An outdoors writer suggests that hunters turn their attention to crows, now that the traditional fall and winter hunting season is looking. Since crows are supposed to be harmful birds, it is an interesting suggestion.

One thing the crow hunter must do, however, is to be certain that he kills the lookout crow. If the lookout is sallowed to escape, although being abot at, he will usually warn other crows in the area to five elsewhere.

A crow-caller is recommended for those who go in for crow insuling in carnest. Camoufage is also needed, and when the lookout crow is first sighted, one is supposed to increase the frequency of his calls.

India Still The **Key Country**

In the Far East, where Nationalist China is moving ahead with its agricultural production, despite our reluctance and veget in admitting it, the key country is India. China, of course, is the most populous country in the Far East, with a 600,000 population.

Next comes India, with about half as many people, and which is a country the democra-cies must maintain as a friendly neutral or triendly ally. Should India ever join the Rus-sian-Chinese bloc, it would probably mean that all of the Far East would eventually be lost

to Communism.

the fact that China has doubled its agriculiral production through a ruthless system intural production through a ruthless system in-volving communes and twenty-four-hour work on the farm. Prime Minister Nehru has had great plans for developing India's agricultural production, but it is reported agricultural pro-duction in India has increased five percent in

The Indian people cannot but notice the progress of China, and the gains being made by their nuge neighbor to the northeast. It is essential that the democracies move into the vacuum, and offer India a plan which will allow her to make somewhat comparable pro-

A recent estimate is that the Soviet Union A recent estimate is that the Soviet Union has already put as much as three billion dollars into Communist China, in addition to financially sponsoring more than two hundred small industrial projects. In addition, a new trade program between China and Russia has just been announced, and it is said to involve as much as a billion dollars.

Kennedy, a Massachusetts Democrat, and Senator John Sherman Cooper, a Kentucky Republican, which would author-ize the Administration to "explore with other lending nations and India the possibility of sending to India a high-level free world mis-

The idea behind this effort would be to find way to help India meet her requirements in sood. It is well known that the storing of huge mantities of wheat, corn, cotton and other soods in the United States is costing the United States about a billion dollars annually. In other words, these surpluses are being put to no good use. We certainly should take advantage of these heap surpluses to win India as a solid ally, although the answer is not as simple as merely providing for grants, or, easy loans, involving these surpluses. It has been suggested that we, together with Japan, Canada, west Germany and maybe Great Britain, offer a combined economic program to enable India to keep pace with its huge communist neighbor. The United States, as the leader of the democracies and the richest country in the world, would probably have to play a major role in

ocracies and the richest country in the world, would probably have to play a major role in this effort. As we see it, no time should be lost by Congress in passing the Kennedy-Cooper bill, and no time should be lost by the Administration in undertaking a grand effort to maintain, at the minimum, the friendly neutrality of lodia, and, at the maximum, to align her with the democracies and the free enterprise system, which is so threatend to-day in international communism.


