Announcement Comes In Letter To President Baird As Students **Enrolling For Third Quarter**

THE SOUTHERN ASSOCIATION STATEMENT

This is the all-important statement issued by Southern sociation of Colleges and Secondary Schools which means much to Morehead College and in particular the student

ody:

"Following precedent in such situations the action of
the Association in dropping the Morchead State Teachers
College from the membership will become effective Sep-tember 1, 1947. This is in order that full recognition may
be given students who will graduate in June, 1947, and
those who may receive degrees during the summer seathose who may receive degrees during the summer sea-

sions."

College officials said that if this statement had been re-ceived two or three days ago they felt there would have been no noticeable decrease in enrollment. It came as students were enrolling for the present quarter.

All credits earned by students at the Morehead State
Teachers College prior to September 1947 will be as good
as they ever were it was learned today.
This startling development came this morning as the
third quarter enrollment was underway and was contained
in a letter from the Southern Association of Collegees and
Secondary Schools to Dr. William J. Baird, Morehead
president.

It was the brightest note yet sounded in the Morehead situation but it probably arrived a few hours too late to halt an anticipated drop in enrollment. However, Dr. Baird said that the registration this morning is "going along fine... much better than we expected."
