Mr. Dallas' Letter To Mr. Truman

Mr. C. Donald Dallas, President of Revere Copper and Brass, Incorporated, has written this letter to the President of the United States:

"Dear Mr. President:

The News reprints Mr. Dallas' letter because it, in effect, sets out the stand that industry has taken in practically all the present labor upheaval. Since everything that is purchased is produced by labor, and its final cost to the consumer based on labor costs, we, like Mr. Dallas, fall to see how any business — whether it's the vast copper bif steel industry or a three-man saw-mill—can sell for lower prices and pay higher wages.

Mr. Truman's intentions have, no doubt, been good. But, in the handling of the labor disputes, he and his advisors have muffed the ball. It has been something like the referee in a basicuball game that blows his whistle so much, because he control, that he loser is respect of the participants and has the spectators loosing him at the same time.
