

Faculty Meeting, Jan 6 - 1905

Called to order by Pres. Boston at 8. A. M.
Present Prof and Mrs M^c. Diarmid, Misses Slattery
Haley and Spencer. —

Rule made that pupils must be quiet
in the school building, keep out of the
halls and not run through the rooms
before school or at recess. —

Teachers be on hand fifteen minutes
before school. —

Faculty Meeting, March 28, 1905:

Oreston Conway's case brought up -
Moved by Miss Spencer that as he was starting
out in the Christian life - he be allowed to ^{remain in} attend
school as a pupil but the scholarship be with-
drawn from the time he was expelled. Carried.

Decided that recess be 15 min. each day
after Chapel.

Moved by Prof. McDiarmid - that all
scholarship boys be gotten out to work on the
yard for 2 hours each afternoon ^{will} review
is being conducted and that a few others be em-
ployed at 7½¢ per hour.

April 10, 1908.

Faculty meeting called at request of Mrs. Clayton to show some soiled linens gathered up today in Burgess Hall. Towels, napkins + pillow cases, inked, burned and cut, also torn up.

Decided that each room full of boys be assessed to pay for damaged articles.

May 5, 1900:

The Faculty met to decide on and grant Scholarships.

Full Scholarships were granted to -

Will Cotton; Maud Jacobs; Emma Leedy;
Kansas Mc Coy; Simon P. Miller; Myrtle
Wilson; Lucy Wilson.

One-half Scholarship granted to Andrew Sharp;
with the understanding that it be not used
unless necessary.

One-fourth Scholarship granted to Beverly Wilter.
To Nancy Catron, Full Scholarship on condition
she come in the fall at beginning of term.

Moved and carried that all scholarship pupils
be required to enter school in September with
the expectation of remaining throughout the year.

Decided that Mrs. Smith be informed that
that Oreston Conway will be allowed to finish
the year if she is willing to pay the \$10.00
for the past two months.

October 3, 1903:

The Faculty met in Miss Sturkey's room. Matters pertaining to the supply of food; manner of serving it; conduct of pupils at table and on the yard; the care of the buildings and grounds; were discussed and plans that seemed best suited for each case were adopted.

October 16, 1903:

Faculty meeting called to order by Prof. Button. Moved & carried that the Matron of Hodson Hall be admitted to faculty meetings when matters concerning the dormitory are considered; at other conferences her presence is not necessary.

Prof. McWilliams asked that some changes be made in the manner of managing the paper and printing press. The subject was taken under consideration. Adjourned.

October 19, 1903:

Faculty meeting called to order by Prof. Button. Decided to grant full scholarship to Leonadas Pennington and to Clyde Huffman. Also allow Clyde Huffman \$2.00 per week for assisting in the printing office. To Miss E. E. Shelly, employed in the printing office full scholarship and \$3.00 per week.

Prof. McWilliams appointed editor-in-chief of the paper; other members of the faculty to be assistants. Each assigned definite work.

Oct. 31, 1905.

Faculty meeting. Smoking among the students considered. Decided pupils, offending by smoking, should be talked to by Profs. Button and McNearmid and Holbrook and the offenders should promise to quit smoking or leave the institution. Also decided that scholarship pupils should be given some manual labor about the buildings.

Adjourned.

Nov. 20, 1905.

Faculty met to consider the conduct of the boys in Burgess Hall. Leaving Hall without permission; absence from Sunday School; smoking; and minor offences, and to mete out suitable punishment. Moved and carried to give Foley one more trial in school. He to leave the Hall and board down town. Different degrees of punishment assigned, according to offense, to other boys.

Jan. 1906.

Faculty met to consider the conduct of some of the girls in Houdson Hall.

One girl, Lucy L. before the faculty and reproved. She promised to do better, to conform to the regulations. Moved and carried to send Elida C. home for improper conduct.
