Kentucky's Chance To Get Out Of The Mud

Kentucky's roadless farmers have been promised relief for half-a-hundred years or more by every candidate seeking the governorship. Our older citizens will recall that before the turn of the century, this was a predominant campaign

However, those close to Mr. Clements knew that rural roads were of primary concern to him and the two cents gasoline tax enacted into law last week was of no great surprise to informed members of the Clements' circle. In every speech, Mr. Clements promised that Kentueky, under his administration, would get better rural roads, although he was not explicit as to the manner in which the revenue would be procured.

Opponents of the two, cents gasoline tax, who are in considerable minority, charged that the Governor railroaded the bill through the House and the Senate and they were given no opportune that this gasoline tax will cause a hardship on a number of dealers in extreme northern Kentucky and other bordering spots. However, for the good of the people of the entire state, the sacrifice that thust be made by these few dealers is comparatively negligible.

Many of Kentucky's chief executives, both Democrats and Republicans, have, after assuming office, made an honest attempt because of lack of fands available in a state that has been retarded because of a citizenry that has been unalter ably opposed to any form of new taxation.

Both of Rowan County's elected members of the General Assembly, Senator Oilie M. Lyon and Representative George I. Cline, voted for the measure. 
