Cartees, Martins Lead Intra-Mural Play

**Play Will End Tuesday Night;
Cartees Are Favorites To Win**

With action past the halfway mark in the intra-mural football tourney that is being played at Morehead College the Cartees and the Martins occupy first place with a record of four games won and one tie. The Cartees sustained their only loss at the hands of the Martins however and this would seem to give the Martins an advantage.

On the other hand the Martins lone loss was at the hands of the darkskins Allens. The Allens sat out for third place with the Tuckers.

The first games in the tourney were played on Sept. 27 with the Allens looking like champions as they swamped the Tuckers 42-12. The Martins took the Cartees 17-16, the Tuckers

outed the Bakers 15-6 and Batoes outed an 18-10 win over the Loves.

Friday, March 28 saw the Cartees overwhelm the Martins 28-13. Batoes outlasted the Bettmans 16-11 and Allens routed the Tuckers 18-17.

Continuing the action on Monday, March 31, Allens won a game from Batoes by the far left route 2-0. Martins had another close call as they won over Loves 20-1. Bettmans sprang the upset of the tourney as they dropped Batoes 24-21.

Tuesday saw Cartees hand the Bettmans their second lapidous loss as they dropped the South River boys 37-9. Martins continued their winning ways by besting Tuckers in an overtime 26-20. Batoes won their second game by downing Bettmans 27-21.

Loves administered Allens a setback 26-25. This game was featured by the cleanlines of play as only one foul was called on the Loves during the entire contest.

Play was resumed Thursday night for one night longer and two games were won by forfeit. Batoes took a forfeited game from Allens 2-0 and Martins won via the same method over Bettmans.

In other games played Thursday, Cartees blasted Batoes 24-18 and Tuckers broke into the

win column once more by trouncing Loves 35-25.

Play will be resumed Monday night when Batoes meet Martins, Loves play Bettmans in the second game. Bettmans expect Martins and Allens to battle with Tuckers in the finale. The first game will start at 6:30 and the next game will start immediately following its completion.
