Farmers Warned To Prevent Loss By Fire

Fire Prevention Week Is Opportunity To Bring Danger Home

Painting out that the nation's farmers lost ten cents out of every dollar they earned last year through fires or other serious accidents. William E. Borden, County Supervisor for the Farm Security Administration, urged Rowan county farmers to pay particular attention to National Fire Prevention week this year.

The annual bill for farm accidents is estimated at one billion dollars or roughly one-tenth of the gross farm income last year. House said. These accidents at the farm cost the lives of 4,000 farmers last year. Emphasizing that fire is one of the farmer's costliest enemies, Mr. Borden pointed out that October 9 to 11 is National Fire Prevention Week and that Rowan county farmers should take this time to check up on fire hazards on their farms. Over 350,000 fires occur in this country annually, killing more than 5,000 people and a 100 million dollar damage.

Borden of the Cumberland National Forest today cautioned hunters to be extremely careful with fires in the woods and request a permit before making a campfire on National Forest lands. Permits may be secured by applying either by mail or in person to the Forest Rangers at Mt. Sterling, Berea, London and Stearn. Fires should always be built in a spot carefully cleaned of leaves or debris in a circle at least ten feet wide and never against a log or a tree or snag. The fire should never be left until the coals are thoroughly watered out and covered by mineral soil. No fire should be

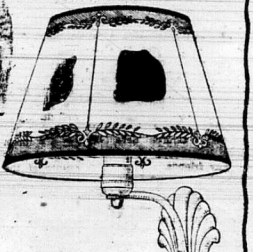

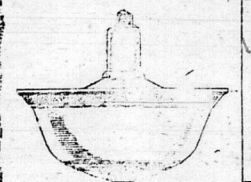

Training For Defense

By Rufus T. Strohm

WITHIN the next two years the airplane industry of the United States will suffer from a shortage of skilled mechanics if the present rate of training is not speeded. This fact was disclosed by two surveys that estimated a need of 100,000 mechanics per airplane. The surveys, one by a government agency and the other by a committee of the American Chamber of Commerce and Industry, reported that private schools which teach mechanics are now operating at about 50 per cent capacity.

Three major reasons were cited by the school men for the low level of their business: (1) Young men who would have gone to a mechanics school find that they can now get jobs without training because of the defense program. (2) Selective service has taken many young men who either were in school or would have gone to school. (3) The government is offering bonus training, which does not equip men to service airplanes. These conditions have many men away from more expensive training. This problem of training mechanics is a very vital one and steps should be taken to remedy the situation. Skilled mechanics are not trained overnight and all qualified schools should be utilized to the fullest extent. The aviation industry is providing a certain amount of apprentice training for its unskilled workmen, but there is no reason to believe that the industry can supply all the men who will be needed.
