

HELL TO PAY IN ROWAN AGAIN.—On Saturday night last two men left Rowan county with a couple of stolen horses. They came through Flemingsburg Sunday, and Monday night both of them boarded the *Bonanza* at Foster's, with the stolen animals, on their way to Cincinnati. One of the men was John R. Taber, commonly called "Jack" Taber,—a name not unfamiliar to the ears of the readers of the REPUBLICAN,—and the other John P. Martin, both residing in Rowan. The wife of Martin took passage on the *Bonanza* at this place Monday evening, having arranged to meet her husband at Foster. Marshal Heflin and jailor Weedon were also passengers on the boat, "shading" Mrs. Martin. After the boat left New Richmond Taber was arrested, and Martin was safely "hauled" at an early hour Tuesday morning. The prisoners were brought here Tuesday night, and on Wednesday they consented to return to Rowan for trial. The horses were recovered.
