Morehead State University will conduct the monthly test of its audible alert system on Monday, Feb. 2, beginning at 12:30 p.m.

The system consists of three speakers that use an alert tone as well as voice messages to warn the campus during an emergency.

The high powered amplifiers, located on Ginger and Cartmell halls along with Jayne Stadium, are designed primarily to alert pedestrians on campus sidewalks and streets.

Faculty, staff and students also can be notified by signing up for Eagle Alerts (e2Campus).

TMMK honored for \$100K gift

A \$100,000 donation from Toyota Motor Manufacturing, Kentucky to Morehead State University is helping make MSU's 21st Century Center for Manufacturing Systems a reality. The center is the first of its kind in the region and will allow students in the Applied Engineering and Technology Department access to hands-on learning opportunities with industry-leading technology.

The initiative tackles head-on the critical issue of workforce development in Kentucky and the nation. This new center will help prepare the next generation of highly skilled workers.

"Toyota is proud to support MSU in developing young people in the critical fields of science, technology, engineering and mathematics," said Rick Hesterberg, Toyota Motor Engineering and Manufacturing, North America. "The auto industry faces a shortage of skilled workers coming out of college. It is these well-trained students we need to work with robotics and other cutting-edge technologies in our Georgetown plant and throughout the company."

Dr. Ahmad Zargari, AET Department's professor and chair is excited about the opportunities this facility will provide MSU students.

"The Center will enhance our potential to teach state of the art technologies, conduct applied research and aid technology transfer to industries that will ultimately attract more high-tech employers to the Eastern Kentucky region".

AET faculty members are experts in their fields and stay current by conducting scholarly research and continually engaging with industry in our area. The department also offers opportunities for undergraduate and graduate students to participate in research projects, internships and other experiential learning that will give students the knowledge and practical skills to pursue high-tech careers after graduation.

Last fall, the MSU Foundation and MSU's Department of Applied Engineering and Technology accepted a challenge grant from the James Graham Brown Foundation of Louisville to develop a state-of-the-art 21st Century Center for Manufacturing Systems. Thanks to the James Graham Brown Foundation's \$497,000 matching grant and generous contributions from various donors, including the major gift from Toyota, this project will soon become reality.

“Morehead State University is committed to expanding and modernizing its programming and facilities to meet the needs of a changing economy and job market,” said Dr. Wayne Andrews, MSU president. “We sincerely appreciate the support of Toyota Motor Manufacturing, Kentucky.”

Toyota’s donation was recognized during the Jan. 31 basketball game.

The MSUCorps AmeriCorps program and its partners are gearing up for its fifth annual Morehead Build-A-Bed Project to provide beds to children who are living in homes with not enough beds or none at all.

The goal is to give beds to children PK-12, who are forced to sleep on floors, couches, or in beds with multiple other children or family members. This project has provided nearly 400 beds to children in Eastern Kentucky since it began in 2010. A committee has set this year's goal to build 160 beds.

Each child receives a brand new bed and mattress along with a bedtime bag containing sheets, pillow, blanket, stuffed animal, book, alarm clock or nightlight and a hygiene kit.

The beds will be built on Saturday, April 25, at the Carl Perkins Center. Recipients are expected to pick up their beds on the day of the build.

The project is currently accepting applications from Bath, Bourbon, Boyd, Bracken, Breathitt, Carter, Clark, Elliott, Fleming, Floyd, Greenup, Harrison, Johnson, Knott, Lawrence, Lee, Letcher, Lewis, Magoffin, Martin, Mason, Menifee, Montgomery, Morgan, Nicholas, Pike, Powell, Robertson, Rowan, and Wolfe counties.

MSU inclement weather plan

Morehead State University has developed a plan for announcing emergency delays and cancellations. These are most often associated with inclement weather and unpredictable weather patterns occurring in the winter months.

The University will select one of two options when dealing with delays that may affect the daily schedule of students, faculty, staff and/or visitors to the main campus. When road conditions are problematic, MSU employees and students should exercise good judgment in traveling to and from campus. Those concerned that weather conditions make it too dangerous for travel to campus should follow pre-determined procedures regarding class attendance and work assignments.

Plan A: MSU is closed. All administrative offices will be closed and classes will not meet.

Plan B: MSU will operate on a two-hour delay. Offices will open at 10 a.m. Students begin the day with the 10:20 a.m. class.

Essential service personnel will continue to report at regularly scheduled time when either plan is in operation. Each division will identify essential personnel and services to be maintained. Employees should direct questions/concerns to their immediate supervisor.

Decisions regarding regional campus closings and classes held at off campus sites will be made on an individual basis as appropriate for the service area and situations in the region.

The University uses e2Campus/Omnalert to notify the campus community of safety, weather and other emergencies by text message and email. Alerts also are delivered by email to all MSU students and employees, as well as through the MSU website (www.moreheadstate.edu), Facebook page (www.facebook.com/MoreheadStateUniversity), and Twitter (@moreheadstate).

The two-day event will instruct, encourage and invite participants to reach and achieve their goals and aspirations as activists in support of their fight against privilege and heterosexism, violence against women, police brutality, voter suppression and other political, social and educational movements.

Welcoming remarks by Ricardo Nazario-Colon, MSU's student activities, inclusion and leadership (SAIL) director, will be held Friday, Feb. 20, from 8-9:30 a.m. Three breakout sessions will be held along with a multicultural career panel.

Keynote speakers will be: Airickca Gordon-Taylor, executive director of the Mamie Till Mobley Memorial Foundation, and Jasmine Rand, attorney.

Gordon-Taylor will be the afternoon speaker (3:30-4:30 p.m.). She is a cousin to Emmett Louis Till and his mother, Mamie Till Mobley. She spent much of her childhood in the home with Mamie that she was often referred to as the grandchild Mamie never had and was embraced by her resilient legacy in subsequent years. Shortly after the passing of Mamie Till Mobley in 2003, Gordon-Taylor revived the Emmett Till Players. She travels the country as a human rights activist speaking at various schools,

universities, churches, conferences, and community rallies; most recently traveling as a guest to Seoul Korea as a representative of the U.S. attending the World Alliance of Religion Peace Summit.

Gordon-Taylor has been a featured guest on numerous TV and radio programs and a featured panelist for Socialism Conferences 2012 and 2014, Rainbow PUSH Hip-Hop Summit 2013 and awarded the 2014 Black Mother's with Son's Award by the Pocono Mountains Film Festival. She honors the inheritance of her legacy and continues the foundation's mantra of Remembering the Past and Educating the Future.

In the evening, there will be a screening of the movie "Dear White People" and Rand will close the event with her speech at 7:30 p.m.

Rand is probably best known as the attorney of the Trayvon Martin family and from her countless appearances in the media concerning this case. A champion for civil and human rights - the National Bar Association recognized Rand one of the Nation's Best Advocates Top 40 Lawyers Under 40 in the United States.

She will share her insight, experience and pioneering efforts for social justice and empowerment as an exclusive speaker with American Program Bureau.

Rand is not only a, professor, national legal analyst, international legal consultant, lecturer, columnist and civil rights leader, she is also the founding attorney of RAND LAW, L.L.C., a Miami-based civil litigation firm. In addition to networks such as, CNN, MSNBC, HLN and Fox, Rand also appears on numerous international networks in Jamaica, Colombia and Japan.
