Feb. 7, 1910.

Present at faculty meeting - Profs. Button, Robison, Holbrook, Mrs. Button, Robison, Hopkins, Miss Allison, Shafer, Libbott and Jameson.

Considered the advisability of admitting boys + girls under 14 years of age to the dormitories. Prof. Robison + Miss Jameson instructed to write the National Board concerning the matter. Reported the dormitories are full. Boys may find rooms away from dormitories and excess board may come out of their tuition till room is made for them at dormitories residence.

The ground adjoining Prof. Button's ^{residence} set aside as play ground for the primary pupils. Meals for sick pupils shall be ordered by the dormitory managers. More strenuous efforts be made to collect board and tuition.

Sept. 13, 1910.

Faculty met at 7 P.M. All members present except the Matron of Hodson Hall.

Prof. Button read a letter, from the President of the National Board, concerning the duties of the Matron of Hodson Hall.

Moved and seconded that the teachers be not required to go to Burgess Hall. Carried.

Moved and seconded that all girls, except two or three necessary for company for the music teacher, be kept in Hodson Hall, and that Miss Jameson be relieved from responsibility of the girls in Burgess when they are in the building. Carried.

Taken by consent that the Matron is responsible for the girls outside of school hours, the teachers responsible for the girls during school hours.

Taken by consent the Matron has no right to excuse a girl from school except for sickness.

Excuses to be in writing.

It is desirable that the music room be under the room occupied by Miss Jameson, but owing to the poor health of Mrs. Lawrence it is best that Mrs. Lawrence occupy the room under Miss Jameson. The change of rooms was made because of the formerly ill-health of Mrs. Lawrence.

Moved and seconded that the girls be allowed one-half hour before, and one-half hour after supper in the music room for recreation. Carried.

Taken by consent that Miss Jameson talk to the girls and Prof. Robinson to the boys concerning their deportment toward one another.

General consultation concerning the discipline and management of the school.

Sept. 26, 1910.

Faculty met at 6:30 P.M. All present except Prof. Holbrook and Mrs. Robison.

The faculty ratified the selection of officers made by the two literary societies; also apportioned the new students to the two societies.

Taken by consent that Mrs. Jameson and Prof. Robison report name of each new student to Miss Allison and Tibbott.

Mrs. Button and Jameson appointed as committee to confer with Mrs. Lawrence and arrange for one scholarship girl to care for the music room and to build fire of mornings in said room. Decided that Lou Duncan should assist Miss Tibbott and Prof. Holbrook in caring for Burgess hall; his work to pay for his tuition. The matter of providing drinking water for the pupils was discussed.

Taken by consent that Mrs. Robison use a room at Burgess Hall for the sewing room.

Taken by consent that Miss Dwyer be allowed to introduce industrial work in her room on Friday afternoons.

Faculty meeting held at Lothers Hall. All members, nine, were present.

Reed Howens was before the faculty for continual disorderly conduct in the dormitories; for pool playing down town; for being a leader in disturbances.

Reed asked to be given one more trial in the dormitories and in the school - promising that he would be have himself and would comply with the regulation of the school and dormitories. Carried that he be allowed two weeks' trial and if he did behave himself properly his probation should be extended to four weeks and then if his conduct was satisfactory his probation be extended from time to time as his good conduct deserved.

Moved and carried that school be adjourned the afternoon of October 18, that all might attend a political meeting to listen to Gov. Willson who was to address the meeting.
