Health and Wellness Support

Counseling & Health Services

Counseling and Health Services is open from 8 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. Services are comparable to those of your family health care provider, but tailored to the problems, concerns, and preventive health associated with college-aged students, both traditional and non-traditional.

The clinic takes appointments throughout the day until 3:30 p.m. An appointment is not necessary but encouraged to decrease wait time. Walk-in are accepted through the day but those with appointments or emergency needs will be seen first.

Emergencies – Students with emergencies that are life-threatening should go directly to St. Claire Regional Medical Center’s Emergency Room for treatment.

Counseling Services - You can meet with a professional counselor to discuss your needs confidentially. Our university counseling center provides mental health and substance abuse counseling, as well as emergency and crisis services to our students struggling with issues that may prevent them from reaching their academic goals. Financial Support

Office of Financial Aid

The purpose of financial aid is to help students and families meet educational expenses that cannot be met through their own resources. Financial aid can be either need-based or non-need-based. Student Employment

For Eagles who want to work to earn their financial aid, there are two types of student employment: federal and institutional. Federal student employment is need-based while institutional student employment is not. If you are awarded a federal workstudy, it will be listed on your financial aid award letter.

If you have been awarded a federal position or are interested in institutional student employment, create an Eagle CareerNet account at www.moreheadstate.edu/career to view job openings and to apply for available positions. You must have a federal workstudy award to apply for federal positions.

SHARE Fund

The Student Hardship Assistance Resource Emergency (SHARE) fund is a new fund that directly supports MSU students during times of financial hardship due to an emergency or life-altering situation. Students can apply to receive limited financial assistance from the SHARE fund for a variety of essential needs that cannot currently be met by the student due to temporary hardship. The amount of funds awarded will vary and will depend on the individual situation of each student. The fund is supported entirely by donations and funds awarded do not have to be repaid.

- Typical expenses that may be covered by the SHARE fund include but are not limited to:
- Medications/prescriptions or costs related to medical care
- Assistance with rent or utilities due to an emergency situation
- Safety related needs (i.e. changing a lock on a vehicle or home)
- Replacement of personal belongings due to a fire or natural disaster

Eagle Emergency Loan Fund

Eagle Essentials

Eagle Essentials is located in 2nd Floor ADUC. Eagle Essentials provides students with everyday items at no cost. We provide students with non-perishable food items, hygiene products and school supplies.

- Hygiene Products: toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, feminine products, shampoo, soap

EagleCards

The EagleCard ID will serve as your official MSU photo identification. With your EagleCard, you can gain access to your residence hall, library, Recreation & Wellness Center, meal plans, BeakerBUCKS, student checking through USBank and athletic events held throughout the year.

BeakerBUCKS vs. Flex Dollars

BeakerBUCKS is MSU's all-in-one account and is an option for all enrolled students and current employees. This includes non-traditional students and commuters. There is not a minimum start-up for this account. This account will automatically roll over from semester to semester as long as you are an enrolled student.

It is accepted at multiple locations across campus. These locations include Dining Services, University Bookstore, Library, MSU Document Center, concessions, vending, copiers, printers, and at participating local merchants.

SIX add-value stations are located across campus. These units are for your convenience and are put in locations so that there is never one far away:

ADUC - 1st Floor (Bookstore)

Alumni Tower Food Court

Camden-Carroll Library - 1st Floor

CHER - 3rd Floor

Breckinridge Hall - 3rd Floor

Lappin Hall - 1st Floor

To add value ONLINE to your BeakerBUCKS account with a credit/debit card go to the [EagleCard ONLINE web site](#). Just follow the directions and funds added will be available immediately.

Flex Dollars are a type of currency attached to every meal plan and can be used at all on--campus dining locations. They are loaded on your MSU EagleCard, so there is no need to carry around cash or another card! If you run low, you can add BeakerBUCKS at any time.

Transportation Support

MSU Transport Services

Transport includes the MSU PD shuttle van, the MSU shuttle bus, and the MSU park-n-ride shuttle. If you need to park in overflow from your commute, any of these transport services can pick you up and take you to your class. Safety Support

MSU Police Department

Our highly trained law enforcement officers are on call 24/7. Over 30 emergency phones are strategically located throughout campus, providing direct access to MSUPD.

EagleAlerts – By signing up for Eagle Alerts, you will receive safety and weather alerts via text message. In the events of inclement weather, closings or safety emergencies, you will receive a text message to your mobile phone. To sign up, go to www.moreheadstate.edu/eaglealerts.

LifeSafe App – This app enables two-way communication between students and campus officials, allowing you to share information about everything from suspicious activity and mental health concerns to sexual assault and violence. These messages can be shared safely and anonymously on your smart phone through text, photo or video, allowing official to respond and monitor the activity in real time. LifeSafe also features SafeWalk, a feature that provides you a “virtual escort” to chat with while having your location monitored on a real-time map. Wireless Access

MSU_SECURE

This network provides a safe, secure connection to the internet and to MSU resources. This is the preferred on-campus, secure wireless network available to users with a current MSU account. MSU_SECURE requires an Eagle ID and password to connect, and should be utilized with PCs, laptops, tablets, and smart phones.

MSU_GAME

This is the preferred network to securely connect game consoles, e-readers, streaming devices and smart TVs. Users will be required to complete a one-time setup, enabling their device to access MSU's ResNet. Users will need to know the MAC Address of the device they want to connect.

MSU_PUBLIC

This network provides limited internet access to MSU guests. Unless you have an Eagle ID and password, you will access the internet on campus through MSU_Public.
