#### Future Of The Cinerama Remains Doubtful

New York recently witnessed a new and impressive way of giving depth to motion pictures. Cherama. This new method does not require wearing special glasses in the theatre. To understand the new method of seeing depth on the screen it is necessary to remember that the things that we see every day have death because our eyes are senarated and

depth because our eyes are separated and they see from slightly different angles. When the two different images recorded by the eyes are recorded by the brain, we get a three-

The only way to get a true three-dimen-sional effect on the screen is by imitating what is done by the eyes. Two separate images must be recorded, and the left eyes of the theatre audience must see only the left image and the right eyes of the theatre audi-ence must see only the right image.
