

MOREHEAD, KY., July 3.—A. J. McKenzie, a former sheriff of this county, was to-day appointed Sheriff of Rowan county and he has qualified and entered upon the discharge of his duties. The following parties were to-day arrested, charged with the murder of Ben Rayborne: Jeff Bowling, John Trumbo, Boone Day, Robert Messer, James Oxley, Nick Day, Craig Tolliver and H. M. Kattton. The case against Jeff Bowling, John Trumbo, Boone Day and Robert Messer, Constables, was called for an examination trial before Judge Stuart at 11 o'clock to-day. Attorney General, P. W. Hardin and Z. T. Young, County Attorney, represented the Commonwealth, and A. T. Young the defense. The case was continued until next Monday, to procure the attendance of witnesses and to grant the defendants time to secure additional counsel. All parties that have been arrested are under guard on the encampment grounds, except Craig Tolliver, who, on account of his wounds, is confined to his house. A special guard has been placed at his house. The guards upon being stationed there took possession of the fire arms found on the premises. More arrests will be made and Gen. Hardin, who has been here for several days investigating the trouble, returned to Frankfort this evening. He will return Monday to represent the Commonwealth in these cases. General Castleman will return here to-morrow. The guards will not spend the fourth at a pic-nic.
