Ambulance Service To Be 'Good' Despite CETA Loss, Director Says

Rowan County will maintain a "good" ambulance service despite termination of CETA employee funds Sept. 30, says Morehead-Rowan Ambulance Service Director Pete Hamm.

Hamm said six of nine service employees currently paid by CETA (Comprehensive Employment and Training Act) will be retained using recently acquired monies from Morehead City Council and Rowan County Fiscal Court.

The service already has received \$30,000 from City Council and Fiscal Court budgets and will get another \$15,000 from each at a later date.

"The new funds will help run the service from Oct. 1 to the end of the fiscal year in July," said Hamm.

The service currently employs three persons, including Hamm and a secretary, not paid through CETA.

Hamm said one possible adjustment with the service might be a one-person post-12 p.m. shift with another employee on call "since we have fewer calls at that time."

Hamm told the Morehead-Rowan County Ambulance Board Thursday other alternatives could be a three-person rotating weekend shift and use of part-time and volunteer help.

Dr. Patrick Serey, board representative from the medical community,

said he and other Morehead physicians would "work with the service in any way to assure more efficient patient transfers."

Serey said transfers could be arranged to "fluctuate" depending upon the employee shifts and peak emergency hours.

"There will have to be some adjustments, but we will still maintain a 24 hours a day, 7 day a week ambulance service," said Hamm.

Hamm said 79 August ambulance runs represent the lowest total of monthly runs in "years."

The ambulance runs, which normally reach approximately 110 per month, dwindled to 43 emergency runs and 36 transfers in August.

Serey attributed the decrease to economics.

"People just have less money to run up and down the roads. We've been having far less trauma," said Serey.

According to Hamm, the service "unusually" collected more money in August than the amount owed from the month's runs.

Hamm said the service deposited \$4,901.32 with 4,103.26 owed from runs; a debit of \$798.12.

Hamm attributed the balance to collected payment of past runs.

In other business, the board discussed possible donation of a 1977

ambulance, currently out of service, to the KY 377-Flag Department in Rowan County.

However, the donation would require prior approval from the state Department of Transportation, Fiscal Court and City Council.

Hamm previously said several groups have requested the ambulance, valued between \$500 and \$1,400 by local estimates.

Hamm said Ford Motors refused to grant an extended warranty for the recently purchased \$20,040 ambulance because "it's a fleet vehicle." However, Hamm said the manufacturer promised "good service."

The ambulance service has ordered a \$1,349 radio for the new vehicle through state contract. Hamm said the radio should arrive later this month.

Hamm said the ambulance service base radio is still unrepaired but parts should arrive "soon."

The base station has been silent since lightning struck its antenna system in mid-July.

The inoperative base radio has forced the service to phone city police for relay transmission with units during emergency runs.

"That could create a tremendous problem if the phone were out for some reason," said Serey.

The board also approved minutes of the last meeting and payment of \$2,714 in August bills.

Fiscal Court Seeks Bids On New Bridge

Rowan Fiscal Court met for less than an hour in a recessed meeting Tuesday morning to discuss a new bridge on the Old Sportsman's Club Road on North Fork of Triplett Creek.

The court voted to advertise for bids on the project which will be opened at the next regular meeting on Oct. 1.

It also agreed to open bids for blacktopping of several road projects on the Oct. 1 date.

The court discussed renovation of the unused portion on the second floor of

the courthouse to be rented to the Department of Justice but delayed action on hiring a carpenter for the work until plans can be drawn up.

The magistrates agreed to hold off action on the renovation until they could meet with County Attorney John Cox, who was absent from Tuesday's meeting because he was meeting with the grand jury.

The court will meet again at 9 a.m. Friday for further discussion on the renovation.

In other action the court voted to include a representative from the City of Lakeview Heights on the Morehead-Rowan County Joint Planning Commission.

It also approved paying a \$797 bill to Don McKenzie for repair of a square road truck.

Faul Ousley chaired the meeting in the absence of Judge/executive W.C. Flannery. In addition to Ousley, Magistrates Roy Plank and Calvin Ray Lytle were present.



Stabbing Victim Improves

Two Carter County men have been jailed in lieu of a \$50,000 cash bond in connection with the abduction and stabbing of a teen-age housewife. Meanwhile, the victim continues to improve at St. Claire Medical Center in Morehead.

Paul J. Terry, 21, of Soldier and Gary D. Click, 21, of Lawton, will have charges against them of kidnapping and first-degree assault taken before the Rowan County Grand Jury this week.

Terry and Click allegedly forced Ruth Bond, 17, from her Haldean residence at knife-point about 6 p.m. last Tuesday. The charges allege that the men took the woman in Click's car

to the Click cemetery off Buffalo Ridge. There, she was stabbed twice.

The Rowan County Sheriff's Department and the Kentucky State Police from Post 8 in Morehead were called to the area just after 9 p.m. The assailants had fled, but KSP officers arrested Click and Terry Wednesday at Click's residence in Lawton.

The victim was taken to the St. Claire Medical Center where she was treated and admitted to the intensive-care unit. She was listed as in "critical" condition until last Wednesday, when she was removed from intensive care and listed as "fair." Yesterday, a hospital official said Bond's condition continues to improve.

Holiday Visitors Deluge Campsites

What a U.S. Forest Service official described as a "tremendous exodus" from the Twin Knobs Recreation Area on Monday marked the end of the summer season at Cave Run Lake.

The Labor Day weekend brought an influx of campers who filled all 251 camping units by Saturday at 4 p.m. and forced the opening of newly completed overflow areas.

Other designated camping areas on

the lake, which are Clay Lick boating campground, and North Fork of the Licking River (through Paragon Tunnel) were full. Clear Creek Furnace and Rodburn Hollow recreational areas, and the Leatherwood Road area south of the pioneer weapons hunting area, were also to capacity with campers.

Rodburn Hollow was so heavily used Sunday that parking spilled onto the

road and one family reunion had to be turned away. Members of the party were referred to one of the new group use areas at Twin Knobs.

Sunday was the busiest day of the holiday at Twin Knobs Beach, with 371 swimmers passing through the gates.

Steve Hale, recreation administrator for the Morehead District, said this year's average holiday beach at

Grand Jurors Continue Bradford Case

At presstime Tuesday, a Rowan County grand jury was still hearing testimony in connection with an investigation of alleged financial misconduct in the Morehead State University admissions office.

The center of the investigation is William Bradford, former associate director of admissions at MSU, who resigned in February when news of a state police and FBI investigation was made public.

The day that The Morehead News reported that authorities were investigating allegations that international students were required to post cash deposits to gain admission, Bradford was asked to resign his post by Philip Conn, MSU vice president for university and regional services.

The resignation was requested for what Conn called Bradford's "improper use of his official position" at MSU.

Commonwealth Attorney Truman Dehner said Tuesday morning that at least two more witnesses were to be heard (today). They included a foreign

Mental Health Workshop Set

Morehead State University is hosting a mental health workshop Sept. 13-18 for employees of Kentucky's comprehensive care centers. 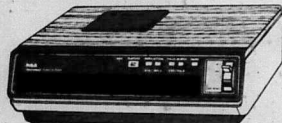

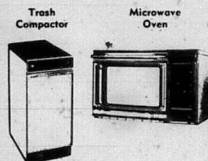

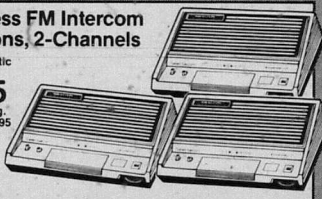

Betty Jean Gregory has been busy preparing for the Harvest Festival. She is painting daisies, butterflies, cartoon characters, and scenic designs on shirts. Betty is also working on a 24" x 36" acrylic landscape painting of Mabry Mill in Virginia.

Autumn is a beautiful time of year to do paintings on location. There are important advantages to doing a painting from nature, rather than from a photograph. A snapshot is two dimensional and you can't feel or sense the object's bulk. There is also the problem of distortion.

When you go out and sit down in the middle of a landscape, you become part of the scene. You can find your own private world, just waiting for your personal comment.

A photo could never provide the sounds, smells, the temperature, and the kind of life that inhabits the countryside. All these things give you an immediate impression of atmosphere that will round out your understanding

of the piece of nature that you are painting. They will influence the character of your work, even though you may not be aware of it.

If circumstances are such that you cannot paint on the spot, a few snapshots and quick sketches will refresh your memory of the scene. Later on, in the studio, you can study these at your leisure.

Communicate your emotions and impressions of the landscape in paint so others can get the same feeling you got when you painted it. You can only do this if you have experienced it yourself at the scene.

A landscape is made of many different elements, such as a stone wall, a barn, a tree trunk, silo, winding road, and so on. A good exercise to try is to paint several elements on separate pieces of paper, to the best of your ability. Then paint them equally well on one canvas, in the landscape just as they appear in nature.

Burley Harvest To Run Late; Flue-Cured Is Selling High

The 1981 burley tobacco crops winding up with an extra-lengthy harvest season which early fall rains have made even longer. Renewed growth has postponed cutting of many late-planted fields, and tobacco leaders are still hopeful that a large output will help relieve burley shortages of the last two years.

Whether the crop will come up to the predicted 700 million pounds is held highly doubtful, although increased

acres and better yields seem to have assured the largest beltwise crop since 1963.

Burley harvest time finds the flue-cured markets in the South holding up well in price, with half to two-thirds of the crop sold. Opening by stages in the different belts, the southern markets began in mid-July. They usually continue into late October or early November.

This year's flue-cured is well ahead of

any recent years in quality. The crop is estimated at about 1,097 billion pounds, with a recent jump of 35 million over earlier production estimates.

The Georgia-Florida belt has been sending 3 to 4 percent of sales to the Stabilization Corporation, compared with 15 percent last year. About the

same loan percentages prevailed on the Border markets, but Eastern North Carolina and the Old and Middle Belts have been reporting heavier loan receipts than last year.

season's \$155. Officials of the Burley Tobacco Growers Cooperative Association, at Lexington, Ky., have been encouraged by reports of recent sales of loan stock flue-cured. Unsold flue-cured at one time amounted to 530 million pounds, but sales this year have amounted to around 200 million pounds.

The Burley crop closed out all its loan stocks in 1980, and later its small 1980-81 market season's consignments, so it will start price-support operations this coming November with no stocks on hand.

Vikings Shutout Bath Co. For The Second Year In A Row, 33-0

It didn't take Rowan County long to establish dominance over Bath County last Friday.

First the Vikings ground out an 87 yard opening game drive, while racking up six first downs. Marvin Adkins capped the drive with his second touchdown of the season.

Just seconds later, after being stunned by a 65 yard Wildcat pass play, the Rowan County defense prevented

Bath County from getting any points after a first and goal from the five yard line.

It was obvious that the players wanted a shutout and that's what they got, 33-0.

The shutout was the second in two years against Bath County and the seventh time in the 15 game series between schools that the Vikings have blanked the Wildcats.

"That's what we try to go for every game. I was really pleased because there were two times early in the game

where we could have let them score very easy," Viking coach Ray Graham said after the game.

The coach was referring to the Wildcats first possession where they had a first and goal on the Rowan five, only to be backed up by a 15 yard penalty. A John Lyons to Dewayne Clemons pass play set up that situation.

Early in the second quarter, after another spectacular Lyons to Clemons pass, this one covering 56 yards, Bath County found themselves on the Rowan 16 yard line with a first down.

After an off-sides penalty against the

Vikings, Johnny Batts rushed to the three yard line for a first down.

Again the Vikings dug in and prevented the visitors from scoring. "Our defense really dug in and showed a lot of class and pride. They didn't want them to score, and that's all there is to it," Graham said.

A New Dimension

The Vikings never could get anything going on their second possession of the game, and found themselves in a second and 40 situation. On third and 30,

John Stamper did a six yard pass on the 35 yard line.

At that point, a new addition to the Rowan County defense entered the contest for his first play of high school football.

This wouldn't be too unusual except for the fact that Vikings new punter is a senior and has lived in Rowan County for several years.

Joe Magrane, a transfer student from University Brockridge, booted a 49 yard punt. The kick was way over the Wildcat receiver's head and put Bath County on their own 18 yard line.

After a first down by Batts, Bill Brock halted the Wildcats with the Vikings second interception of the season.

Brock returned the ball 18 yards.

After a first down by Batts, he played up 12 yards and a first down on the three and took the ball into the end zone on the next play.

Rowan County didn't score again until the third quarter when they posted two touchdowns.

After limiting Bath County to just 158 worth of offense on their first possession of the second half, the Vikings mounded a 76 yard, 12 play, touchdown drive.

Jim Byron faked everyone out with a bootleg for the touchdown, his first of the season on the ground. The junior quarterback was down for three touchdowns in the Vikings first two games.

Ron Porter's extra point gave Rowan County a 21-0 lead.

Mike Adams recovered a Bath fumble moments later and the Vikings had a first and 10 on the Wildcat 32 yard line.

Byron connected with his favorite receiver on the first play from scrimmage for a 29 yard gain and a first down on the Bath Co. two.

Adams got the call on the following play and with everyone keying on Brock and Adams, he didn't have any problem entering the end zone.

Brock finished the scoring for Rowan County with a 35 yard touchdown scamper, just eight seconds into the fourth quarter.

Despite the fact that Rowan County shutout Bath County, the Wildcats did pretty well statistically against the Vikings.

In their first two games, the Vikings had allowed seven first downs. Bath County racked up that many Friday night. Rowan County opponents attempted 38 rushes in the first two contests, and the Wildcats had 34.

The Viking defense had allowed 124 yards passing through the first two games. On just two plays, the Wildcats totaled 119 yards in the air. The opposition had accumulated 154 yards worth of total offense prior to Friday's game. Bath County alone had 129.

Adkins led all players in yards gained with 165 on 26 attempts. After three games the senior has 409 yards on 81 carries, or an average of five yards per attempt.

Brock ended up with 87 yards on the ground against Bath County. He has a total of 178 yards rushing after three contests, or 6.1 yards per try.

Backup quarterback Mike Gribbins was the third leading rusher for Rowan County with 12 yards on three carries.

Byron completed four out of six passes for 56 yards.

Porter connected on three out of four extra point attempts Friday night to bring his season total to nine out of 12 (75%).

Porter attempted the first field goal in memory for Rowan County late in the game.

Explaining why he went for a field goal with a 33-0 lead, Graham said, "How many field goals have we kicked

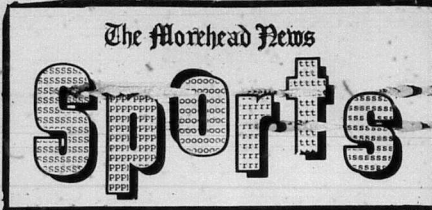

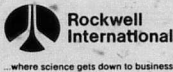

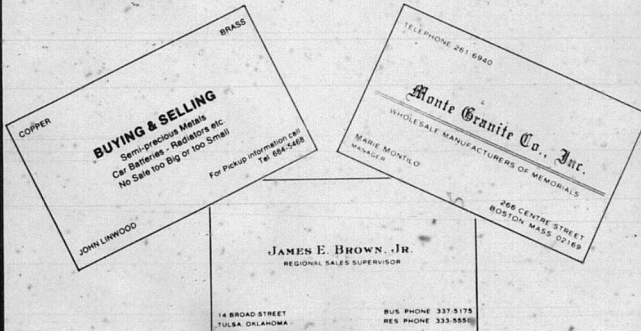

"CPR saves lives," Howard says, "But this slogan is not totally complete. The missing element is 'people.' People using CPR can save lives — many lives."

EKEDC Schedules Staff Conference

"To acquaint superintendents, board members, administrators, state legislators and state department personnel in the identification of educational needs, in setting the course of implementation for the next biennium."

That is the purpose behind the second annual Legislative Conference, sponsored by the Eastern Kentucky Educational Development Corporation (EKEDC) of Ashland and scheduled for Wednesday and Thursday, Sept. 9 and 10 at the Continental Inn, Lexington.

According to EKEDC Director Harry P. Bown, EKEDC has coordinated a staff development program involving 20 school districts for the past two years, and conferences such as this one are an attempt at keeping all sides informed and involved in information-sharing.

"Our express purpose behind this meeting was to have an information-sharing session," Dr. Douglas Cole, Boyd County School superintendent and chairman of the staff development committee, said. "In no way is this intended to be a lobbying meeting."

The meeting will open at 4 p.m. with registration, followed at 4:30 p.m. with a welcome by John Brock, Chairman of the EKEDC Board of Directors and comments on staff development goals and purposes by Dr. Cole.

Following this opening, an educational leadership panel will be presented, highlighted by State Superintendent of Schools Raymond Barber.

Also on the panel will be Ms. Patti Acquisto, president of the Kentucky Parent-Teacher Association; David Keller, executive director of the Kentucky School Board Association; and Bill Nallia, executive director of the Kentucky Association of School Administrators.

Following the panel, Foster "Sid" Meade, Superintendent of Lewis County Schools and a member of the EKEDC Executive Committee, will present a history of EKEDC, to be followed by dinner.

The second session will begin at 7:15 p.m. with Senate President Pro-Tem Senator Joe Prather, speaker of the House Representative Bill Kenton, a

Legislative panel composed of Senator Nelson Allen, chairman of the Senate Education Committee; Representative Jody Richards, chairman of the House Education committee, and Senator Mike Maloney, chairman of Appropriations and Revenue.

Also included in the second session will be a superintendent's panel, comprised of Herald Whitaker, superintendent, Magoffin County Schools; Pike County superintendent James Tom Dolson; Elliott County superintendent Eugene Binton; Ashland superintendent Dr. Stephen Towler; Rowan County superintendent John Brock; and Carter County superintendent Harold Holbrook.

A third session will be held at 8:30 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 10 to wrap-up and summarize the salient points of the legislative conference. In addition to Dr. Cole, who serves as chairman, other members of the EKEDC Executive Committee, are Harold Holbrook, superintendent, Carter County Schools; Rowan County superintendent John Brock; Ashland superintendent Dr. Stephen Towler; and Father Robert Uriage, Diocese of Covington.

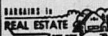

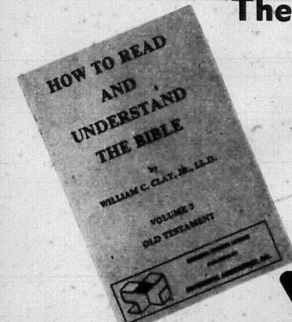

Long Point —

Lake Erie's Hottest Bass Hole

EDITOR'S NOTE: This is the third and last of a three-column series about Lake Erie's fish-filled northern shore. From fishing with the renowned Ontario bassmaster, Joe Stewart, in Rondeau Bay, to a day of trolling for salmon off the Erieau shore, author Soc Clay now makes the 100 mile trip eastward to the fishing area known as Long Point where this year for the first time, Kentuckians, in numbers have discovered the fantastic bass fishing the area offers.

Such was my first introduction to Millionaire's Marsh, which sprawls over a vast area of the huge bay of Long Point.

Earlier, I'd met Bob Izumi who is a fishing companion of the sage of Ontario bass fishermen, Joe Stewart and is on his way to becoming Canada's first professional bass angler.

At 23, Bob is considered near the top of the new breed of bass fishermen who are copying their U.S. counterparts. Already he's on the advisory staff of Zebco, Mercury outboards and Ranger Bass Boats and is considering a full-time position in the public relations dept. of Zebco as American fishing tackle and equipment manufacturers take advantage of the growing interest of competitive bass fishing north of the border.

I picked up Bob and me at Burke's Cabins just as dawn was breaking in the east. The shiny new Ranger bass boat he towed behind his car meant we were going to fish Long Point in style whether we caught anything or not. Two hours later, we were throwing Barney weedless spoons to the base of cattails growing in the shallow water along shore.

It didn't take long to understand why the new surge of Kentuckians who are presently fishing Long Point were drawn there. We had covered no more than the first 10-feet of weedline when Bob felt a terrific jolt and a two pound largemouth jumped clear of the water. Before the first 100 yards were covered, four fish, ranging from the smallest at 13 inches to one that would tip the scales to three pounds or more, were in the boat.

By this time, however, the colorful sunrise I had witnessed the day before bore truth to the time-worn cliché "red in the morning, sailor take warning." From out of the western skies, dark thunderheads were rolling up and lightning could be seen in the distance. The murmur of thunder had little effect on the bass of Long Point, but when lightning commenced cracking down on the bay, they decided to call their feeding spree off for a while.

It was during the lull in fishing and the passing of the storm when we decided to enter the forbidden waters of Millionaire's Marsh. I had already been prewarned by bass fishermen from our area who had also ventured into the marsh that game keepers patrol the area regularly, but we figured to get in and get back out after a little looking around. After all, the place looked like the best fishing spot in the bay. Come to find out it was unquestionably.

Trouble was that fishin' inside the forbidden boundaries was so good during our intended brief sampling, that we made the mistake of staying too long. That's when redneck caught us red-handed and red faced.

Before the apprehension, though, Bob, Tom and I found largemouths highly cooperative and hit weedless silver spoons with white skirts attached. A trailer hook helped a great deal on the short-striking fish.

Northern pike were everywhere and one either hit a spoon or followed it to the boat on about every two feet east. They weren't large, going from 15 to 24 inches, mostly.

The fish I found most interesting back in the shallow marsh were rock bass. Big, running past a pound and hitting lures a muskie would look at twice. I predict the angler with ultra-light spinning tackle using small, single-hooked spinners in #0 to #1 size could catch a boatload of the scrappy little panfish.

Local Canadians discovered the largemouth of Long Point about 10 years back, but it wasn't until Bob introduced Ken and Boyd Ratliff, of South Shore, to the fishing area about four years ago that the Kentucky bass angling set made an invasion on the productive waters. Ken is now deceased, but the flow of anglers from this area continues to increase each year, mainly because Fred Martin, owner of Angler's Paradise in Greenup, has been responsible for promoting the Long Point fishing.

Actually, there are literally miles on top of miles of legal fishing waters at Long Point. Turkey Point and the reedy shoreline around the public ramps at Port Rowan, provide very good bass habitat.

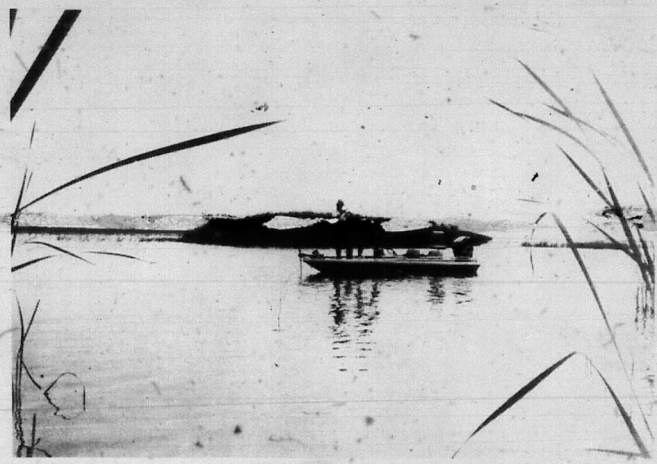

Actually, there are literally miles on top of miles of legal fishing waters at Long Point. Turkey Point and the reedy shoreline around the public ramps at Port Rowan, provide very good bass habitat.

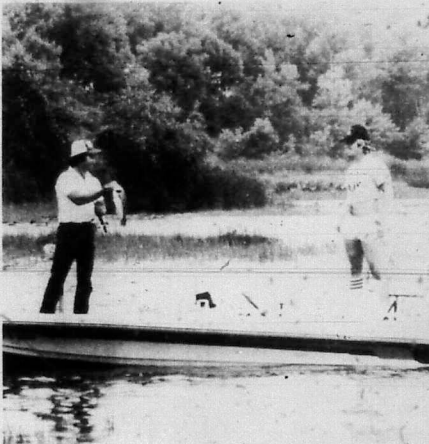

BASS WATER — Thousands of acres of weeds and water make a perfect situation for the growing of herds of largemouth bass. Much of Long Point bass fishing water is under three feet in depth.

Perhaps the most undesirable aspect of a Long Point fishing trip is the nearly total lack of commercial accommodations. The small village of Port Rowan has one rooming house and a small hotel and there's another small motel near the entrance of Long Point Provincial Park. Most anglers arriving
