- 2 The General Education Council, a University Standing Committee, will be responsible for the
- 3 management of the General Education Program at Morehead State University, including, but not
- 4 limited to, assessment procedures and course management.
- 5 **Revision Date:** Standing committee, initiated April 2009. Revised June 2010; September 2011;
- 6 November 2011; November 2017; May 2020; September 2024
- 7 **Purpose:** To direct and maintain the General Education Program at Morehead State University.
- 8 The Council will make recommendations to the Faculty Senate and Provost concerning the goals,
- 9 structure, and assessment of General Education at Morehead State University. Council
- recommendations must be approved by a majority vote of the Faculty Senate to become policy.

- 25 Sciences (Ethics and Civic Engagement) in the general education curriculum
- Six faculty members made up of one representative each for 1) Natural Sciences; 2) Arts
 and Humanities; 3) Social and Behavioral Sciences; 4) Communication; 5) English; 6) Math
- Two additional faculty members: one from Smith College of Business and one from
 Volgenau College of Education
 - Whenever possible, each voting member should regularly teach General Education courses
- Each representative should teach general education courses on a regular basis.
- Each college should be represented <u>if possible</u> but no more than two <u>three</u> from each college may serve.
- One faculty member each from the three disciplines in <u>Cc</u>ore General Education: 1)
 Communications, 2) English, and 3) Math, First Year Seminar coordinator (ex officio)

36 MEMBERSHIP RULES

Faculty representatives must be tenured or tenure-track faculty. They will serve offset three-year terms.

- The President-elect Chair of Academic Issues, of the Faculty Senate will serve a one-year term and be responsible for communications between the General Education Council and the Faculty Senate. If the President-elect Chair of Academic Issues is already serving on the General Education Council or is unable to serve, the President of the Faculty Senate will may appoint a different faculty senator from the Senate's Executive Council.
- Distribution area membership restrictions do not apply to the First Year Seminar Coordinator and the President-elect Academic Issues Chair of the Faculty Senate.
- Department chairs or equivalents must be from different colleges and will serve threeyear terms.
- Any Council member may invite non-voting visitors to the Council to provide advice and input as deemed appropriate.
- One-third of the committee will cycle off each year.
- 51 Membership Selection Process: All faculty members on this council, except the position of
- 52 President-elect of the Faculty Senate, will be approved by majority vote of the Faculty Senate. In
- 53 the event the Senate rejects a candidate, the President-elect of the Senate may nominate another
- 54 candidate for the position.

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- Department chairs or their equivalents will be selected by the University's Chairs Council.
- The approval process for all members will be completed in the Spring semester for appointment
- 57 to the Council in the following Fall semester.
- 58 Support Staff: The Director of Assessment will facilitate the collection, maintenance, and
- analysis of assessment collected by the General Education Council.

Duties and Responsibilities

- 61 The Council shall:
 - Provide recommendations for the direction and supervision of assessment procedures for the General Education Program, as conducted by the Director of Assessment;
 - Provide recommendations for the structure and improvement of the General Education Program;
 - Evaluate and approve General Education courses in conjunction with the Undergraduate Curriculum Committee.
 - From among the current General Education Council faculty membership, the committee shall choose faculty representation for the First Year Seminar ad hoc committee. The First Year Seminar (FYS) Subcommittee, a subcommittee of the General Education Council, will be responsible for oversight of the First Year Seminar general education course including, but not limited to, assessment and curriculum review/development.
- 73 Officers: The General Education Council will be co-chaired by the Associate Provost for
- 74 Undergraduate Education & Student Success and a highly qualified faculty member from the
- 75 faculty ranks on the committee (excluding department chairs) to be selected by the voting
- 76 members of the Council. The faculty co-chair will not vote on matters before the Council except
- 77 to break ties. A replacement member will be selected from whichever distribution or core area
- the faculty co-chair was originally selected to represent to ensure consistent representation across the general education curriculum.
- 80 The administrative co-chair and the faculty co-chair shall meet at the beginning of fall semester
- 81 to outline the long-term Council agenda for the year, including the meeting schedule, and at the

- 82 beginning of spring semester to adjust Council priorities for the reminder of the academic year
- 83 (as needed). Further, the co-chairs shall meet frequently throughout the academic year to
- establish the agenda of each meeting, to be distributed to Council members no later than one
- week prior to the meeting date. If the administrative co-chair and the faculty co-chair disagree
- about issues to be presented to the Council and their degree of importance on an agenda (in terms
- 87 of priority and urgency), then all issues in dispute shall be presented to the Council members and
- 88 become subject to Council ranking and approval.
- 89 Frequency of Meetings: The full Council is required to meet a minimum of once per academic
- 90 year.

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- 91 Minutes and Proposals: To be filed with the Faculty Senate, the Office of the Associate Provost
- 92 for Undergraduate Education & Student Success, and the Library.
- 93 Support Services: Clerical support will be supplied by the Office of the Associate Provost for
- 94 Undergraduate Education & Student Success.

- 97 The procedure for resignation from a University Standing Committee is written notification to
- 98 the University Standing Committee chairperson, Faculty Senate secretary, and the faculty
- 99 member's Department Chair. In the absence of a University Standing Committee Chairperson,
