serve Kentucky and the nation. From 698 students at the time of Dr. Doran's

inauguration in 1954, the enrollment has increased nearly 1,000 per cent to more than 6,500.

Physically, the University consists of more than 50 major structures on the campus proper with a total value of more than \$70 million. Additionally, a 212-acre experimental farm is being developed near Morehead in rural Rowan County. Almost all of the major construction has occurred since Dr. Doran became president. Work was completed last summer on the \$3.8 million Appalachian Technical Institute, a five-story classroom, office and parking structure which will dominate the western edge of the campus.

Academically, the University is fully accredited and is composed of six schools—Applied Sciences and Technology, Business and Economics, Education, Humanities, Sciences and Mathematics and Social Sciences—and a graduate division. Degrees are offered on the graduate, undergraduate and associate levels and additional credit may be earned beyond the master's degree. The faculty numbers more than 350 and more than 15,000 persons are MSU alumni.

Administratively, the University operates under a 10-member Board of Regents with eight members appointed by the governor of Kentucky. The two other seats are held by elected faculty and student representatives. The administrative structure consists of five bureaus—academic affairs, fiscal affairs, research and development, student affairs and university affairs. Each is headed by a vice president.

Athletically, the University is a member in good standing of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) and is a charter member of the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC). The University sponsors intercollegiate competition in 10 sports—football, basketball, cross country, soccer, wrestling, swimming, baseball, golf, track and tennis. In addition, students may participate in almost 30 intramural activities. The University's athletic facilities include a 10,000-seat stadium with an eight-lane, quarter-mile oval track, a 5,000-seat gymnasium, a nine-hole golf course, an indoor swimming pool, eight all-weather tennis courts, a baseball park and a lighted soccer field. A six-mile cross country course is located at the University farm.



# THE ADMINISTRATION

Morehead State University President Adron Doran, the dean of Kentucky college presidents, is a graduate of three institutions of higher learning and all have recognized him as a "Distinguished Alumnus".

Freed-Hardeman College bestowed the honor this spring, following Murray State University, where he earned his bachelor's and master's degrees, and the University of Kentucky, site of his doctoral study.

But honors are not new to the seventh president of MSU and the man who has served it longer than any other—now well into his 20th year. It was the spring of 1971 when Dr. Doran, a native of Graves County, Ky., joined a select group of about 200 Americans chosen as recipients of Horatio Alger Awards. He became the fourth Kentuckian so honored and the only educator of that year.

Horatio Alger Awards are sponsored by the American Schools and Colleges Association, a non-profit corporation committed to education and American traditions of equality of opportunity, industry and achievement. The awards were created to honor business and professional leaders, who, in the spirit of Horatio Alger, have overcome humble circumstances to attain unquestioned success.

Dr. Doran has risen from a two-room farmhouse in Western Kentucky to national prominence as a college administrator. He has led MSU to more than 30 precedents in dealing with ethnic minority groups and received the Lincoln Key of the Kentucky Education Association for "integration without fanfare."

From a tiny teachers college little known outside the state, MSU since has won recognition for its service to Eastern Kentucky, Appalachia, and the nation. Enrollment has increased almost 900 per cent since Dr. Doran's inauguration in 1954 and upwards of \$70 million has been expended in campus construction.

Before assuming the MSU presidency, this life-long public servant served Kentucky in the public schools as a coach, teacher and principal, in the Kentucky General Assembly as a four-term legislator and Speaker of the House

and as an administrator in the Kentucky Department of Education. In addition to his earned doctorate from UK, he also holds honorary doctorates from three other institutions.

The Kentucky Press Association named him "Kentuckian of the Year" in 1959 and Gov. Edward T. Breathitt selected him for the "Distinguished Kentuckian Award" in 1966.

But the success story of Dr. Doran has not been one of strictly personal achievement. His college sweetheart, the former Mignon McClain of Sedalia, Ky., has been his partner in life and education for more than 40 years.

A prominent Kentuckian in her own right, Mrs. Doran is a past president of the Kentucky Federation of Women's Clubs and was named the "Outstanding Woman of the Year" in 1972 by Cardinal Key national honor sorority. She received the first "University Special Service Award" from the MSU Alumni Association.

The First Lady is the founder and director of MSU's Personal Development Institute and is a member of the Board of Trustees of Pikeville College. Her biography is listed in "Who's Who of American Women" and "Outstanding Community Leaders of America."



### DR. GENE SCHOLES — Acting Athletic Director

Dr. Gene Scholes (pronounced SKOLES), an administrative assistant to MSU President Adron Doran, became acting athletic director on July 1 when Robert Laughlin retired.

The 31-year-old Scholes came to MSU in 1970 as director of institutional research. He was named to the president's staff a year later.

A former high school basketball and football coach in Michigan, he holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Eastern Michigan University and a doctorate from the University of Michigan.

The Detroit native was selected in 1972 for listing in "Outstanding Educators of America."

He is married and the father of three children.



### R. G. (RAY) MULLINS — Head Trainer

Ray Mullins, 25, a native of Hazard, came to MSU in 1970 to be head athletic trainer in all 10 sports. Previously, he had served four years as an assistant trainer at Tennessee Tech.

As a head trainer, he is responsible for the physical health of all MSU athletes. In addition to supervising pre-game and post-game training procedures, he also conducts various therapy programs for injured players.

He is a graduate of Tennessee Tech, has a master's degree from MSU and is a part-time faculty member. Mullins is married to the former Jane Smith of Byrdstown, Tenn.



### KEITH KAPPES — Director of Public Information

A former writer for daily newspapers and the AP, Kappes served as MSU's sports information director for more than four years. A native of neighboring Carter County, he is married to the former Janet Hobbs of Ogden, Utah. They have one child.

Kappes holds a bachelor's degree in journalism and a master's degree in higher education, both from MSU, and teaches part-time in journalism. He is a member of the American College Public Relations Association and the Ohio Valley Conference Television Committee. Kappes became MSU's director of public information in July, 1970.



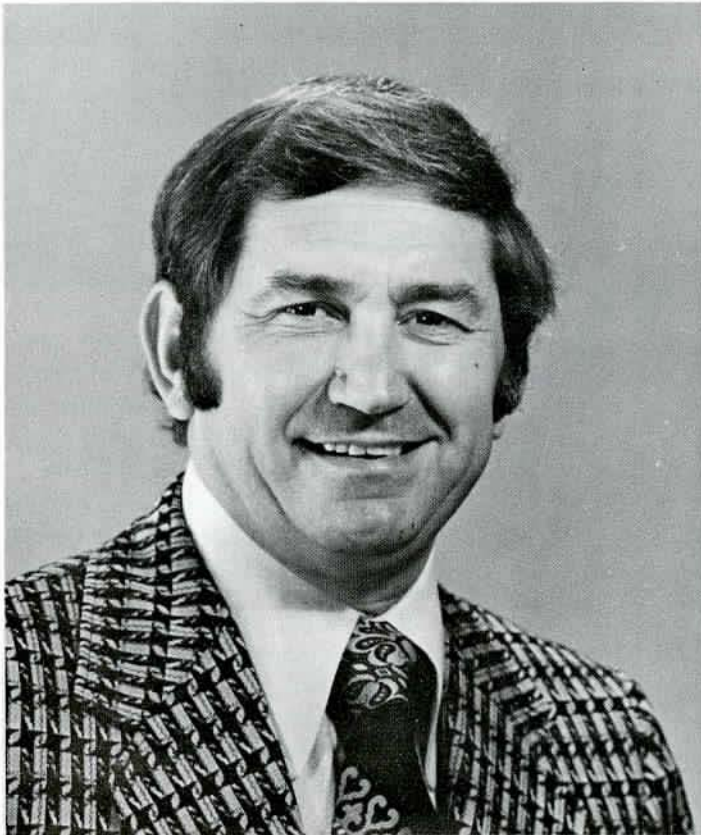
### FRED HENSLEY — Sports Information Director

Hensley is entering his first season as the Eagle SID. A two-time graduate of MSU, he has a bachelor's degree in radio-television and a master's in higher education.

He has been the "Voice of the Eagles" for the past three seasons and will continue to handle play-by-play this winter on the Bald Eagle Network.

A native of Huntington, W. Va., he is married to the former Mary Jane Reed of Russell. Hensley teaches part-time in radio-television and is a member of the College Sports Information Directors of America.





## BILL D. HARRELL

### Head Basketball Coach

When Bill Harrell became the sixth basketball coach in Morehead State University's history in 1969, he said he hoped after four seasons he would have a better than .500 record, win a conference championship and have the caliber players he wanted in the program.

As Harrell enters his fifth season, he has accomplished all three of these goals and looks to the future and new ambitions.

A 1952 graduate of Kentucky Wesleyan, Harrell has posted a 51-50 mark in four seasons at MSU and guided the Eagles to a share of the OVC title in 1971-72.

Entering his 18th season in coaching, the 45-year-old Pike County native has developed a reputation as an outstanding recruiter. Harrell has hand-picked the blend of rugged offensive performers and tough defensive players that the Eagles are pinning their OVC hopes on.

"People talk about a lot of things that it takes to be successful in college coaching," Harrell says. "But it all boils down to one essential. You must have players who can do the job." Pressure defense and fast breaks are the mainstays of Harrell's coaching philosophy and he finds quick, agile and good shooting personnel to carry out his orders.

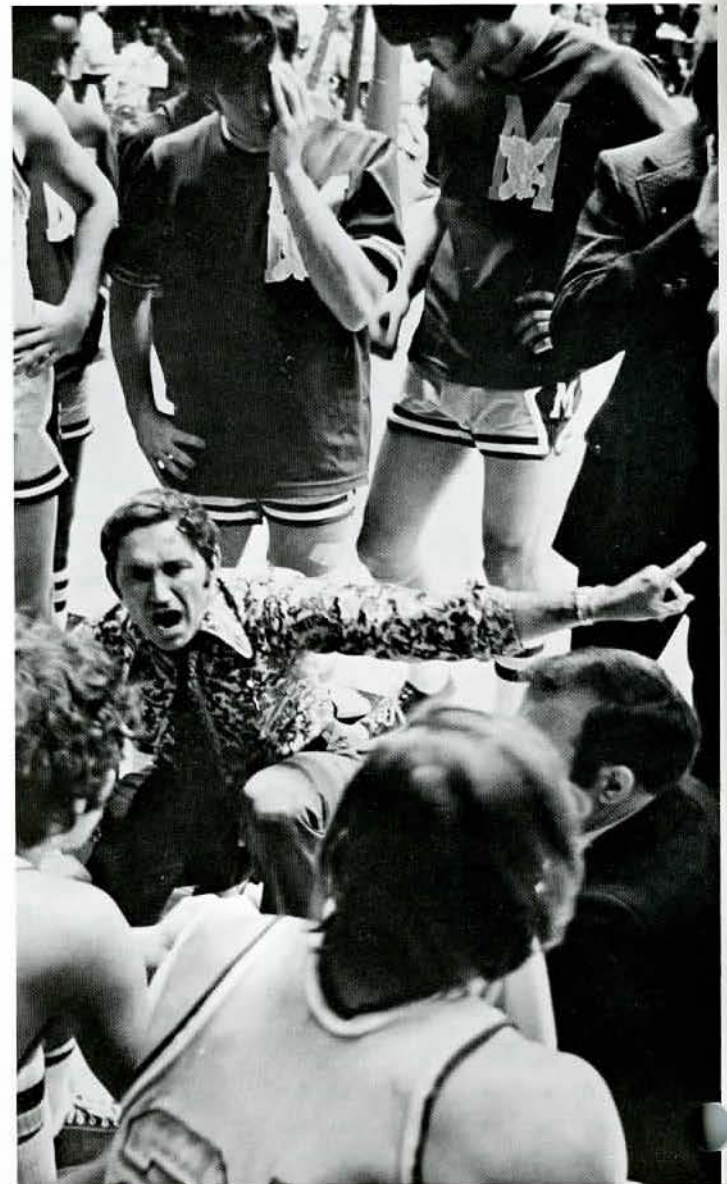
The two-time Kentucky "High School Coach of the Year" came to MSU after two years as an assistant at Nebraska. Earlier, he compiled a 244-82 record in 11 years as a high school coach at three Kentucky schools.

His Shelby County team won the Kentucky state championship in 1966 and he coached the U. S. All Stars in the Dapper Dan Classic at Pittsburgh the same year.

Harrell's coaching career began 21 years ago at Belfry High School in the mountains of Eastern Kentucky. He moved to Berea in 1954 and left coaching in 1956 to become the director of campus activities at the Methodist Home in Versailles. But his heart was still in basketball and he returned to coaching in 1960 at Shelby County.

Following his graduation from Kentucky Wesleyan, Harrell earned his master's degree from the University of Kentucky. He is the author of "Championship Tested Offensive and Defensive Basketball Strategy," published in 1967 by Prentice-Hall.

William David Harrell is married to the former Gloria Jean Seale of Ravenna. They have a 19-year-old daughter, Peggy Lynn, a sophomore cheerleader at MSU and a former "Miss Kentucky Teenager" and first runnerup in the "Miss Teenage America" pageant in 1972.





## **JACK BLACK** Assistant Coach

Jack Black's name and his accomplishments are high on the list whenever Head Coach Bill Harrell is asked to comment on the success of his basketball program at MSU.

Black, who came to Eagle Country shortly after Harrell, also has had a major role in the recruiting of topflight players to wear the Blue and Gold.

Black produced a 42-11 record in three seasons as MSU's frosh coach before turning his attentions full time to the varsity.

A native of Washington County, Ky., he came to MSU after five years at Frankfort High School where his teams compiled an 85-41 mark, including the school's first two conference championships and three district titles.

The 33-year-old coach, who is entering his fifth season at MSU, has degrees from Campbellsville and Morehead State. He is married to the former Louise Claywell of Campbellsville. They have a daughter, Janice Lynn, and a son, John Kevin.

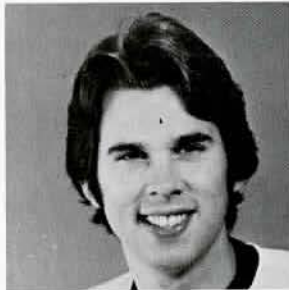


## **IKE UNSELD**

A former co-captain of the Eagles, Unsel returns to his alma mater as a graduate assistant coach this season.

He will aid the MSU staff by coaching the junior varsity and scouting future opponents. A three-letter winner at MSU, he is the younger brother of All-NBA center Wes Unsel of the Capital Bullets.

Unsel, who is pursuing a master's degree in education, is married to the former Teresa Herbert of Ft. Knox.



## **DOUG SWITZER**

Switzer, a graduate of Carroll College in Waukesha, Wisconsin, is serving as a graduate assistant at MSU this season.

He will serve as a co-coach of the MSU junior varsity. Switzer, a three-year performer at Carroll College, also participated in cross country. He served as a counselor at the Bob Cousy Basketball Camp for one summer.

He is pursuing a master's in physical education.



## **JOE STALLWORTH**

A member of the Eagles for the past two seasons, Stallworth suffered a knee injury prior to the beginning of the season and will help coach the Eagle junior varsity.

A former standout at Danville High School, Stallworth was a high school teammate of Leonard Coulter.





## 1973-74 BASKETBALL OUTLOOK MOREHEAD STATE UNIVERSITY

"It depends on how soon our young players mature and how our junior college players adapt to major college basketball."

That's how Morehead State University Head Basketball Coach Bill Harrell views the prospects for the 1973-74 season.

Harrell, entering his fifth season at MSU, will be depending on the addition of four big men to help the Eagles remain a contender in the rugged Ohio Valley Conference.

The Eagles have three junior college transfers and six new freshmen joining the six returning lettermen on the '73-74 squad.

"We will be a better defensive team and should be stronger rebounders than last year," said Harrell. "This is the best overall squad I've had at Morehead State."

The Eagles return three All-OVC performers from last season's 14-11 team which finished second in the conference. Senior Leonard Coulter, who averaged 21.3 points and 11.5 rebounds last season, returns to forward after playing the pivot much of last season. The 6-5 Danville product is expected to have "his greatest season," according to Harrell.

Eugene Lyons, MSU's most valuable player of last season, returns at a forward spot. The 6-5 senior averaged 16.9 points and 6.2 rebounds per game last year. All-OVC playmaker Howard Wallen will man one guard spot. The 6-2 senior led the Eagles in assists and free throw percentage last season and averaged 15.2 points per game.

But for the Eagles to contend for the OVC title, the young players must provide the support.

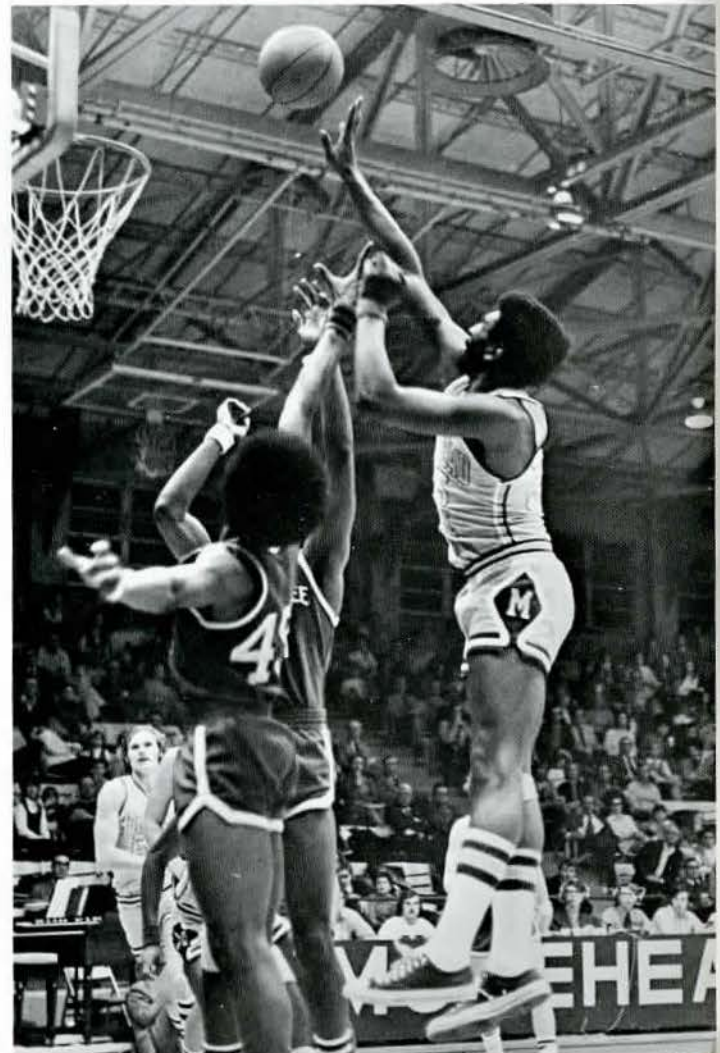
Junior college transfers Charles Frazier (6-8), John Farris (6-1) and George Williams (6-8) figure heavily in the Eagle plans. Freshmen Ron Frederick (6-8) and Ted Hundley (6-8) also will be counted on.

"We return two all-conference forwards to give us leadership and experience inside. But we do not have the experience we need in the middle and that's where the new people must develop," says Harrell.

In the backcourt, sophomore Glenn Turner (6-3), junior Gene Frye (6-6) and freshmen Stan Dixon (6-0) and Winfred Hughes (6-2), along with Farris, will share ballhandling duties with Wallen.

"With only one experienced guard returning, we will rely on young personnel. But I think we have capable talent on hand," said Harrell.

Returning lettermen Lowell Ashby (6-2), Arch Johnson (6-6) and James Washington (6-1) give the Eagles experience, leadership and a sound bench. "We have more depth than ever," the coach added. "We should be quicker and more aggressive on defense but we need to mature and gain experience."





# Leonard Coulter

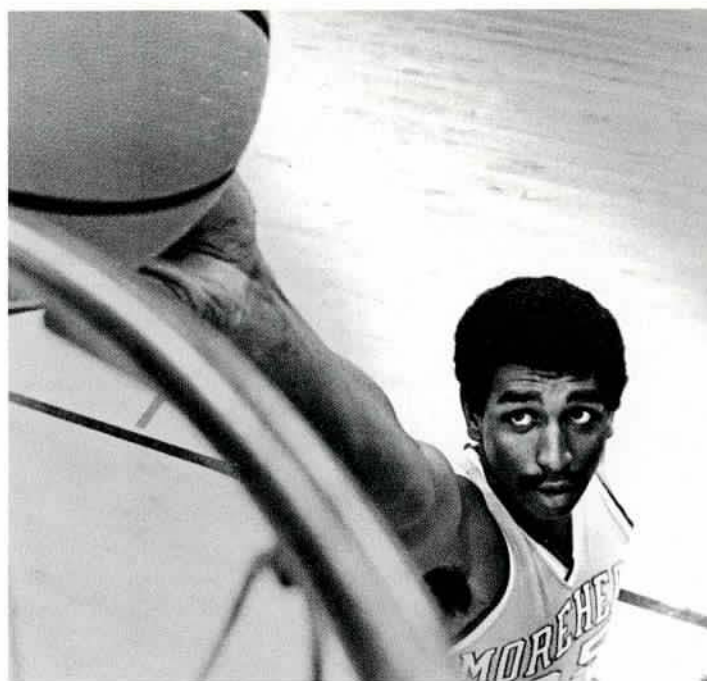
6-5, 210, Senior, Forward, Danville, Ky.

An All-OVC selection for two years, and an All-American pick in '71-72, Coulter is a complete player on both ends of the floor. The Danville High School product is exceptionally quick and very strong.

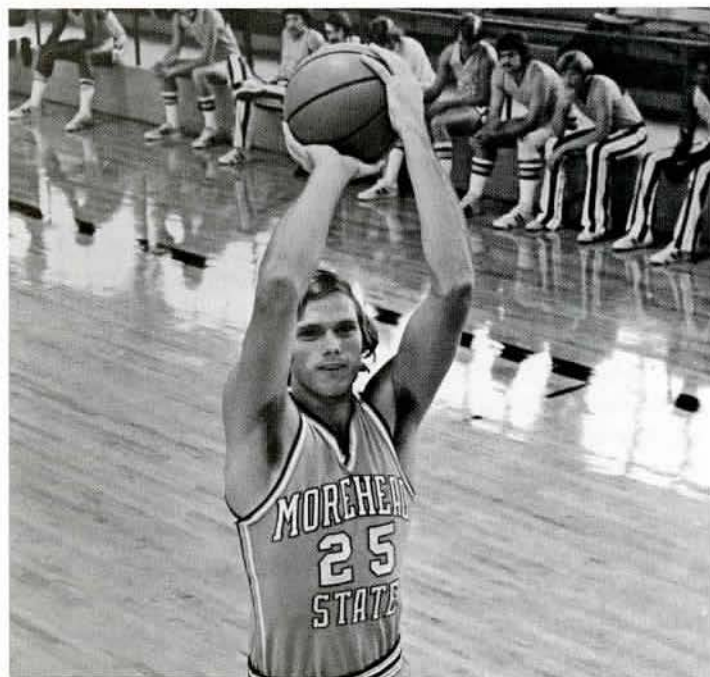
Truly a player that can do it all, he led the Eagles in scoring and rebounding both as a sophomore and junior. He is considered to be a top professional prospect if he can recover from a nagging back problem.

He is an excellent shooter and rugged rebounder. Following the injury to center Ron Nicholson last season, he played in the pivot the first half of the season. Coulter is expected to be a more all-around player with the addition of rebounding help.

He is the seventh all-time scorer in MSU history and is considered as one of the greatest to wear an Eagle uniform. A recreation major, Coulter is married to the former Jean Retter of Louisville.

6-5, 195, Senior, Forward, Pikeville, Ky.

A husky, dependable forward, Lyons was selected to the All-OVC team last season. A graduate of Johns Creek High School, he is threatening to become a member of MSU's 1,000-point club.

Selected as the Eagles' MVP last season, Lyons needs 172 points to become a member of the select group. Another player who can do it all, Lyons usually draws the best offensive opponent. He has exceptional quickness and is an outstanding shooter and rebounder.

One of the best players in the conference in taking the ball to the basket, he has a never say die attitude and is a 110 percent player.

A very coachable player, Lyons is a natural leader and likes to play aggressive run and shoot basketball. A physical education major, Lyons is married to the former Juanita Collins of Pikeville.

# Howard Wallen

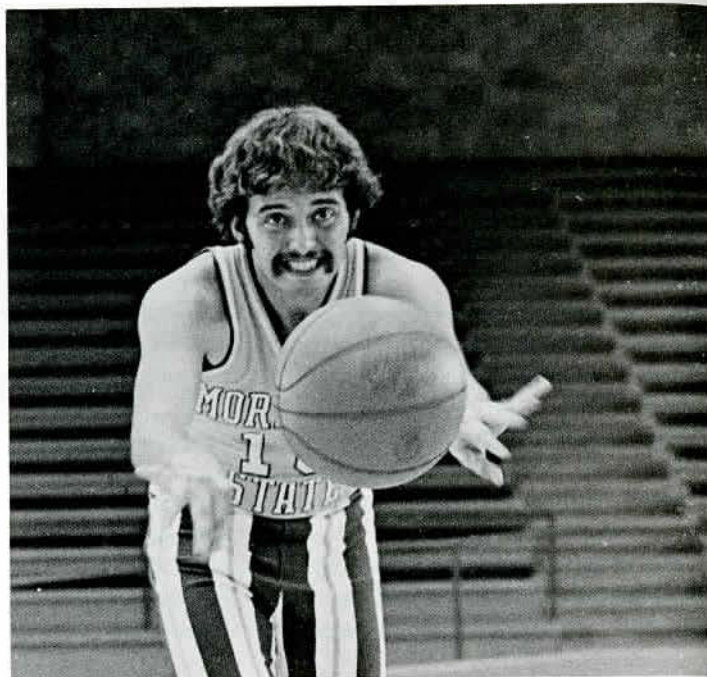
6-2, 178, Senior, Guard, Williamsport, Ky.

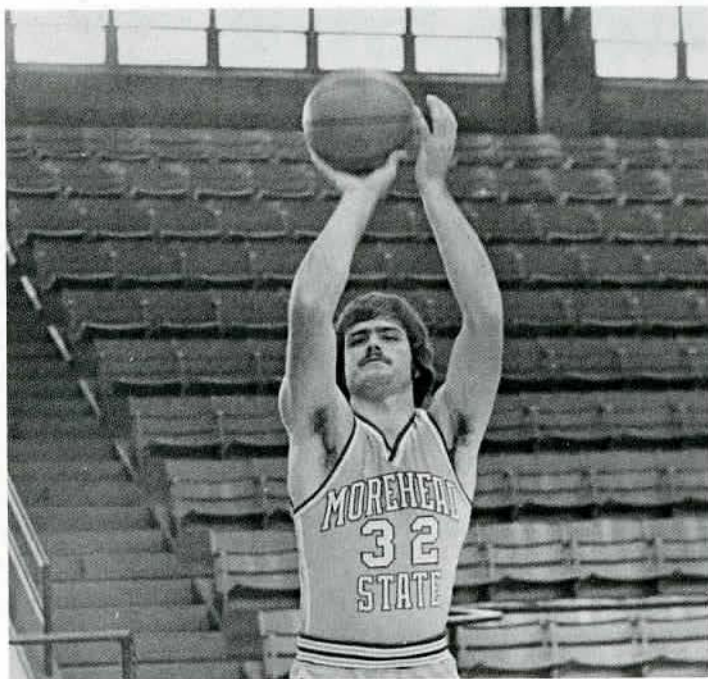
He has been responsible for nearly 1,400 points in his first two varsity seasons. An outstanding outside shooter, Wallen needs less than 200 points to enter the 1,000-point club.

A graduate of Johnson Central High School, Wallen is improved defensively and is an excellent ballhandler. The MSU coaching staff expects "Howdy" to have his greatest season.

Wallen is a threat to become a member of the All-OVC team again this season. The heady playmaker is majoring in physical education. He is married to the former Debbie Elkins of Meads.

6-2, 195, Senior, Forward, Shelbyville, Ky.

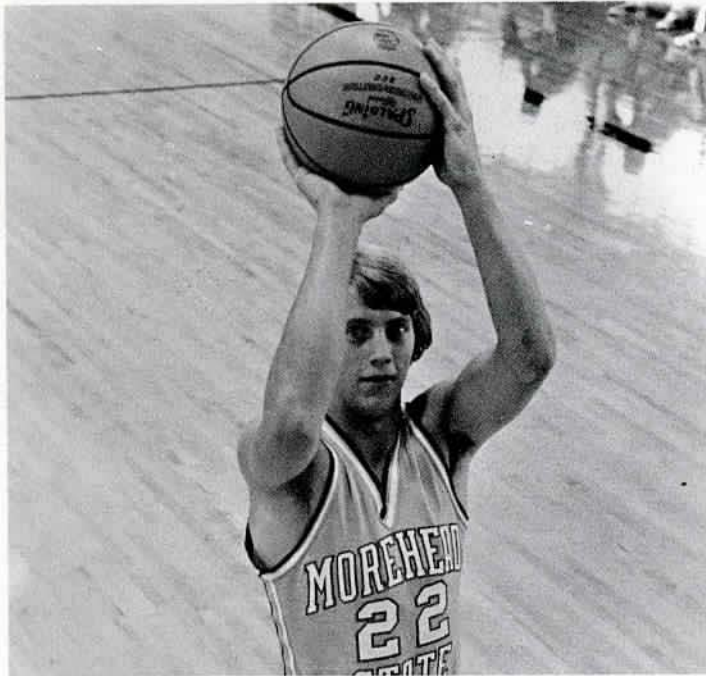
An outstanding leaper, Ashby engineered the Eagles' win over Tennessee Tech last year with his sparkling play coming off the bench. A former star at Shelby County High School, he gives the Eagles depth at the forward post.

A great hustler and a better than average defensive player, Ashby has earned the MSU "Basketball Academic Award" for the past two seasons. He has posted a 3.8 grade-point average through his junior year.

A good shooter and outstanding rebounder, Ashby is majoring in mathematics and computer science. He is married to the former Linda Connor of Simpsonville.

## Arch Johnson

6-6, 200, Junior, Forward-Guard, Booneville, Ky.

One of the Eagles' six returning lettermen, Johnson is expected to see heavy action this season. A first team all-state pick at Breathitt County High School in 1971, he is big enough to play forward and has the finesse to play guard.

He has improved his defensive play from last year and is considered one of the best at taking the ball to the basket. A good shooter from in close and from the backcourt, Johnson is expected to press for a starting guard position.

The Eagles' best free throw shooter last season, he suffered a broken foot midway in the season and never fully recovered. If the foot heals, Johnson could be headed for stardom.

He is a recreation major.

## Gene Frye

6-6, 195, Junior, Guard, Luray, Va.

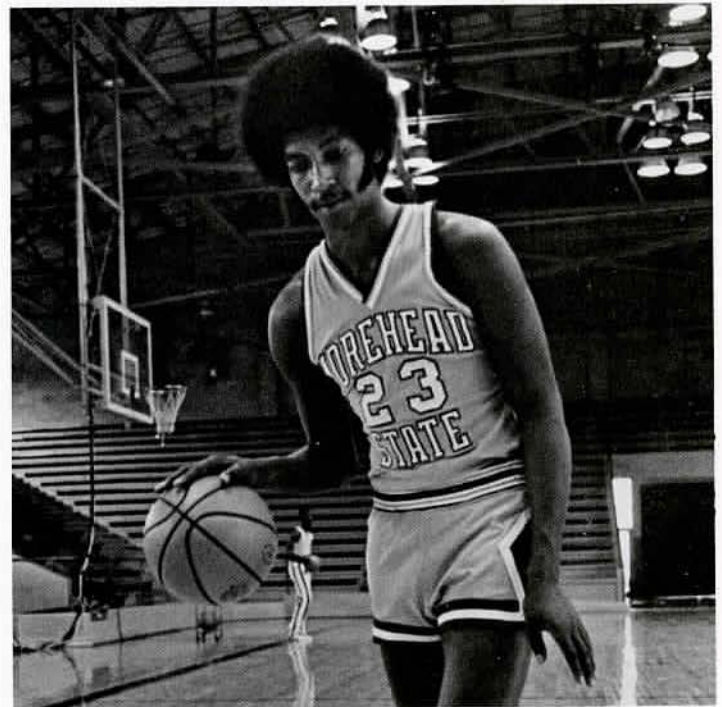
A former Virginia "Player of the Year," Frye gives the Eagles the enviable combination of a tall guard and a quick forward.

After using last season to adapt from high school to college play, Frye seems to be coming into his own. He is expected to be used almost exclusively at guard this season.

He has worked to improve his defense and had an excellent early season practice. Frye should see heavy action for the Eagles this winter and will press for a starting spot.

At 6-6, he represents a guard that can go to the basket and can fight inside for position and rebounds. A good shooter and ballhandler, he is one of the biggest guards in the OVC.

A former two-time all-state pick at Luray High School, he is majoring in recreation.

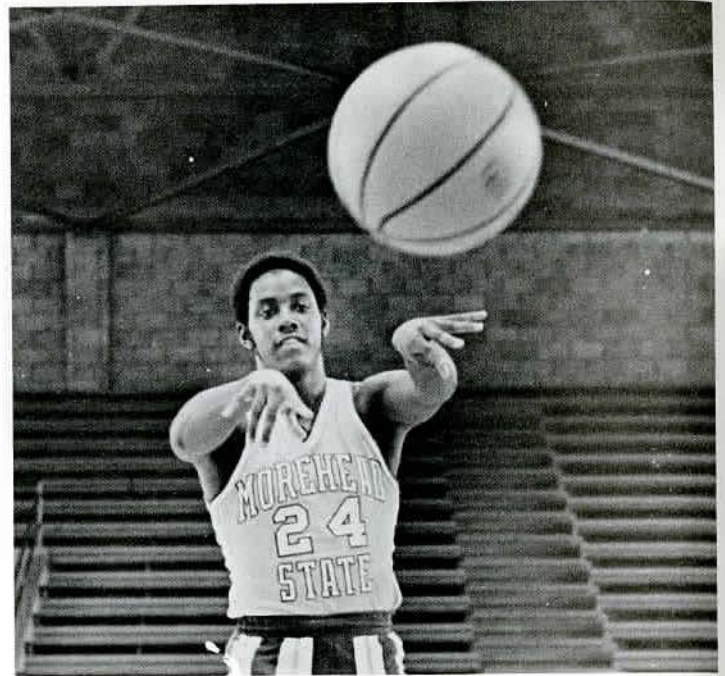

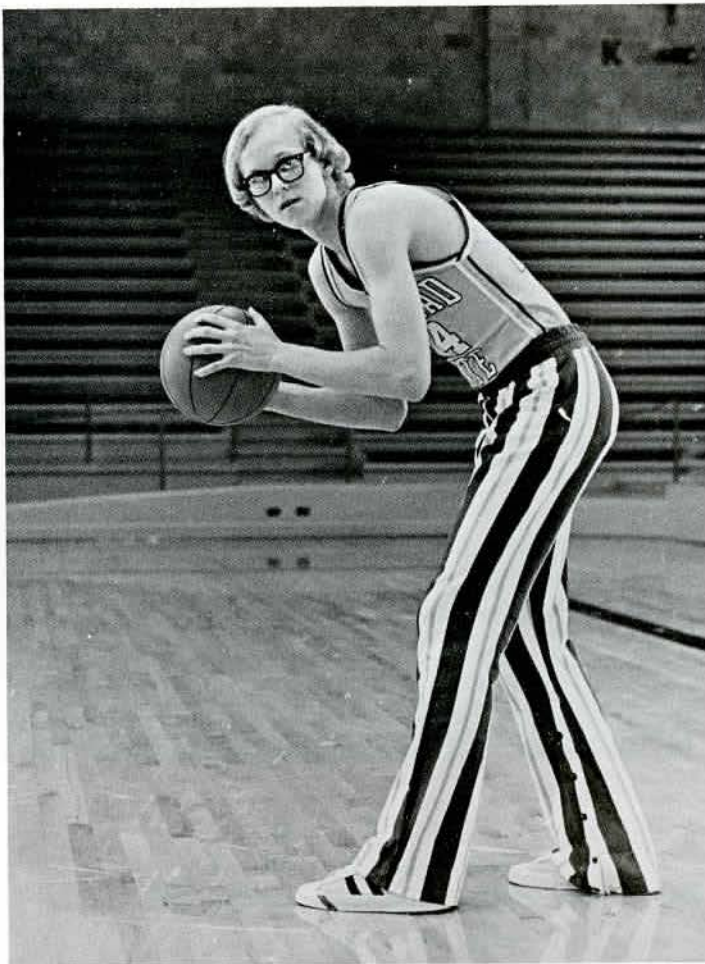

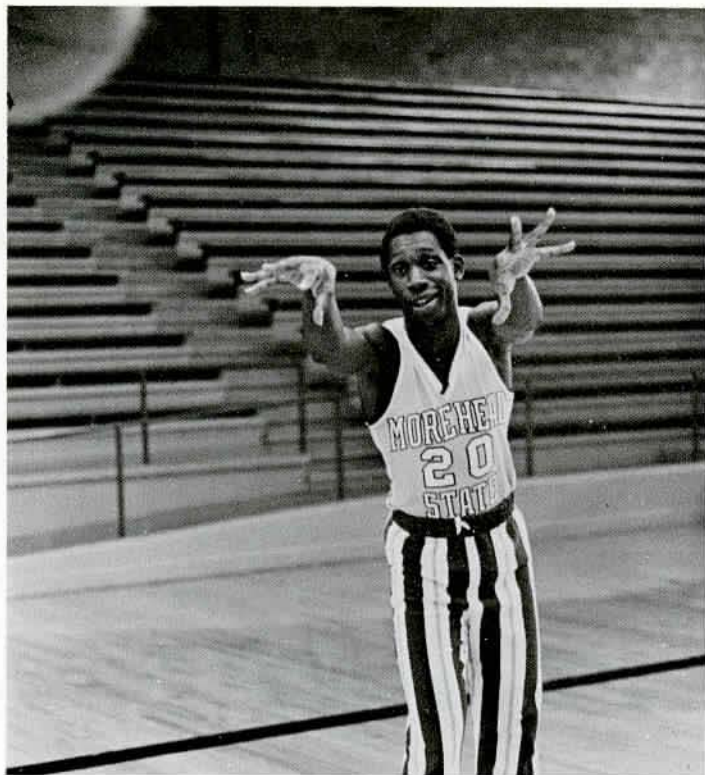

## Charles Frazier

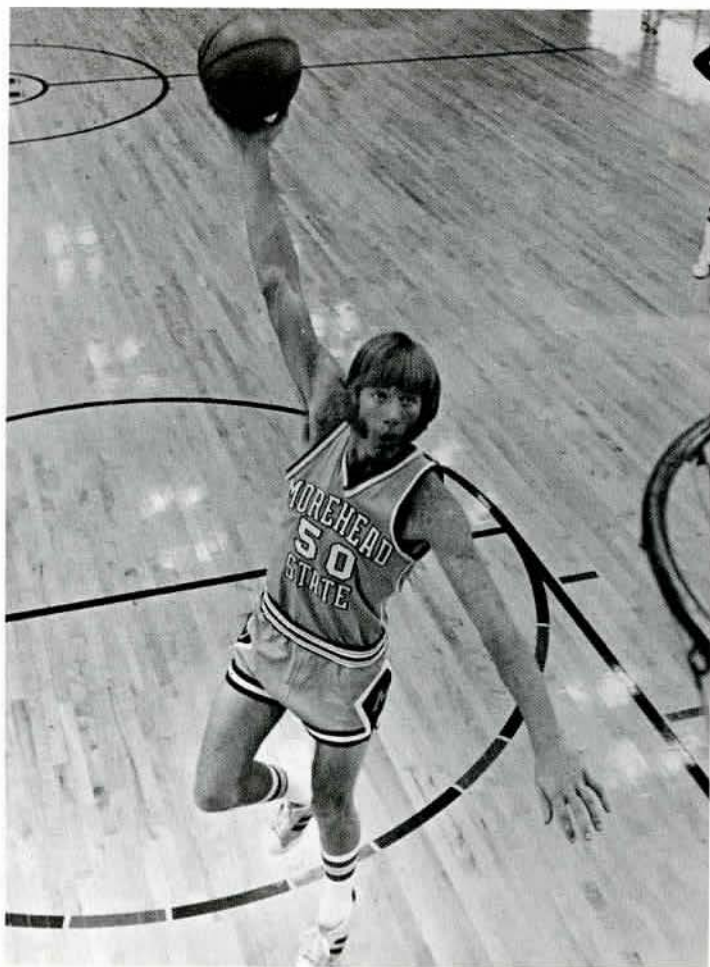
6-8, 200, Junior, Forward-Center, Cedar Knolls, N.J.

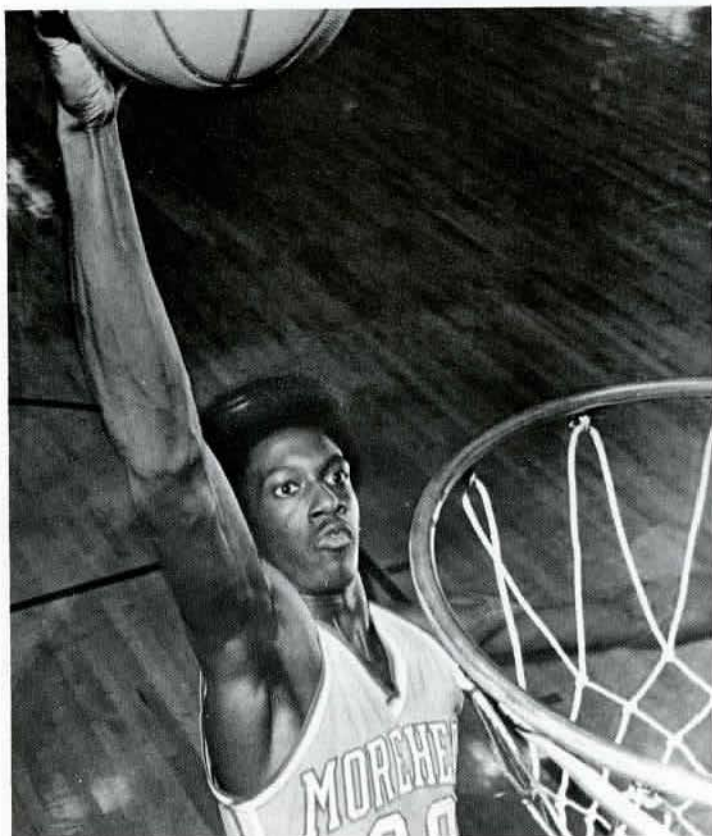
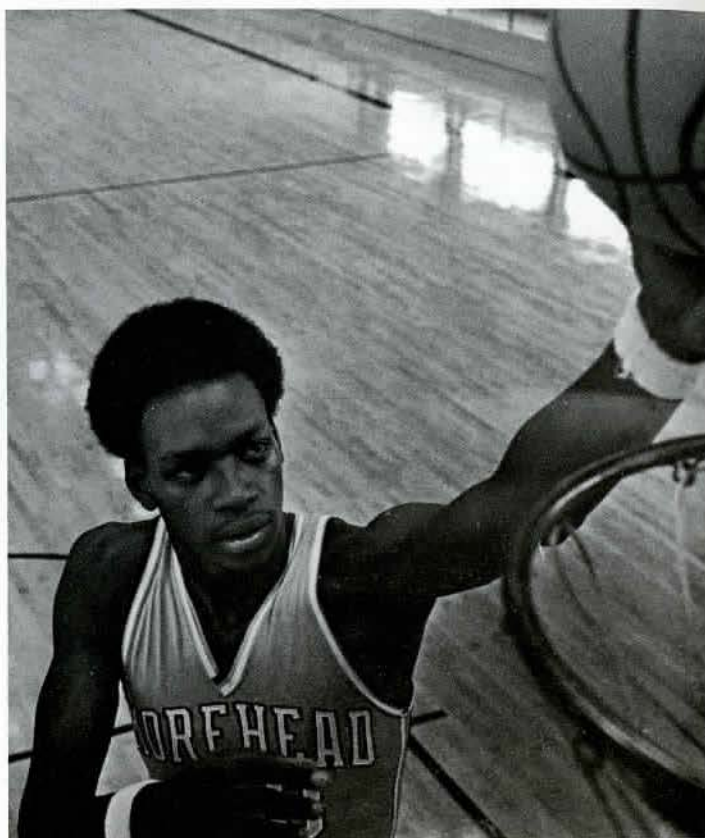

A first-rate rebounder, he is a good shooter and plays better than average defense. He is an outstanding leaper and is recognized as a shot blocker.

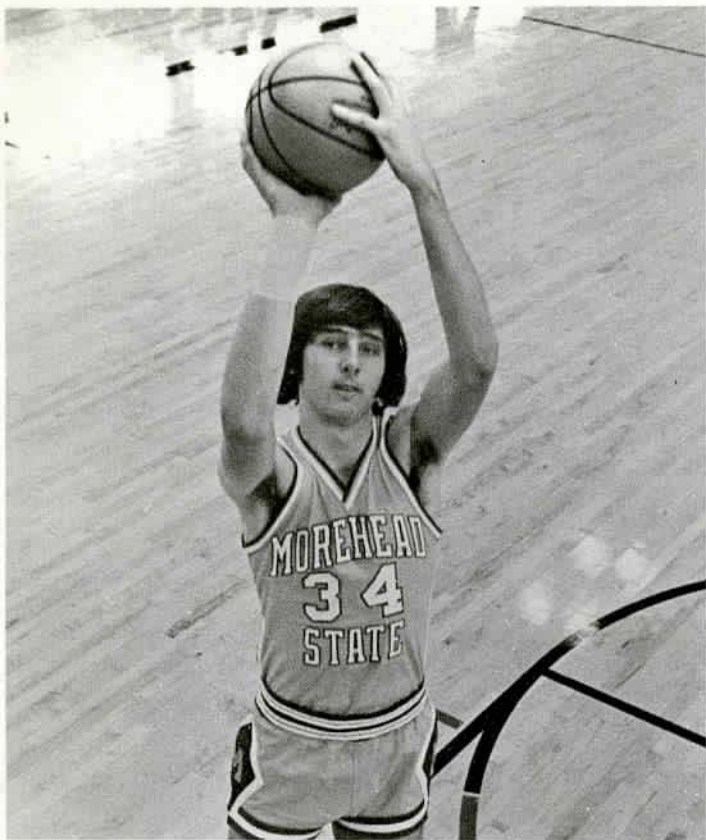

University of North Carolina at Charlotte Head Coach Bill Foster enters the 73-74 season with a somewhat cautiously optimistic outlook.

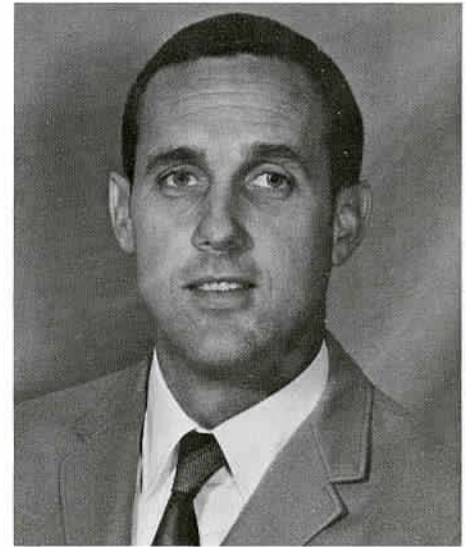
UNCC lost only one letterman from last year's 14-12 team, and returns the all-time leading 49er scorer and last year's top rebounders and scorers.

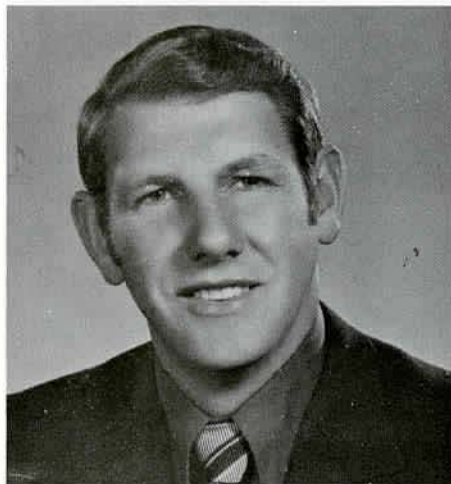

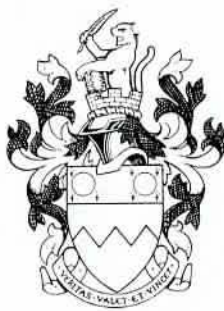

## OUTLOOK

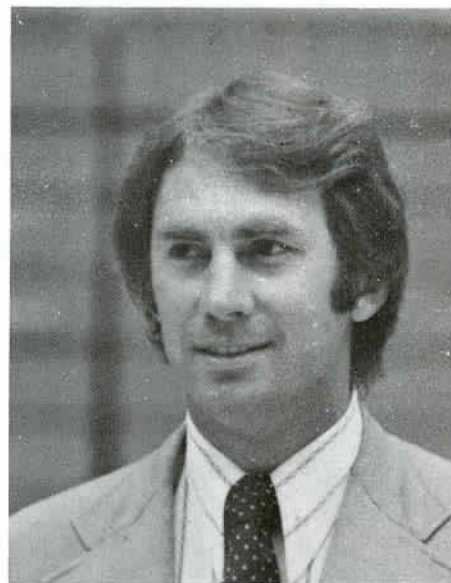
With four starters and six lettermen returning for the 73-74 season, Coach Jack Waters is understandably optimistic about the Red and Grey's chances this year. However, Waters is quick to point out that finding a replacement for Neil Purvis is going to be a formidable chore.

The 6-4 Purvis, perhaps the shortest center in college basketball last season, averaged in double figures in both scoring and rebounding with 12.0 and 11.5 marks respectively.

Heading the list of returnees is 6-5 Walker Atrice. Atrice was the leading scorer with 13.0 ppg last season. Also returning are Charles Newlin, 6-7 forward; Ernie Dix and Steve Webster, a pair of 6-1 forwards; Bill Faulhaber, Jackie Poag, and Al Thornton. Poag, who sat out last season due to scholastic ineligibility, was the leading scorer on the 71-72 squad with 19.5 ppg.

A trio of newcomers will be battling for the low post position. Redshirt David Donehoo at 6-8 and 220 pounds has the size while Jimmy Bryant and William Dodd have the scoring touch.

The major emphasis this season will be on defense. Primarily known as a defensive strategist, Waters watched his squad get stung to the tune of 75 points per game. Seven opponents actually scored over eighty. The goal for this year is to cut the defensive average at least ten points and hold all opponents to under eighty points.



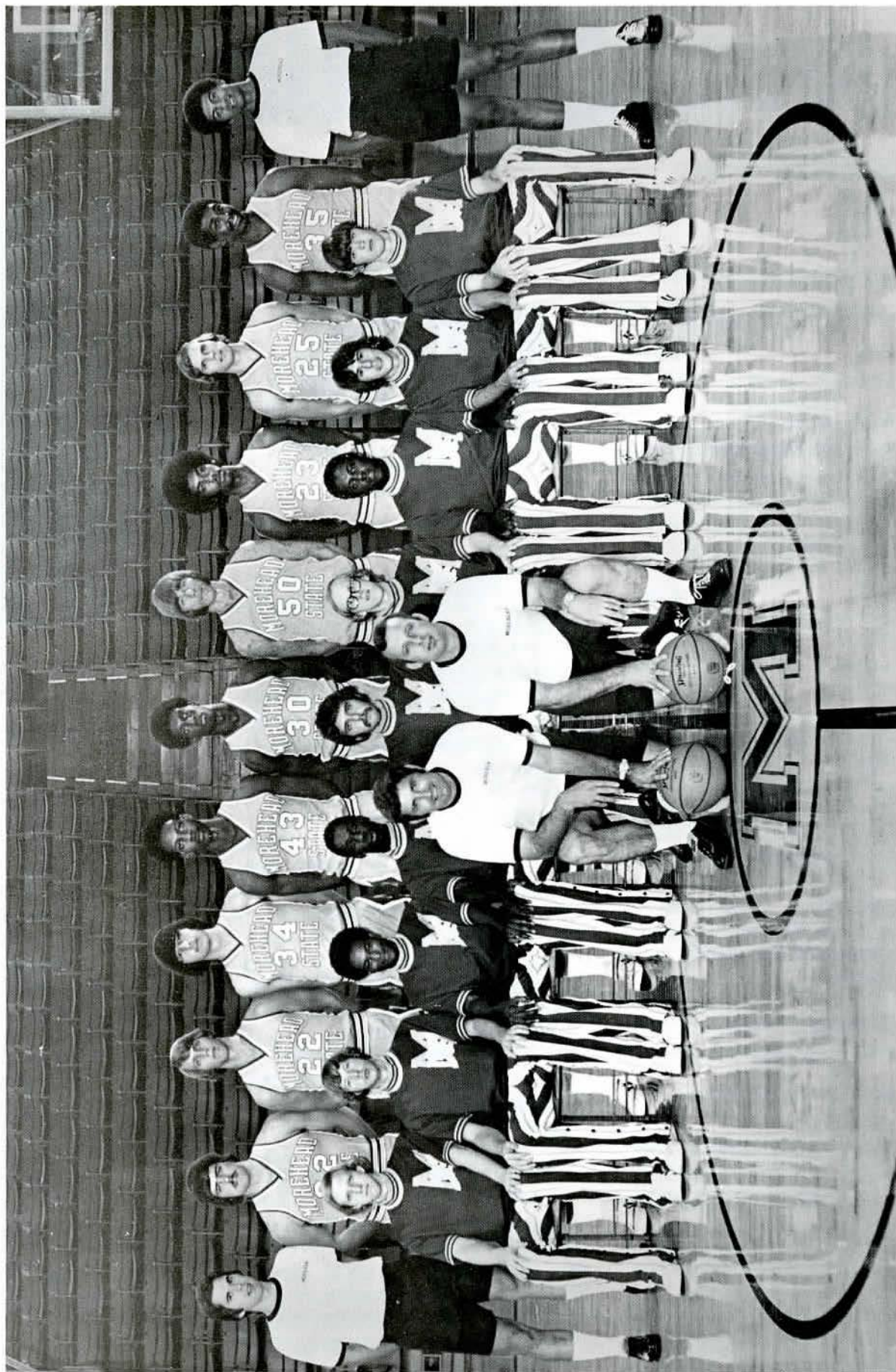

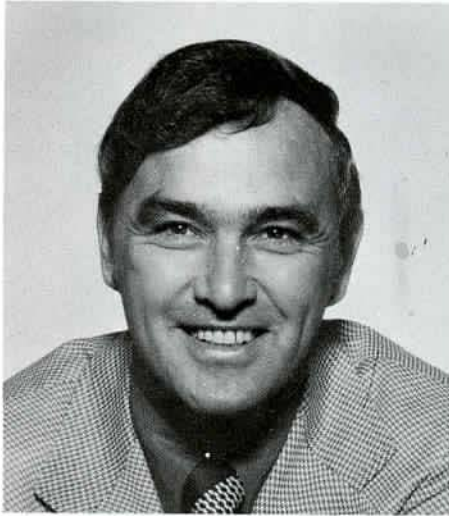

Barney Banks, a 6-4 junior guard, is Tech's lone double figure scorer (11.6) returning from last year's 18-8 club. He is also the only starter although 5-11 guard Bobby Wyatt was a part-time regular near the end of the year and he brings a 6.9 average into his senior campaign.

Also, 6-6 soph forward James Collins should have a good shot at a starting role after averaging 25.6 points per game for the freshman team last year.

## OUTLOOK

Austin Peay State University will defend its Ohio Valley Conference championship with three starters returning, including James "Fly" Williams, the nation's fifth leading scorer.

Despite the return of Williams and two other starters, guard Danny Odums and center-forward Percy Howard, the Governor coaching staff is not overly optimistic concerning future success. On paper, Kelly concedes, the team will probably be among the smallest in the country.

The man termed by Kelly as the "keystone" to any success this season will also apparently be missing from the Governor line-up. Howard Jackson, a rugged 6-7 senior forward who was the leading rebounder the last two years, was injured in a freak accident when he fell 71 feet while working at a construction site during the summer. Jackson injured both of his legs severely and is lost to the team for the season.

Sophomore guard Danny Odums averaged slightly over 10 points per game and led the team in assists. Percy Howard, a 6-4 pogo-leg center, averaged nearly 12 points per game and eight rebounds a contest.

Holdover reserves from the championship team include seniors Robert Turner (6-1), Kemp Hampton (6-5) and Richard Jimmerson (6-5). Jimmerson, a hometown product, will be moved into the pivot with Howard transferred to a forward spot.

Although Coach Cal Luther will have to find a replacement for super star Les Taylor, he'll have his other four starters of last year back for another season at Murray State.

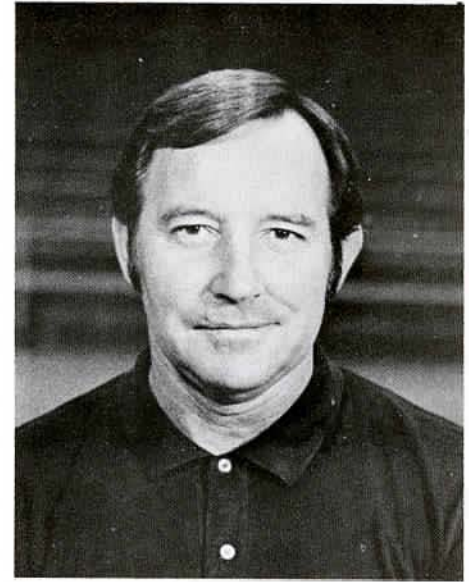

## OUTLOOK

The top five scorers from last season's team, which posted a 12-13 record, are back for another year. ## OUTLOOK

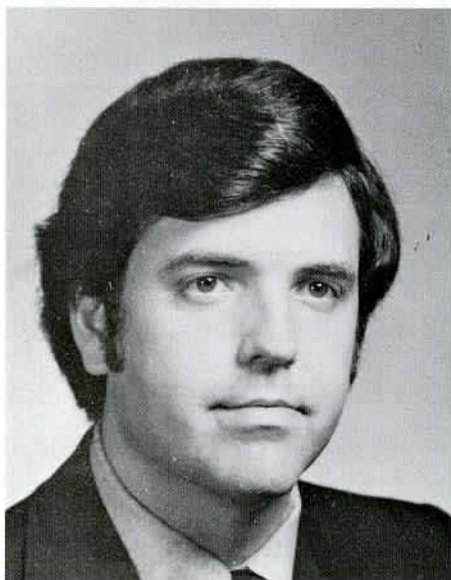

## OUTLOOK

A healthy Henry White, a more experienced Ron Mitchell and four junior college transfers should give East Tennessee better scoring potential and greater board strength this season.

The Buccaneers, who led the OVC in defense last season, should be strong in that department again this season.

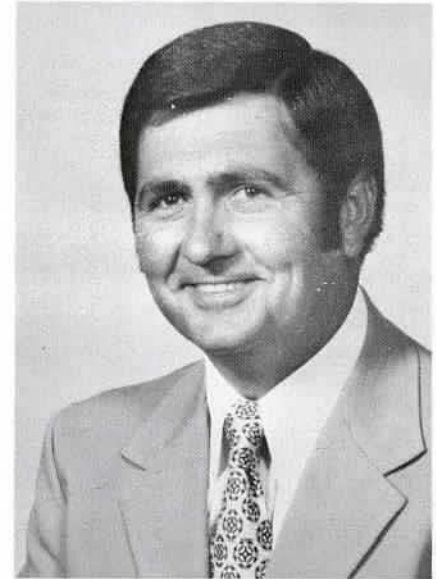
**OUTLOOK**

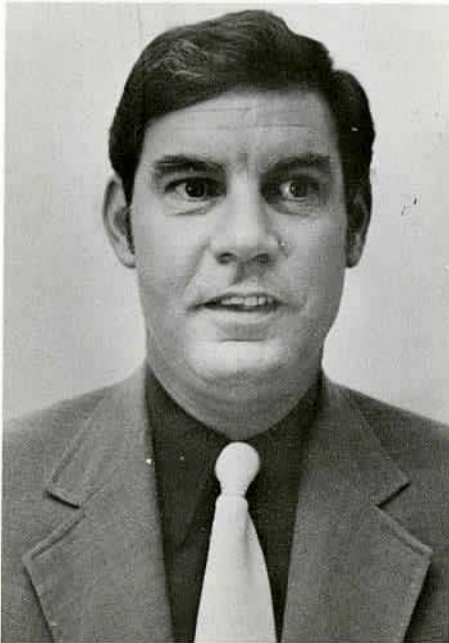

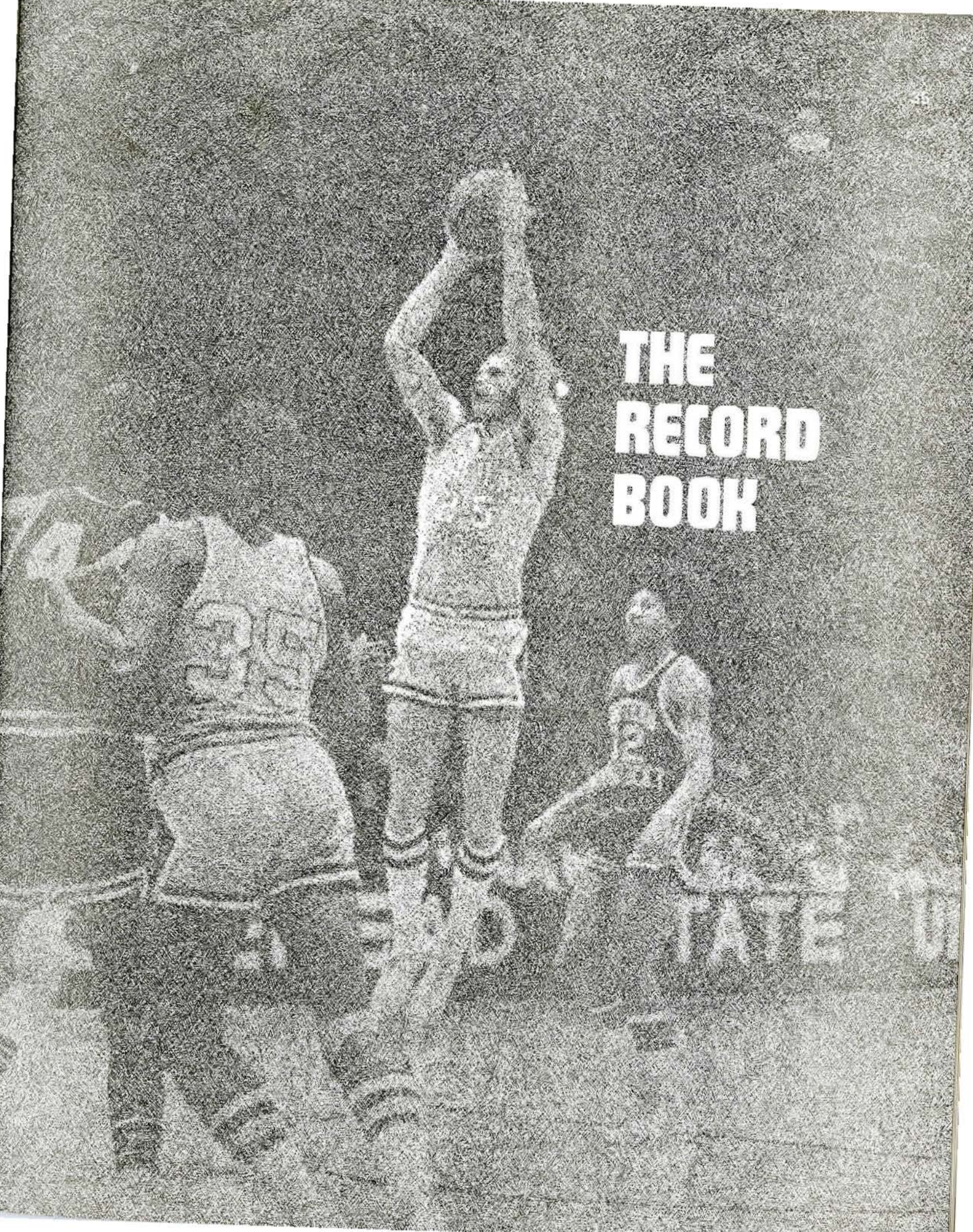

In 1948 five schools — Morehead State, Western Kentucky, Eastern Kentucky, Murray State, and Louisville — withdrew from the Kentucky Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (KIAC) and were joined by Evansville in forming the original membership of the Ohio Valley Conference. They were joined shortly thereafter by Tennessee Tech and Marshall.

The membership has changed over the years. Middle Tennessee joined the league in 1952, East Tennessee in 1957 and Austin Peay in 1962. Louisville became an independent in 1949 and Marshall and Evansville departed in 1952.

In 1955 the National Collegiate Athletic Association formerly recognized the OVC as a major basketball conference, giving the league's champion an automatic bid to the post-season NCAA Tournament. At the time, the OVC was only the second six-team conference to obtain major status from the NCAA.

For many years the OVC has been represented in the nation's top holiday and post-season basketball tournaments. The league has also won recognition for its football program, having had representatives in such post-season classics for college division teams as the Refrigerator Bowl, the Tangerine Bowl and the Grantland Rice Bowl.

OVC champions have also been prominent in national minor sports tournaments in recent years, evidencing the strength of its programs in baseball, track, golf, tennis and cross country.

Arthur L. Guepe, former head football coach at Virginia and Vanderbilt, became the OVC's first full-time commissioner in 1963. The conference maintains offices in Nashville.
