The two bands of desparadoes are still confronting each other in Rowan county, and have exchanged several fusilades, but up this time no one has been killed. The town of Morehead has been depleted of its reputable citizens, leaving the place in the possession of the factious elements. The telegraph operator has been compelled to flee and is now at Mt. Sterling, hence communication by that means has been cut off. The authorities troops have telegraphed to Gov. Knott for to suppress the lawlessness, and three companies of the State Guards have been ordered out and will go to Rowan county immediately. The companies from Lexington, Mt. Sterling and Richmond have been selected for the duty.
