

Recent statistics show the steady decline in number of rural churches operating in the United States has been ended. Up until 1950, hundreds of rural churches closed each year. Prior to World War II, rural churches in

The reasons for the steady closings of rural churches in the Thirties are fairly obvious. Mechanized farming reduced the number of people in rural communities, the depression had its effect and the trend of the population from rural areas as loc extred its influence. The advent of good roads and cheap automobiles made it possible for many rural citigens to attend churches in towns or cities, and the dust bowl diseaster in the Midwest further reduced the number of churches in the Thirties.

The great hope concerning this new serum is that it will provide immunity against each of the three known types of polio virus. After the 500,000 to 100,000 children have been vaccinated, between February 8th and June 1st, experts will keep records on the children, and the success of the immunication shots, as the polio season develops in 1944. If the vaccine lives up to what some expect it to, results might show that an answer to polio has sults might show that an answer to polio has at last been found.

# Housewives Are Using More And More Appliances

And More Appliances
The electrical industry's publication "Electrical Merchandising" recently compared the number of electrical appliances in use immediately after World War II and those in use at the present time. The comparison makes interesting reading.

The study showed that the number of major appliances had increased in the last seven years at a breathtaking raté. The number of electric refrigerators went from 19,700,000 to 37,750,000 and the number of washing machines rose from 17,217,000 to 32,000. 700,000 to 37,750,000 and the number of wash-ing machines rose from 17,217,000 to 32,200, 00. The number of vacuum cleaners shot up from 13,700,000 to 25,145,000, and electric ironers almost doubled, going from 19,24,000 to 3,910,000. These major appliances only re-flected the same trend which was taking place with many other appliances, such as air-conditioners, mixers, dishwashers, and many other things.

# Stevenson Seems Ready To Make Race In 1956

Adlai Stevenson, de fe at ed Democratic candidate for the Presidency, told an Atlanta group recently he would be willing to shoot a 108, when asked about golf and politics. Explaining this afterwards, he said he meant the Democratic Party went out in '52 and would be satisfied to come back in '56.

After visiting in Georgia, Stevenson moved on the Alabama, and other points, in an attempt to strengthen the National Democratic Partys ties with the South, During his trip to the South, Stevenson was introduced as the next probable President of the United States, and so on. This sentiment is a reflection of the current wave of optimism in Democratic circles, which is probably based on the troubles the Administration has had, thus far, in the farm and labor fields.

Having polled almost 27,000,000 votes, in losing last year, Stevenson not only set a record for a losing candidate, but received more votes than any winning candidate except Roscevelt in one election, and his opponent in the 1952 race.

# Independence Generally Means An Orderly Transfer

Assistant-Secretary of State Henry A.
Byroade, speaking recently in California,
made a very appropriate point in a discussion
of colonialism. Byroade noted that the movement toward self-determination among coloni-

ment toward self-determination among coloni-al peoples is "one of the most powerful forces in Twentieth century affairs."

The Assistant Secretary said the upsurge for national self-determination comes at a time when the leading nations of the world are finding that there is no such thing as self-sufficiency. Therefore, he points out, nation-alism based on the goal that independence will solve the problems of the day is actually a myth.

The United States, in supporting colonial peoples' desire for independence, must be sure that it supports a constructive program which sometimes will mean a gradual transfer of authority from the mother nation to a co This transfer should not be extended over any lengthy period, but should be accomplished as quickly as is practical. At the same time, as quickly as is practical. At the same time, Byroads points out that a sudden end of the authority of the colonial powers can some-times produce more difficulties than dividends in the world-wide fight against Communism.
