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ed teachers for all Kentucky schools.

The Committee for Kentucky wants more doctors and better medical care for rural people. In the rural districts there are 2,300 persons per doctor, as compared with 650 in urban areas. And this condition is similar to our deplorable shortage in school teachers. There will be considerably more young men going into the medical profession in the next few years than in the last few years, but evolutionary increases will not meet the emergency. Something must be done to encourage more young men to go into medicine, and to settle in villages and small towns where they can be available to back-country people.

Clinics, small hospitals are being operated successfully in some towns and villages by enterprising young physicians. These serve as good examples of what other doctors can do. The educational and health problems of the state cannot be solved by legislation alone, but by the time the next General Assembly meets Kentucky state-manship should rise to the occasion with measures to help increase the enlightenment of ambitious young people in the teachers' and the medical professions.

**TEACHERS SALARIES**  
Teachers in virtually every State in the Union receive substantially higher salaries in the 1947-48 school year than they did in the academic year just ended, receiving a total of \$261,500,000 in salaries for the year opening in September. This is a 10.5 per cent increase over the \$236,500,000 received in 1946-47.

#### WAR DEAD RE-BURIED

Three thousand victims of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor will be the first American dead of World War II to be returned from the Pacific area for reburial in this country, according to Brig.-Gen. George E. Horkan, chief of the Memorial Division of the Army Quartermaster Corps. The first bodies will be brought to the West Coast before a special ship early in October. As many of the 261,000 World War dead will be brought home as next-of-kin desire.
