The resignation of two 'key' staff members at Morehead College this week brings to more than a score the number of faculty and administrative laaders that the institution has love thinking the last year. It is cause for much sober thinking and increases the burden of Dr. William Joese Baird, creases the burden of Dr. William Joese Baird, the president, who is already carrying heavy load in his efforts to restore normalcy to the largest institution of higher learning in Eastern Kentucky.

A combination of loss of accrediting and inability to meet the pay-roll standards offered elsewhere is gradually robbing Morehead of the heart of its teaching and administrative staff. With the salaries that the Board of Regents can offer under its present budget it is well nigh impossible to replace these persons with equally competent neonle.

When Ellis Johnson resigned this week to When Ellis Johnson resigned this week to acept a three year contract as coach of the professional Louisville basketball team he told reporters: "I am crazy about Morehead . . I like the college and I like the people . . but I am unable to resist the larger salary I am offered at Louisville." Johnson, who had already turned down two or three lucrative offers, will receive twice as much pay at Louisville as he has been getting at Morehead.
