Call to Order

USDA inspection

SH reported the USDA inspection went well. Inspector recommended we have a community representative that can attend the committee meetings on a regular basis. There will be new regulations about birds. PP requested clarification of whether birds used for food will be included or excluded in the regulations. SH will investigate and provide a response at the next meeting.

Discussion

SH explained that contingency plans will be required at all current USDA licensed facilities. It provides for the care of the animals in the event of an emergency or disaster. This looks at scenarios that could happen in our geographical area (ie. floods, tornado, etc.) and how they would be handled.

The USDA supplies a form (APHIS 7093) that when completed meets the requirement. This plan must be in place by July 5, 2022. All employees must be trained within thirty days of the implementation. New employees must be trained within thirty days from their hire date. Someone will need to be designated as the trainee and will be responsible for maintaining the documentation.
