Flanery Co-Sponsors Lien Law Bill

Senator Kelly Asks Full Citizenship For 13 Year Olds

Representative John Flanery, Morgantown, is among the sponsors of legislation to amend the law in the General Assembly at Frankfort to repeal the lien on property of old-age assistance recipients.

Mr. Flanery is also co-sponsor of a measure that provides for establishment of a nursery for propagation of high-quality chestnut tree seedlings. An emergency appropriation of \$30,000 for the remainder of the fiscal year is proposed in the measure.

Senator Ed Kelly, filling county, is co-sponsor of a bill concerning full rights of citizenship on 18 year olds, except they would not be permitted to purchase alcoholic beverages.

Eighteen year olds in Kentucky were given the right to vote by passage in November of a Constitutional Amendment. Kentucky became the second state in the nation to confer voting rights on 18 year olds.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT HAS MANY FUNCTIONS

2,753 Immunized In Rowan County By Health Department In Past 12 Months

The Rowan County Health Department released its annual statistics report today showing that 2,753 children in the county were immunized in the past year.

Twenty-one Communicable Disease cases were admitted to the department for advisory service.

Fifty visits were made to the above mentioned contacts by the County Health Nurse for purpose of checking to see that the patients were following the doctor's instructions.

Twenty of 2,713 immunizations were done in Rowan County for the prevention of diseases such as Diphtheria, Whooping Cough, Lockjaw and Polio.

A Eleven Venereal Disease were treated by the local Department of Health and 13 cases were checked.

Seventeen crippled children were admitted to advisory service and 20 visits were made to advise the patients as to the importance of following the doctor's instructions.

Forty-four vision tests were administered by the department during 1935.

Two hundred and six visits were made to school for the purpose of immunization, health, health and sanitation talks, and demonstrations being planned.

Sixty Health and Sanitation talks were given to about one hundred and thirty-five school children.

Seven visits and conferences were made to schools to assist and arrange for nutrition classes and demonstrations being planned.

Eight classes in outdoor work were conducted in 239 school children, and three talks were made to PTAs in connection with nutrition programs in their schools.

Ninety-nine physical examinations were done for school employees.

The Department of Health has the assistance of an intern medical student, working under direction of local physicians, in the examinations for pre-school children in Rowan County.

Two hundred and sixty-nine raw milk samples, for pasteurization, were collected and submitted for bacteriological examination.

Seventy-seven conferences were held with private citizens concerning home sanitation problems.

Seventeen nuisance complaints were received at the Department of Health.

Thirty-eight inspections were made of private sewage disposal facilities.

Eighteen inspections were made of schools for purpose of checking water supply, sewage disposal, and general school cleanliness.

Sixty-five inspections were made of public buildings.

Great Books Set Given To Library

A collection of 44 Great Books of the Western World is being given to the Morehead College Library. It was announced today by head librarian, Lorne Chapman.

The books, which included 44 titles by 23 authors, are being distributed by a collection committee of the American Library Association under a grant from the Old Dominion Foundation. The collection was selected by the national board to include a representative list including a general index called the Syntopicon, as produced by the Encyclopedia Britannica in collaboration with the University of Chicago. The Old Dominion Foundation, donor of the set now being distributed, was established in 1911 by Paul Mellon for support of religious, charitable, scientific, literary and educational purposes.

Each of six volumes is described as "spanning Western thought from Homer and Aristotle to the 20th century. Essential preparation of the set occupied 109 scholars, three or four years on the Syntopicon, for eight years and cost two million dollars."

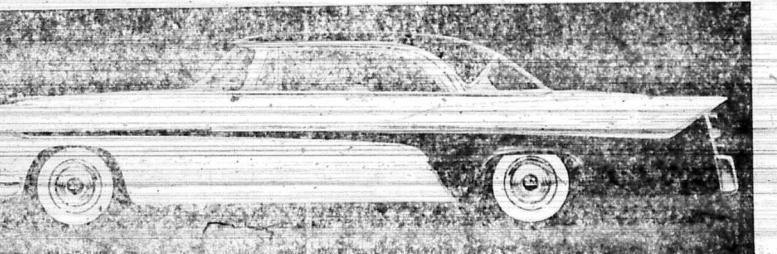

The Small Farmer Deserves A Fair Consideration

Whatever else is included in farm relief legislation which passes Congress this session, and we assume it will, the small farmer should be given special consideration on several counts.

In the first place, acreage reduction sometimes threatens the very living of the small farmer, who has only a few acres of cotton, wheat, tobacco or some other crop. He is sometimes largely dependent upon the money he earns from these few acres to sustain his family.

If he is reduced by ten or fifteen per cent, and if his reduced acreage does not bring him sufficient income to pay the taxes and cost of living, then he is faced with extinction. To avoid this, Congress is being asked by the Administration and by members of both parties to pay the farmer 50 cents more for each acre of cotton.

The Administration is also asking that the farmer be paid for land he puts under certain soil conservation practices.

The major failure in the farm program in the United States for the last few years has been that the same old formula has been applied to both big and small farmers. In other words, the big farmer who enjoyed ninety per cent parity price supports for so

many years often got checks from the Government amounting to as much as \$100,000. He is not to be denied these checks after he has \$100,000 or \$150,000 or even more.

To correct this situation, many proposals have been advanced. Two of them, both of which we support, are a sliding support scale, which means that high price supports will be dropped for high price support operations, and not providing any support for big farmers. The other proposal will decline for the first forty or hundred acres to a lower figure, and then drop, and so on. Another solution proposed is that the amount of money provided by the Federal Government will be reduced for each acre of cotton. Either of these proposals will help correct a bad situation.

The policy of the farm program of this Government should be to safeguard the livelihood of the small farmer, while at the same time not providing any support for big farmers to take the money of the taxpayers and make tens of thousands of dollars while the growing crops that do not have and which are already in surplus. This basic correction in the No. 1 need in our farm legislation, behind only the need for economic relief of farmers who are now threatened with extinction.

The Moon Remains Lee, Jackson Born In January Strange Object

Although the moon is a common topic among fishermen, lovers and many others, little is actually known about this great planet, and even less about its appearance on the earth. The reader might, therefore, be interested in a few facts of the moon, and its performance in 1956.

There will be twelve full moons in the United States this year. Contrary to what most people believe, the moon is not full just once a month, but on rare occasions, there are two full moons in one month. This happened in October, of last year, when, on October 1st and 31st, there were full moons. This year, however, that rarity will not occur.

The first full moon of the year takes place on January 27th. The last full moon of the year will occur on December 17th, and, therefore, it will be seen that the period between full moons is slightly less than a month.

As an example of the spacing between full moons, the first on January 27th is followed by the 2nd on February 25th, and the 3rd on March 27th (February has 29 days this year), and by the fourth on April 24th.

The full moon in May comes on the 24th, drops back to the 23rd in June and back to the 22nd in July, and the 11th in August. In September and October, it occurs on the 19th and in November it drops back to the 18th and in December falls on the 17th.

Thus, in all the year, the full moon arrives ten days earlier at the last of the year than it did at the first. This means that it will be 3956 before another moon will be full which there are two full moons. As a further guide, one can remember that the time between a new moon and its first quarter, and between a quarter and a full moon, is slightly over seven days. Thus the time between the appearance of a new moon and its first quarter is about twenty-two days.

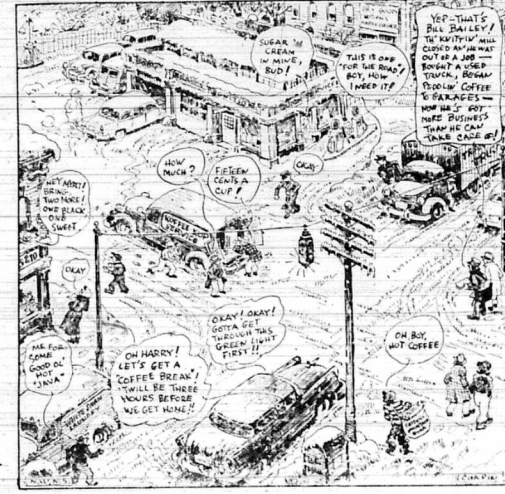

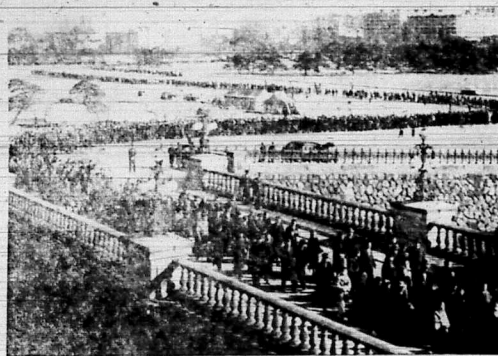

Hybrid Lambs Mean More Meat And Also Wool

Hybrid lambs promise more meat and wool, say U. S. Department of Agriculture scientists at the Belleville, Mo. research center.

Researchers found three types of crosses of different parentage, the Belleville hybrids have outdone their parent stock in production and in reduced mortality.

These lambs are crosses of purebred Hampshires, Shropshires, Southdowns and Merinos of strains that have been improved at Belleville through several years of selective mating and line breeding. The department points out, however, that commercial growers can produce their own grade-flocks with high-quality parents of another.

Results of the Belleville tests showing material improvement in the production and mortality rate of the hybrids compared with purebred lambs from the same foundation strains, cover two a year crossbred observed over a seven-year period and three-way crosses tested for four years. 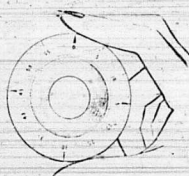

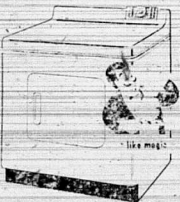
