April 6, 1920.

A discussion was held regarding the advisability of resuming chapel services, which had been discontinued during the smallpox ban.

Admission of students to dormitories: Restrictions removed in case of successful vaccinations and no exposure to measles.

It was decided to invite Brother Irwin, Minister of the Morehead Christian Church, to deliver the Baccalaureate sermon, and Brother S. S. Lappin of Bedford, Indiana, the Commencement address.

Chapel was to be held Friday morning, and resumed as usual the following week.

A motion was made and seconded that we recommend to the Literary Societies that, at the beginning of the year, no effort be made to secure new members until after each society has given a program. Carried, unanimously.
