Annika Weaver is first recipient of Prater Scholarship

Annika Weaver, a senior veterinary science major from Richmond, is the first recipient of the Dr. Phil Prater Veterinary Science Scholarship.

The scholarship was launched in July in honor of Dr. Phil Prater, former professor of veterinary technology, who retired in June after 25 years at MSU.

Prater was instrumental in securing funding for the University's Equine Health Education Center at the Derrickson Agricultural Complex. Prater earned many professional awards during his time at MSU, including Veterinarian of the Year from the Kentucky Veterinary Medical Association, Outstanding Senior Teacher Award from the American Association of Colleges of Agriculture and Renewable Resources in 2006, MSU Distinguished Teacher Award in 2008, and Kentucky Veterinary Medical Association (KVMA) Distinguished Service Award in 2018.

Veterinarians, students, and colleagues contributed approximately \$10,000 in funding to establish the Dr. Phil Prater Scholarship Endowment. The Kentucky Veterinary Medicine Association pledged additional support to grow the fund.

Weaver said she's grateful for the support the scholarship will provide as she pursues her dream of becoming a veterinarian.

"I'm honored to receive this scholarship and be the first recipient. My goal is to become a large animal veterinarian, and this additional support in my final semester is such a weight off my shoulders," she said.

Dr. James Masterson publishes new article on environmental policy

Dr. James R. Masterson, associate professor of political science at Morehead State, published a co-authored article in Asian Survey, a University of California Press publication.

Masterson co-authored the article with Jingwen Wu, a Ph.D. student at the University of Kentucky. It examines the effectiveness of public policy in incentivizing developing nations to prioritize environmental regulation with a specific focus on China's most recent environmental policy, the Ecological Environmental Protection Plan.

The study finds evidence of air quality improvements following the implementation of the policy. It also found more significant enhancements in air quality in the cities most affected by the institutional changes of the policy.

"This research shows that well-crafted public policy can improve air quality, providing crucial insights for policymakers and scholars alike," Masterson said. "Policymakers, climate researchers, and public policy students will benefit from the article's contribution to the field of air quality policy in general and China's attempts to clean up its air in particular."

Access to the full article is available for free until October 28.

Masterson is chair of the Department of History, Philosophy, Politics, Global and Legal Studies, and director of the Master of Public Administration Program at MSU. He can be reached at <u>j.masterson@moreheadstate.edu</u>.

Morehead State holds dedication ceremony for new Eagle statue

While Morehead State has several iconic landmarks and structures familiar to students and alumni, there is now a new focal point on campus that truly soars.

On Friday, Nov. 3, MSU added the bronze Centennial Eagle to the Adron Doran University Commons area in a special dedication ceremony for students, alumni, and the surrounding community during the 2023 Homecoming weekend.

MSU alum Ronald "Ron" Cartee (Class of 1965) and the Cartee Family provided a special gift for creating the statue recognizing the University's 100 years as a public institution in Kentucky. World-renowned artist Sam McKinney (Class of 1973, 1992) crafted a bronze Eagle statue honoring MSU's Eagle mascot and the school's commitment to helping students soar higher.

"We are thrilled to officially unveil and dedicate this amazing piece," said Rick Hesterberg (Class of 1980), vice president of university advancement. "Thanks to the Cartee family's generosity and the talents of Sam McKinney, our campus now has a lasting marker to our beloved mascot - the Eagle."

With a wingspan nearly 12 feet wide, McKinney spent a year working on the statue from concept to completion. While he has sculptures and artwork displayed across the country and in other parts of the world, he said it is special to have a piece of himself on the campus that helped shape him as an artist.

"It's just so rewarding to finally have a piece there," McKinney said. "It's going to be there long after I'm gone and hopefully appreciated by new generations."

Morehead State professor Dr. Chris Miller co-authors book on educational technology management

Dr. Chris Miller (Class of 1994), professor of education and director of MSU at Mt. Sterling, has co-authored a book in the "Leadership and Best Practices in Educational Technology Management" series by the Association for Educational Communications and Technology (AECT) and Brill Publishing titled "AECT at 100: A Legacy of Leadership."

Miller was a contributor along with Dr. Anthony A. Piña, chief online learning officer at Illinois State University; Dr. Michael Molenda, associate professor emeritus at Indiana University Bloomington; Dr. Phil Harris, retired AECT executive director; and Dr. Barbara Lockee, associate vice provost for faculty affairs at Virginia Tech University.

The book explores the 100 years of leadership by AECT in educational technology and learning. The newly released book earned the James W. Brown Publication Award at the 2023 AECT International Convention in Orlando, Florida. The award recognizes the author(s) of an outstanding publication in educational technology.

"It was an honor to receive the James W. Brown award for creating 'AECT at 100: A Legacy of Leadership' was a privilege to lead," Miller said. "We are proud of the chapters provided by our many authors to create a book chronicling significant leadership activities by the organization over its 100-year history."

The 2023 AECT International Convention selected Miller as the recipient of the J. Michael Spector Appreciation Award. The award is given for long-term service and leadership to AECT beyond expectations.

Miller is a 24-year member of the organization, serving as president of two different divisions. He currently serves as the AECT Board of Directors representative for a third division and previously served as president of the AECT Foundation. Miller serves as the series co-editor for the AECT and Brill publications book series "Leadership and

Morehead State University Associate Professor of Education Dr. Christopher Beckham recently published an article in Ohio Valley History. The Filson Historical Society, the University of Cincinnati, and the Cincinnati Museum Center sponsor the refereed academic journal.

Beckham's article titled "The Thread That Runs So True: Jesse Stuart's Perennially Instructive and Inspiring Book" explored Stuart's time as a teacher in early 20th century Kentucky, noting parallels with some of the challenges, opportunities, and joys that educators in Kentucky continue to experience. It also touched on the founding of teacher colleges in the Commonwealth, including Morehead State University.

Agricultural sciences receives USDA grant for swine facilities

Morehead State's Department of Agricultural Sciences is the recipient of a grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) to upgrade equipment in its swine production facility at the Derrickson Agricultural Complex.

"I believe that these upgrades can be a game changer for helping our students be more prepared for their careers after graduation," said Dr. Flint Harrelson, associate professor of animal science. "I also believe that these upgrades will be valuable assets to the bountiful resources at the Derrickson Agricultural Complex."

The nearly \$47,000 grant from the USDA's National Institute of Food and Agriculture (NIFA) will pay for updated equipment used for animal husbandry, specifically sow nutritional management and the care of sick piglets. The swine facility was built in the early 2000s, and the equipment is outdated.

"Over the past 20+ years, the industry has seen many advances in technology and housing including the almost universal adoption of pen gestation systems with electronic sow feeders. These technologies also have allowed for more efficient and sustainable management of labor, farms, and animals," Harrelson said. "These upgrades will make our students more marketable upon graduation as they will have not only the animal husbandry skills to care for the livestock but also the technical experience of working with equipment found in modern swine facilities. These upgrades can also expand the opportunities for industry applied research which can aid students in gaining valuable life skills along with building more industry connections and options for graduates."

Dr. Shannon Harr, the Office of Research and Sponsored Programs' director, said MSU's location makes it more important for the facilities to be upgraded.

"MSU has taught students hands-on swine production for over 40 years and has had great success with placing students in the industry," said Harr. "Our proximity to swine

operations in North Carolina, Ohio, and Indiana have made for tremendous student opportunities with the swine industry."

Besides being an accomplished musician, Ryster is a luthier who builds custom Appalachian violins at his home in Hogtown Ridge in Rowan County, Kentucky. A 2023

Appy Award winner for Best Luthier, Ryster is a master instructor with the Kentucky Arts Council's Folk and Traditional Arts Apprenticeship Project.

"I learned to build instruments from Tommy Case of Georgetown through the Kentucky Arts Council apprenticeship. I love it, and I've been busy building them for folks ever since," said Ryster. "Musicians from all over own my violins, including Tyler Childers, Sarah Pirkle, and Pete Thompson."

Ryser says he understands that bluegrass music has a long and strong tradition in Appalachian culture.

"We're like a family," said Ryster. "Bluegrass and traditional music are vital parts of our culture in eastern Kentucky. It's important to have a program on WMKY to showcase this music. The fact that it's on a public radio station is even better because we're free to play the real stuff!"

Dr. Tathagata Ray receives NSF grant for wind energy research

Morehead State University Assistant Professor of Construction and Civil Engineering Technology, Dr. Tathagata Ray, was recently awarded a grant from the Kentucky National Science Foundation's (NSF) Established Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR) to support his research project exploring ways to mitigate roof damage caused by high winds.

High winds flowing over roofs of low-rise buildings can cause damage in two ways:

Uplifting and removal of the roof causing the total collapse of the building.

Localized damage that causes water leaks that result in more significant structural and functional loss.

One of the reasons behind both damage mechanisms is the suction (upward pressure) created on the roof by the wind. Ray developed a control system that will be activated by suction and later reduce suction.

Ray visited Florida International University (FIU) in October 2023 and conducted a set of experiments utilizing the NSF Natural Hazards Engineering Research Infrastructure (NHERI) Wall of Wind (WoW) Experimental Facility. The controller was fabricated for Ray by The Honey and Bee Connection, a local wood workshop in Morehead. Ray worked with Undergraduate Research Fellows Ryan Justice from Pikeville, a senior construction and civil engineering management major, and Hunter Cook from Bidwell, Ohio, a sophomore majoring in space systems engineering.

"I applaud the work of Dr. Ray. His work in studying the effects of wind on structures is of great value to the construction industry from the local to national level and beyond," said Dr. Eric Jerde, associate dean of the School of Engineering and Computer Science.

In addition to these two students involved, James Bradley, lab and facilities manager for the School of Engineering and Technology Management, was also involved in the initial small-scale testing at MSU. The trials entailed testing those specimens on the MSU campus using a wind tunnel purchased with NSF KY EPSCoR grant funds.

"I completed the tests at FIU ahead of schedule. This happened because of camaraderie and the congenial atmosphere that the Wall of Wind team provided me, together with the hard work they did with me," Ray said. "I also thank you for the support from the MSU management, including the Office of Research [and Sponsored Programs]."

Dr. Shannon Harr, director of research and sponsored programs, said support from EPSCoR has been vital to research across campus.

"This research was made possible by funding received through the NSF KY EPSCoR program. Faculty at MSU have been generously supported by KY EPSCoR, receiving millions of dollars to support research and teaching," he said.

Dr. Timothy Simpson co-authors classical education essay

Morehead State University Associate Dean and Professor of Education Dr. Timothy L. Simpson recently co-authored an essay with Dr. Jon Fennell, professor emeritus and former dean of social sciences at Hillsdale College, published in "Principia: A Journal of Classical Education."

Principia is a new, leading journal for classical and liberal education studies supported by Baylor University. Simpson co-authored the essay "An Epistemological Rationale for Classical Education." The paper examines the need to fortify classical education and protect it from the dangers some see as misguided conceptions of assessment and accountability.

"Our effort is supported by the strikingly insightful defender of liberal arts education, Harry S. Broudy, a preeminent voice in philosophy of education during the mid to late-twentieth century," Simpson said. "The article explores Broudy's call for general or liberal education, highlighting the seminal epistemology of Michael Polanyi, upon which Broudy's call stands."

Simpson, who is faculty in the Ernst & Sara Lane Volgenau College of Education, also recently conducted a doctoral-directed study on Polanyi's pioneering epistemological framework and its educational implications for curriculum design for K-12 education. He submitted an essay under review to "Tradition and Discovery: The Polanyi Society Journal" based on that study.
