Faculty Meeting Dec 2-1904

The meeting called to order at 8 a. m. in the library - by Pres Burton.

Present Prof McDiarmid, Misses Shutey, Haley, Spencer.

Entrance of boys at meetings discussed. Moved by Miss Spencer that the boys be retained after Chapel and the names of Glenmore Wilson and Mill Mc Dyer be called out as those violating the rule of leaving Hadson Hall immediately after meals, and also that the penalty of eating at the second table be attached to the breaking of this rule.

Seconded by Miss Haley and passed unanimously.

Injury to bed clothing in Burgess Hall next discussed. Decided that boys must be held responsible -

Applications for scholarships read - Rosa Rockwell requests a whole scholarship, Miss Meadows of Woodbury, requests a half scholarship - Both refused as not meeting the requirements of the Board.

Moved by Prof. McDiarmid that Pres. Burton or any member of the Faculty be delegated to bring in scholarship pupils - from the mountains. Seconded by Miss Haley and carried unanimously -

Faculty Meeting Dec 10 - 1904

Pres. Button called this Special meeting to order in Miss Shukey's room at Hudson Hall at 1:30 P.M.

Present Prof and Mrs McDiarmid, Misses Shukey, Haley and Spencer. -

First there was a Hark Investigation.

Ruby Huffman, being called as a witness, stated that all the girls had complained of the hark, and the boys from all tables decided not to touch it again - and Minnie Neilson said often she took the hark back unclouched owing to the use of tainted meat in the preparation of the aforesaid hark. -

Ruby was dismissed - Prof McDiarmid moved that some one be appointed to confer with Mrs Dayton in regard to it - Seconded by Miss Spencer - Carried unanimously by Faculty. Pres. Button selects to speak to her.

Use of tobacco brought up by Prof. McDiarmid - and he requested a rule from the Faculty as to Chewing and Smoking - Taken by common consent - without a formal vote - that the use of tobacco be prohibited both in the rooms of the boys and on the school grounds.

Amelia Reid's scholarship discussed. Agreed that we give her what work we could find, assisting teachers, and let her full scholarship continue after Christmas.

Alice Kitchin's scholarship discussed. Moved by Prof. McDiarmid that her scholarship end at Christmas unless a great, sudden transformation take place -

Seconded by Miss Spencer -

Discussion followed in which Miss Shukey opposed so long as some other scholarship pupils are doing no better. -

Agreed - Prof McDiarmid, Mrs McDiarmid Miss Haley, Miss Spencer -

Meeting called to order by Pres Button in Library, at 8 a. m.
