

A Bluebird Kind Of Day

It has never been the intent of this weekly ofiput to say that one has to harvest itaterial objects, to have a successful outdoor experience. There is simply somany more important things to conside than landing a braggin size fish, bagging a limit of game or harvesting stull bag of mushrooms.

Take he day a few back when Phillip Cooper and I drove out to Cave Run for a day offishing. At 31, Phil is a died-in-the-wod bass angler from Grayson and he's pietty good at it — most of the time.

Phil has proven his skills behind a

easting rod on a number of occasions by winning a variety of fishing four-naments here in the state and around the country. Fact, is oi! Phil even walked away with top-horiors in the Kentucky State Championship sponsored by the Bass Angler's Sportsman's Society (Bass) in 1978. But even Phil can have a few problems when he runs into a bluebird kind of day.

Serious bass fishermen know what the term 'bluebird day' means. In very simple language, it means a beautiful autumn day when the sky is fantastically blue with little white

powder-puff clouds just floating around up there. It's a day when there's hardly a breeze blowing about and the lake is as clear as a good brand of gin — in' other words a great day to be alive.

Now such a day is kinda frowned upon by'serious fishermen. They prefer a cloudy, over-cast day with a breeze riffling the surface and a little color to the water. These days will, find bass to the water from the surface and a little color to the water. These days will, find bass to the water for bright sunlight the control of the water and I suspect they feel a bit more comfortable when there's a chop on the water to cut down on visability. And if the water is a bit cloudy, I'm sure they are aware that preditors can't put a fix on their position too well. All of these factors add up to better fishing conditions for the angler, on bad weather days.

Water temperature at Cave Run was

days.

Water temperature at Cave Run was excellent for fall bassin if everything else had been in order. A cooling 68 degrees that ran-from the surface down-to about 18 feet, meant that bas, a cold-blooded creature, would feel quite confortable and frisky in that temperature range.

"This is going to be a boom or bust kind of day." Phil predicted as he backed the boat into the lake at the Twin Knobs ramp. He meant, of course, that we would either catch a lot of fish or none at all. Guess how it turned out?

Our intentions were to do some structure fishing. Now in case you're not a bass fisherman, I'll tell you that structure means brush, logs, big rocks, drop-offs, or a sunken object of any kind that is large enough_for a bass to hide around.

around. At times excellent lishing is found in these areas when they're deep enough that surface disturbances (like boating water-sking and fishing) don't spook the fish. There are a number of such ragas in Case Run, but only a few of the more dedicated fishermen know where they're located. Phil knows where most of them, are a Bass fishermen who libe.

othem, are, as Bass fishermen who like to fish this thing called "structure," carry a little crate like box that hold several small floating devices that have line and a sinker attached. These are markers they use to establish underwater structure areas. A depth sounder is necessary to find and mark such pieces.

places.

Our first try for deep water bass was off the end of a long, slopping point where it abruptly comes to an end nearly a hundred yards off shore. At the end it breaks off into 20 feet of water, seemingly, an ideal place for bass. But all not or casting bottom burn-star an hour of casting bottom burn-during the control of the co

nothing for our efforts. We moved.

Our next stop was over some submerged farm ponds, the levies of which
merged farm ponds, the levies of which
make very good bottom, structure for
largemouth bass. Bass for some reason

if you know with you're doing, you can
often take several good size bass from
such agess.

We didn't and we moved again.



I came close to some action when I saw a school of shad running on the surface a few yards away from the boat. Knowing that bass often herd these schools to the top, befrore they, attack. I threw an Ugly Bug towards the school of fish It landed near the tail end and a chunky bass hit the front end of the baitfish. Since you only get one try with this kind of fishing. I blew mine, a typical happening on such a beautiful day.

Our next stop was "a'sure thing," or so said Phil. We passed the boat camp near Clay. Lick ramp and only one tenter was in evidence. His boat pulled upon the beach indicated he was taking a break from the slow fishing. This is a beautiful campground, private and disconnected from roads. There's a great view of the lake and a perfect camp for autumn anglers on Cave Run.







Frosts Can Increase Risks Of Cattle Loss

Early frosts in Kentucky have warned cattlemen of the dangers of prussic acid-poisoning, which has killed some animals in the last two weeks. But cattlemen can reduce the risk of some animals in the last two weeks. But cattlemen can reduce the risk 'ôf potentially dangerous forages with good grazing practices, said Garry Lacefield, Extension forages specialist in the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture. The Surphum variety, including sorphum hybrids, can produce toxic levels of prussic acid, depinding on the weather and plant height. Lacefield said. Pearl millet is apparently

free of prussic acid in toxic amounts, he said.

Several weeds, including johnson-grass and leaves of wild cherry trees can also produce dangerous amounts of prussic acid, one of the most potent toxins in nature, said Lacefield.

"An animal that consumes a lethal dose will die in a few hours," he said, "Often, a dead animal the morning after a frost is the first warning of prussic acid poisoning."

Animals consuming lesser amounts will have labored breathing and irregular pulse, and will froth at the mouth and stagger, he said.

Lacefield recommends several steps to minimize the danger of prussic acid poisoning:

Do not graze sorghum plants for wo weeks after a non-killing frost.

After a killing frost, do not graze until plant material is dry, usually in 48 hours. Check each field to make sure it is completely frozen.

3. Do offt graze at night when frost is

4. Graze sorghum plants only when they are at least 15 inches tall. Do not graze witted plants or plants with tillers. Young tillers, contain higher levels of prussic acid, which is diluted as the plant matures.

Delay grazing fields of crop-residues infested with johnsongrass and other weeds until the fields have been completely frozen and the weeds are dried.

6. Do not allow access to wild cherry leaves whether they are wilted or not. After storms, check pastures for fallen limbs.

Lacefield said farmers usually do not have prussic acid feeding problems from silage or field cured hay, since prussic acid implants is usually diluted during he ensiling and curing processes.

"The Royal Archives of Ebla," the first film about the discovery of 17,000 cuneiform tablets and fragments of Ebla (in Syria), has been released for broadcasting on PBS in late October. (Regional date vary, check local listings.) Halled as one of the most exciting archaeological finds of the century, the Ebla tablets were written 4,500 years ago. Their texts provide a wast source of information on a time and place about which practically nothing was known.

Dr. L.I. Gelb of the Oriental Dr. LJ. Dr. Glovanni Pettinato, original translator of the Ebla texts, transmits his joy at finding a large tablet with the words "en-eb-lak!" which means "king of Ebla." The film uses modern examples to illustrate the contents of the texts, e.g., as the narrator explains that 70 percent of the tablets refer to Ebla's prosperous 'trade

throughout the Near East, donkey carsvans are seen traversing mountain and desert terrain, and views of cities Ebila merchants visited are included. References to Ebla's foremost industry, weaving, are recounted against the sight and sound of weavers at their looms in Aleppo today, just 35 miles from Ebla. Then, as now, the area was famous for its textiles. Magnificent statues from Mari, arch rival of Ebla, and an unusual score using ancient instruments enhance the impact of the film.

The biblical connection' is not omitted. Great interest and controversy was aroused when Pettinato identified biblical names such as Ishmael. Sodom; and Gomorgah in the Ebla texts. However, the Ebla texts predate the biblical period by 500 to 1,000 years.

The Royal Archives of Ebla" was produced and co-directed by Mildred Freed Alberg, who produced the Hallmark Hall of Fame for six years and has won 22 awards for TV and films (three for "Ebla"). Richard Ellison, well-known PBS producer-director-writer, codirected. Fred Warshofsky, producer-writer for TV and films, wrote the script with Alberg, Dr. Norman Yoffee of the University of Arizona was anthropology advisor and consultant. WMUL-TV in Huntington, W. Va. is the cooperating PBS station. Funding was provided by the National Endowment for the Humanities with additional funds provided by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting.
