Specifications:

PEELED WOOD: Length 5 feet: diameter at least 4 inches at small end. Branches and knots to be trimmed close with body of stick. Ends sawn square.

Remove all outer and inner bark. Do not include burned, crotched or excessively knotty sticks. Saw only living trees.

ROUGH WOOD: Diameter at least 4 inches at small end under bark. Other requirements same as for peeled wood.
