

The Retailers Are Also Against Inflation

/ha e near Four chains What is the outlook for the retailer for futuro?

What is the outlook for the resulter for the near future? Four hundred retailers, including both chains and independents, were recently sur-veyed as to this question. And their answers are of wide general interest. Thirt of all, most storekeepers expect an infectase, in their dollar volume. But, at the same time, they foreace slummer profits. The reason for that is a heavy increase in retailing costs. Of the reporting retailers, 64 per cent higher selling costs, and 67 per reast higher payroll costs. 
