



Use Airplanes To Nab Speeders

A new method of catching speeding mot-orists has been utilized in Oklahoma. There the Oklahoma Bishway Patrol has procured two airplanes and uses them to check the speed of motorists on highways below.

speed of motorist on highways mouse. This may sound difficult, but it is setually simple. The patroinan in the aircraft uses a stop-watch and has a measured distance marked on the highway below. When a car reached the starting point, he starts his stop-watch and when the car reaches the end of the run, as marked by some landmark below. he stops his stop-watch and sees how long it has taken the car to travel that measured dis-

tance. It usually happens that motorists are sur-prised when they are stopped by a patrolman shead and accused of traveling eighty or intery miles an hour. The motorist feels con-fident he has not been observed, but when he looks up he notes an airplane circling above and is surprised to find the aircraft in communication with the patrolman who stop-ped him, and he realizes he is hooked.

ped him, and he realizes he is nooked. The airplane-detection system has been used for other purposes in Oklahoma. It has snared three bank robbers, three persons wanted on assult charges, ten kidnapers and more than 108 prisoners and car thieves.

It seems certain Oklahoma's system will adopted by more states as time goes by.
