The verbal and physical abuse of children by their parents is difficult for many people to comprehend. The public has a generally unsympathetic attitude about abusive parents and sometimes sees them as evil or less than human, "monsters" deserving the most severe less than the second parents feel that way about themselves parents feel that way about themselves.

There Are Ways To Spot Abuse

Frustrations at the root of child abuse problems include feelings of isolation, marriag and children children of the pressures, the burden of unwanted unplanned children, overwhelming responsibilities and the sense of a loss of freedom.

Such circumstances and pressures don't acutally cause child abuse, said williams. It's a parent's reaction to the situation, a parent's insullity to deal with it, that is the basis for the abusive burden control of the pressure of the press

"All of us learn how to parent from our parents, said Williams." In many, ways we imitate our mothers and, different.

Sometimes parents, especially very young, insecure parents, can't understand a child's behavior and peeds, said Williams. When a baby cries and the immature mother can't calm him, she may see the crying as something the baby is doing on purpose just to upset her. She may physically hurt the baby to "get even".
