

Esham, Gearhart Receive Appointment To Morehead College Board Of Regents

**Announcement Made
At Frankfort
Thursday Afternoon.**

Dr. Elwood Esham, Vanceburg and Dr. Lowell Gearhart, Grayson, have been appointed members of the Morehead State College board of regents by Governor Lawrence Wetherby.

The new members, whose terms ended in 1988, succeed B. F. Reese, Jr., of W. Va. Ball, Maryland, whose terms ended April 1. Reese is a Democrat and Ball a Republican.

A board meeting will be arranged as soon as possible to select a new president for Moravian College. Charles J. Spain, who announced his resignation March 3, State Superintendent Instruction Wendell Butler said. Spain will become dean of the College of Education, University of New Mexico, about June.

Track Season Starts Early With Tough Meet At Berea

With only the proverbial handful of boys ready for action, the Gold and Blue track team launched forth upon a tough nine-meet schedule at Berea last Saturday afternoon.

Equipment has been issued to some two dozen boys, but injuries and sickness, lack of conditioning, and plain inexperience has reduced the number available for competition to around a dozen. This means in effect that Morehead will be very hard pressed to win any meets. Even to make a good showing, every boy will be forced to compete in two events and some of them in as many as four or five.

As affairs now stand, the Moreheadians will be relatively strong in the track events but weak in the field events. The best performance turned in to date by any of the boys was a brilliant 11:04.2 two mile by Wm. Wooten, a time that is four seconds better than the OVC winning mark last spring. Wooten, a freshman, was a member of the OVC championship X-country team last fall.

Another sparkling feat was a 0:29.3 quarter by Jo "Anolego" Wheeler, thus tying the stadium record for the event. Carl Deaton

a freshman with probably the most beautiful running stride of any member of the team, has two splendid times to his credit — 5 minutes for the mile, and 11:15 for the two mile. Morehead's rivals will be watching his heels many times in the coming season.

Ed Reed, a recent bender, proved that matrimony is a good for whatever ails a man by clocking a sound 6:17.5 in the high relay.

Other individuals who have been slower to round into form, but who should be heard from in a big way before the season closes are Jack Hedland (pole vault and quarter), Jim Glascock (mile and half mile), Ed Wells (100, 220, and broad jump), and Morris Wright (pole vault and high jump).
