

April 11, 1950

The Board of Regents of Morehead State College met in the office of President W. J. Baird at the College on April 11, 1950.

Present were: Supt. B. B. Hodgkin  
 Mr. E. R. Price  
 Mr. M. K. Eblen  
 Mr. W. W. Ball  
 Mr. J. T. Norris

Absent: None

The meeting was called to order by Superintendent B. B. Hodgkin chairman, and opened with prayer by President Baird. The minutes of the meeting of January 11, 1950 were read and approved.

President Baird presented the list of the staff of the Morehead College recommended for reappointment for the school year 1950-51, together with the respective salary recommended for each.

It was moved by Mr. Ball, seconded by Mr. Eblen that this list with salaries as recommended, be approved. On roll call, the vote was Mr. Ball, aye, Mr. Price, aye, Mr. Eblen, aye, Mr. Norris, aye.

The list is hereto appended and made a part of these minutes.

President Baird presented a list of resignations of faculty members to be effective at the end of the current school year, with the recommendation that they be accepted. On Motion of Mr. Eblen, seconded by Mr. Norris and carried unanimously, the recommendation was approved. The list is appended hereto and made a part of these minutes.

President Baird recommended the appointment of John H. Long as associate professor of English for the 1950-51 term at a salary of \$4,000. per annum. Mr. Price moved that the recommendation be approved and Mr. Eblen seconded the motion. On roll call the vote was Mr. Ball, aye, Mr. Price, aye, Mr. Eblen, aye, Mr. Hodgkin, aye, Mr. Norris, aye.

President Baird recommended the appointment of Miss Clarica Williams as assistant librarian at an annual salary of \$2,800. to teach during the summer term and be a member of the permanent staff. It was moved by Mr. Price and seconded by Mr. Ball, that the recommendation be approved. The vote on roll call was Mr. Ball, aye, Mr. Price, aye, Mr. Eblen, aye, Mr. Hodgkin, aye, and Mr. Norris, aye.

President Baird recommended that Miss Florence May be employed for 5½ weeks at \$350. and Mr. Gilbert Roberts for 8 weeks at \$600. for instructors in the summer session. Mr. Ball moved that the recommendation be approved. Mr. Norris seconded the motion. The vote on roll call was Mr. Ball, aye, Mr. Price, aye, Mr. Eblen, aye, Mr. Hodgkin, aye and Mr. Norris, aye.

The budget for the fiscal year 1950-51 was presented and discussed fully by the board. It was moved by Mr. Price, and seconded by Mr. Ball that the budget be approved as submitted. The roll call vote was, Mr. Ball, aye, Mr. Price, aye, Mr. Eblen, aye, Mr. Hodgkin, aye, Mr. Norris, aye.

Minutes of April 11, 1950, continued.

The budget adopted is hereto attached and made a part of these minutes.



Dear Dr. Baird:

The estimated revenue for the college for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1950 and ending June 30, 1951 is \$706,850.00. We have appropriated \$690,801.28 to the various departments. The reserve is \$16,048.72, or approximately two percent.

The estimated current income for the college which is made up of the State appropriation and tuition fees was \$452,570.00 in the present fiscal year of 1949-50, compared to \$457,000.00 for the next fiscal 1950-51. We estimate that our loss in revenue from tuition fees in the first year of the biennium will be offset by the additional appropriation of the Legislature in the amount of \$45,000.00. The increase in the budget is due to auxiliary enterprises feeding and housing more students.

All of our auxiliary enterprises are not only self supporting but are rendering excellent service to the students and faculty and contributing to the general education program.
